# *Track Preservation Report*

Within the National Parks & Wildlife Service, the focus is turning away from horse riding, which is both good and bad.

It is a good thing that the presence of horse riders in National Parks is becoming "Business as Usual". But it is bad in that the pace of change is likely to slow down. Although we are fighting fewer battles over trail closures, we are not getting the improvements in access we were originally promised.

The Horse Riding Consultative Group, made up of representatives of a variety of horse riding organisations, has been allowed to lapse without any official explanation, leaving us without a formal link with senior management. This makes it even more important that horse riders are represented on local Advisory Committees. I have just been reappointed to the Blue Mountains Advisory Committee for a further three-year term, but 2019 will probably be my last year on the state-wide Advisory Council.

NPWS is nearing the end of a long and painful organisational restructure, which has had a flow-on effect to horse riding initiatives. Staff do not have the time, money or inclination to focus on anything other than getting their jobs done.

We are seeing general overall improvements in attitudes towards horse riding, but we are still dealing with local problems with specific staff and specific parks. Administrative boundaries have changed, which has particularly affected Shahzada, with all the Shahzada trails now managed from Blue Mountains instead of the Central Coast.

Unfortunately the ranger responsible for those parks has always demonstrated a negative attitude towards horse riders, and she is not making things easy at the moment. However, I'm still hopeful that this will prove to be just "teething problems" and that things will settle back to normal.

These days we seldom hear claims that "horses spread weeds" – that myth has just about been put to bed. Instead, NPWS is mainly concerned about two things: risk management, and the cost of trail maintenance.

Concerns about damage to trails, not specifically by horse riders, but by all users, will see more frequent temporary trail closures after heavy rain or fires. The NPWS website has an Alerts page, with closures listed for every park, so it's worth checking whether your trails are open before wasting a float trip to a locked gate. Even if there is no gate, if there is a "park closed" sign, you can be fined for ignoring it. You also might not know that ALL National Parks are automatically closed on Total Fire Ban days. Though most of us would not want to be riding in that kind of weather anyway.

Nervousness about risks to users is making park managers excessively worried about trail conditions. I keep explaining that more serious riding accidents happen on flat dirt roads than on rough steep trails (and I can speak from personal experience!) but it's hard to convince them.

As always, the best way to keep trails open in your area is to form a good relationship with NPWS staff. We can become their unofficial eyes and ears on the trails, letting them know about issues such as fallen trees or dumped rubbish, but also wildlife or feral animal sightings or illegal activities like motorbikes on management trails.

They typically know nothing about horse riding, so they can't be expected to anticipate the effect of their actions on horse riders. It's up to us to create a line of communication which makes it easy for them to find out. We need them to contact us BEFORE they take any actions that impact horse riders, whether it is putting up gates to keep out vehicles (which can effectively lock us out too), or closing trails for maintenance, or erecting fencing which prevents us from letting our horses have a drink.

There have not been many new Plans of Management released for public comment in 2018, but submissions from horse riders continue to be one of the most important ways you can help to keep trails open. The conservation groups are well organised and well funded, and their position continues to be that horses should be banned from National Parks. While their opinion no longer carries the weight that it once did, it is still important that we speak up in support of horse riding no matter whether a Plan of Management is proposing to allow it or to prohibit it.

The one big victory for the year was the acceptance by the Government of the results of the Wilderness Trial, which proved that low levels of horse riding do not have a negative impact even on very "sensitive" environments. As a result, Plan of Management amendments are now being finalised to confirm that horse riding will continue to be allowed on the specific routes used in the trial. While this is a long way from letting horse riders back into all their traditional riding areas, it is a significant step in the right direction.

Nominations must be made by two current Senior Members (quote membership numbers). The nominee must be a current Senior Member and must give his/her written consent. Nominations for election to the NSWERA Committee will be accepted by the Secretary up to seven (7) days before the date of the AGM (NSWERA Constitution rule 17.1).

If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies, the people nominated as per rule 17(1) will be deemed elected and further nominations will be received from the floor at the Annual General Meeting (NSWERA Constitution rule 17.2). If insufficient further nominations are received, any remaining vacant positions will be deemed casual vacancies (rule 17(3)). The committee will attempt to fill any casual vacancies in accordance with rule 16(4)).

If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies, the people nominated will be deemed elected (rule 17.4).

If the number of nominations received prior to the meeting exceeds the number of vacancies, a ballot will be held at the meeting and the five people with the most number of votes will fill the vacancies (rules 17(5) and 17(6)).

If further nominations are required to be taken at the meeting, and those nominations exceed the number required to fill the remaining vacancies, a ballot will be held. In this case, the number of people required to fill the remaining vacancies with the most number of votes will be deemed elected (rules 17(5) and 17(6)).

# SMC Committee Notices

## IMPORTANT NOTICE TO NOVICE ENDURANCE RIDERS.

Recently there has been a lot of discussion regarding the progression from Novice status to open Endurance rider i.e. a rider who may exceed novice time at an Endurance event.

Therefore, I would like to commend to you rules 29.3 and 29.4.

*To progress from Novice status to Endurance rider status, the rider shall:*

- a) *Successfully complete two Intermediate rides as required under clause 29.1 (c) and*
- b) *Successfully complete three endurance rides in any riding division.*

**29.4** *When a rider has satisfied Clause 29.3 they may apply to their respective DA ( Divisional Association, in the case of NSW riders, NSWERA), to have their rider status upgraded from Novice to Endurance status.*

This means, to contact Jacky Barlow, NSWERA's Secretariat on 4938 0081 or email [secretariat@nswera.asn.au](mailto:secretariat@nswera.asn.au) and Jacky will be happy to help you.

Please note that until you physically update your status you will have to ride at Novice time or risk disqualification if you exceed posted novice time.

Currently your Committee is trying to get this rule changed so that AERAspace will automatically upgrade a rider's status, however, until then the onus is on you the rider.

Please do not confuse the process of getting a yellow logbook for your horse. You may have the situation of your horse being an open horse i.e. can win a ride in faster than novice speed time but the rider may still be a novice rider i.e. unable to exceed 14kms per hour.

Horse and rider both need to apply for their upgrade from Novice to Endurance status. Each is a totally separate process.

# 2019 Tom Quilty Gold Cup

## Stirling's Crossing Equestrian Complex

Imbil, Queensland.

11—14 July 2019

The TQ19 event will be hosted at Australia's only purpose-built ride base in the picturesque Mary River Valley on the weekend 11 – 14 July 2019. For three years the Stirling's Crossing Endurance Club has conducted rides from the venue, both AERA affiliated and FEI rated.

The TQ19 Committee have been working towards this event since October 2017. Members of Stirling's Crossing Endurance Club have been building experience, skills and momentum during 2018 with rides in May, July and August. The Club hosted the Stirling's Classic in May, the Queensland State Championships over the weekend of 13 – 15 July, the same calendar spot scheduled for TQ19, and the Stirling's Multi Event in August including FEI rides.

Events during 2018 received a total of 480 nominations over the three events, including 29 nominations for FEI events and 99 nominations for 160 km events.

Kim Moir, President of Stirling's Crossing Endurance Club, said:

*"Each event has been a learning curve for us and has provided the opportunity to trial different configurations for the venue. We have a lot of wisdom and experience in our club that makes the prospect of running TQ19 a little bit easier!"*

*"Moving on to 2019, we will host the Stirling's Classic 120 in May, TQ19 in July and the Equestrian Australia National Championships in October. We may even try to squeeze in a training ride early in the year and perhaps offer a 160 km ride in May to support those who still need to qualify for a Tom Quilty Gold Cup event."*

The aim of the TQ19 Committee is to provide an event that is inclusive and safe for members, officials and horses. The variety of tracks available in the Imbil Forest allows for a technical course that is do-able to support a good completion rate. This is a course that needs to be ridden with attention to horse fitness but can also be competitive. The Biosecurity Plan that is being developed will support maximum participation.

Staying on after the TQ19 would be worthwhile as the Sunshine Coast region is one of Australia's top tourist destinations. Imbil provides a great base to explore the beautiful Mary Valley region as well as the spectacular national parks, the foodie culture in Noosa and Mooloolaba beach which was voted the sixth most popular beach in Australia on TripAdvisor together with the spectacular hinterland areas. There is easy access to many tourist attractions including the world-famous Australia Zoo, and you can get up-close to the many Humpback whales that are near to the coast at this time of the year.

## Vale Ron Rozzoli

Joe and I have been blessed to have Ron and Margaret Rozzoli as our neighbours for many years and a lovelier couple you could not meet.

Sadly, Ron passed away at his home surrounded by his family on Tuesday, 16th October, 2018 at the age of 82 after a long illness.

Many young endurance folk may not be familiar with Ron but before the Tom Quilty 160km Endurance Ride travelled to a different state each year, Ron along with his wife Margaret and Ron's brother Kevin were the time keepers for the Tom Quilty Ride when it was held annually at Colo, NSW from 1966 until 1980.

Ron and Margaret owned the Park Corner Gift Store in Richmond and Ron being a watchmaker was able to supply the clocks for the timekeeping and cover one of the most important roles at a Quilty!

At the 2015 Tom Quilty which was held in the Hawkesbury, Ron was inducted into the Tom Quilty Hall of Fame. He, along with R.M. Williams and Kevin Rozzoli were among the first to be inducted into the Tom Quilty Hall of Fame which can be found in the Stockman's Hall of Fame at Longreach, Queensland. A wonderful recognition to Ron's time and effort he gave so this ride could grow to where it is today.

A celebration of Ron's life was held at the Richmond School of Arts, Richmond on 1<sup>st</sup> November, 2018 in The Ron Rozzoli Auditorium. Ron was The School of Arts secretary for 43 years and the Auditorium was named the Ron Rozzoli Auditorium to acknowledge the huge contribution Ron had made to the Richmond Players group which is the second longest continuously performing amateur theatre group in New South Wales.

In 2005 his community work was recognised by Hawkesbury City Council and in the Deerubbin Centre a community room was named the Rozzoli Room.

Ron was also heavily involved with the Comleroy-Kurrajong Historical Society. He had an incredible memory for names and dates and could recount fascinating stories about the Hawkesbury telling of its history and the changes that have taken place and I recall how he told of driving cattle along the Putty Road when it was just a dirt track!

Throughout his life Ron epitomised good citizenship in business, family life and community work and unselfishly gave of his time and effort to help others and at all times conducting himself with great honesty and integrity. In this he was an example to us all. He will be sadly missed by all his family and friends. One of nature's true gentlemen.

# MATAR STABLES BULLIO CUP Ride Review

A short, sharp storm brought with it a lovely fall of rain on Friday night before the ride. This heralded a perfect beginning for the inaugural Bullio Cup being run in the hills on the outskirts of Orange.

Saturday night saw everyone gather for the pre-ride talk followed by a lamb on the spit two course dinner followed by a happy hour underneath the marquee. Thank you to Greg Hamilton for his culinary skills. It was a perfect showcase for the lamb industry.

As this was a new course, ride organisers were guarded about how it would be ridden and encouraged riders to give it the respect it deserved. They were pleasantly surprised at the winning time of the top 5 completions and the overall completion rate of over 80% for all AERA events and CEI\* Open & Youth events. This was a credit to all the riders who judged the technicality of the

course very well.

The 1<sup>st</sup> leg took riders up through the Canobolas State Forest, along forestry roads, with 1077 metres total in climbs and descents. The 2<sup>nd</sup> leg of 24kms allowed the riders to enjoy more open travelling through magnificent grazing country, with combined climbing of 560m. The last 16kms kept the riders up on the plateau, where they travelled over grassy, mown tracks that were excellent underfoot, and then back to the ride base to pass under the Matar Stables Bullio Cup finishing arch.

The Perpetual Bullio Cup was awarded to the first rider over 73kg from the senior divisions of the CEI and AERA rides. The overall winner was the 1<sup>st</sup> Middleweight rider, Sarah Lymbery from Wagga Wagga riding *Baranne Tu-Shay*, in a time of 4hrs 14 minutes. The 12 year old Anglo Arabian gelding was also presented with the Best Conditioned Middleweight award, judged by the President of the Veterinary Commission, Dr. Monika Baffey.

The CEI\*80km Open division was won by Con Bouzianis riding homebred pure Arabian mare, *Conderosa Zahera* in a time of 4hrs 17 minutes. Con rides as a heavyweight carrying over 91kg and his lovely mare was awarded the CEI\* Open Best Conditioned award for this event.

Overall line honours went to AERA Lightweight Rider, Clare Fleming riding, *Fleming Bomsaway* in a time of 4:04. However, only an open rider with a weight of 73kg and over was eligible to win the Bullio Cup. Clare Fleming was closely followed by Georgia Curry, riding *Mountain View Just Annallusion* in a time of 4:05 who successfully won 1<sup>st</sup> place and Best Conditioned Horse in the CEI\* Youth event. *Fleming Bomsaway* went on to be awarded the Lightweight Best Conditioned Horse.

The AERA Heavyweight division, was secured by Gavin Peacock riding *Chop Chop* in a time of 5hrs01, taking out the Best Conditioned Award in his division. The Heavyweight division had a success rate of 58.33%, a terrific result considering the technicality of the course.

The AERA Junior division saw Scarlett McQueen on *Kynnum Park Mr Epona* cross the finish line looking fabulous, in a ride time of 4:36. The Junior division was supported by fifteen wonderful riders who are the future of the sport and had an overall completion rate of 60%. 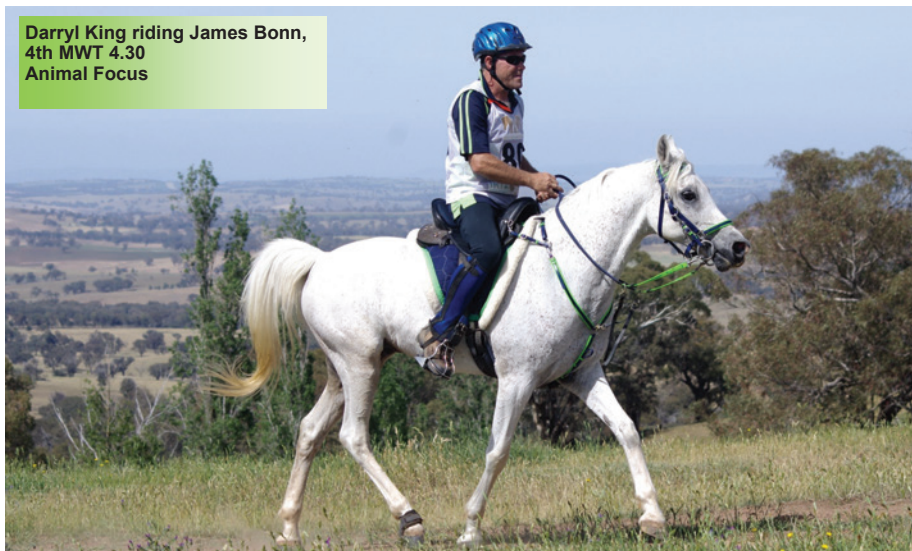

## NSW ENDURANCE RIDERS ASSOCIATION INC.

### RIDE BOOKING PROCEDURES



1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (SMC) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride booking forms will be considered in the order in which they are received (including FEI).
3. When forwarded to the Secretariat the ride booking form **must** contain;
  - (a) an alternative date,
  - (b) have appropriate contact details,
  - (c) be signed by a member of the ride organising committee,
  - (d) Indicate if there are to be any horse health requirements enforced on the ride (please see rules 14.1 and 16.5 AERA rules – amendments to AERA Rulebook applicable 01/01/2018).

Incorrectly filled forms will be sent back and may hold up approval.
4. There will only be one Endurance Event scheduled for each weekend.
5. The NSW SMC will have the right to approve or refuse a ride application in the overall best interests of the NSWERA membership. Alternate dates to be advised to Ride Committee.
6. Priority in allocating dates will be given to ride organisers with an established endurance ride event to maintain that event; alternate dates will be advised by the NSWERA SMC.
7. Rides must have approval from the NSWERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE, this includes rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides.
8. Any changes to an already approved ride, e.g. distance changes, additional rides; must have an amended ride booking form submitted to the NSWERA SMC for re-approval and cannot be advertised until reapproved.
9. The ride booking form will indicate the ride committee's request for their ride to be dual affiliated with another State.
10. The ride organiser will receive confirmation of approval, or non-approval, by the ride calendar portfolio owner in writing as soon as practicable.
11. Correspondence will be forwarded to ride committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet, Treatment Vet and Accredited Chief Steward; as well as the ride entry fees.



# Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b) ) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.
