LOG BOOK APPLICATION PROCEDURE

This document explains the procedure to apply for a Log Book. Applications received which do not comply with this procedure will be returned to the applicant. Please be aware that either the Applicant or the Legal Owner must be a current member of the NSW Endurance Riders Association Inc.

Novice Log Book Application

- Obtain a Novice Log Book application at <http://www.nswera.asn.au> or phone 02 4938 0081.
- Read carefully and fully complete all sections of the Novice Log Book application.
- Mail the following to the NSWERA Secretariat at the address shown above;
 - the fully completed Novice Log Book application
 - a copy of any breed registration certificates (eg. AHSA) if available
 - a cheque, credit card details or a money order for the fees shown on the application
- Allow 14 days for the processing of your application and the return of your Novice Log Book.

Please Note: The Novice Log Book is a 2 in 1 Log Book and will become your Endurance Log Book once the necessary Novice qualifications have been satisfied. When you apply for the Novice Log Book you have the OPTION to either complete an Owner Identification of the horse OR have a proper Veterinary Identification completed which will then suffice once the horse progresses from Novice to Endurance status.

Endurance Log Book Application

When your horse has completed the necessary qualifications to progress from Novice to Endurance status you may request an Endurance Log Book for your horse. Whilst your horse may have satisfied the necessary criteria to progress from Novice to Endurance status, your horse will still be required to adhere to all novice conditions until such time as you obtain and utilise the Endurance Log Book for the horse.

- Obtain an Endurance Log Book application at <http://www.nswera.asn.au> or phone 02 4938 0081
- Read carefully and fully complete all sections of the Endurance Log Book application including a proper Veterinary Identification if not previously lodged with your Novice Log Book application.
- Mail the following to the NSWERA Secretariat at the address shown above;
 - the fully completed Endurance Log Book application
 - a copy of any breed registration certificates (eg. AHSA) if available and if not lodged with your Novice Log Book application
 - your Novice Log Book which includes 240kms of successful completions
 - a cheque, credit card details or a money order for the fees shown on the application
- Allow 14 days for the processing of your application and the return of your Endurance Log Book. (Your Novice Log Book will also be returned if not a 2 in 1 Log Book.)

Micro Chips

From the 01/01/2010 all horses progressing to Endurance status must be micro chipped in order to obtain their Endurance Log Book. An ISO compliant micro chip may be purchased from any supplier (including your local veterinarian) but may only be inserted by a registered Veterinarian.
