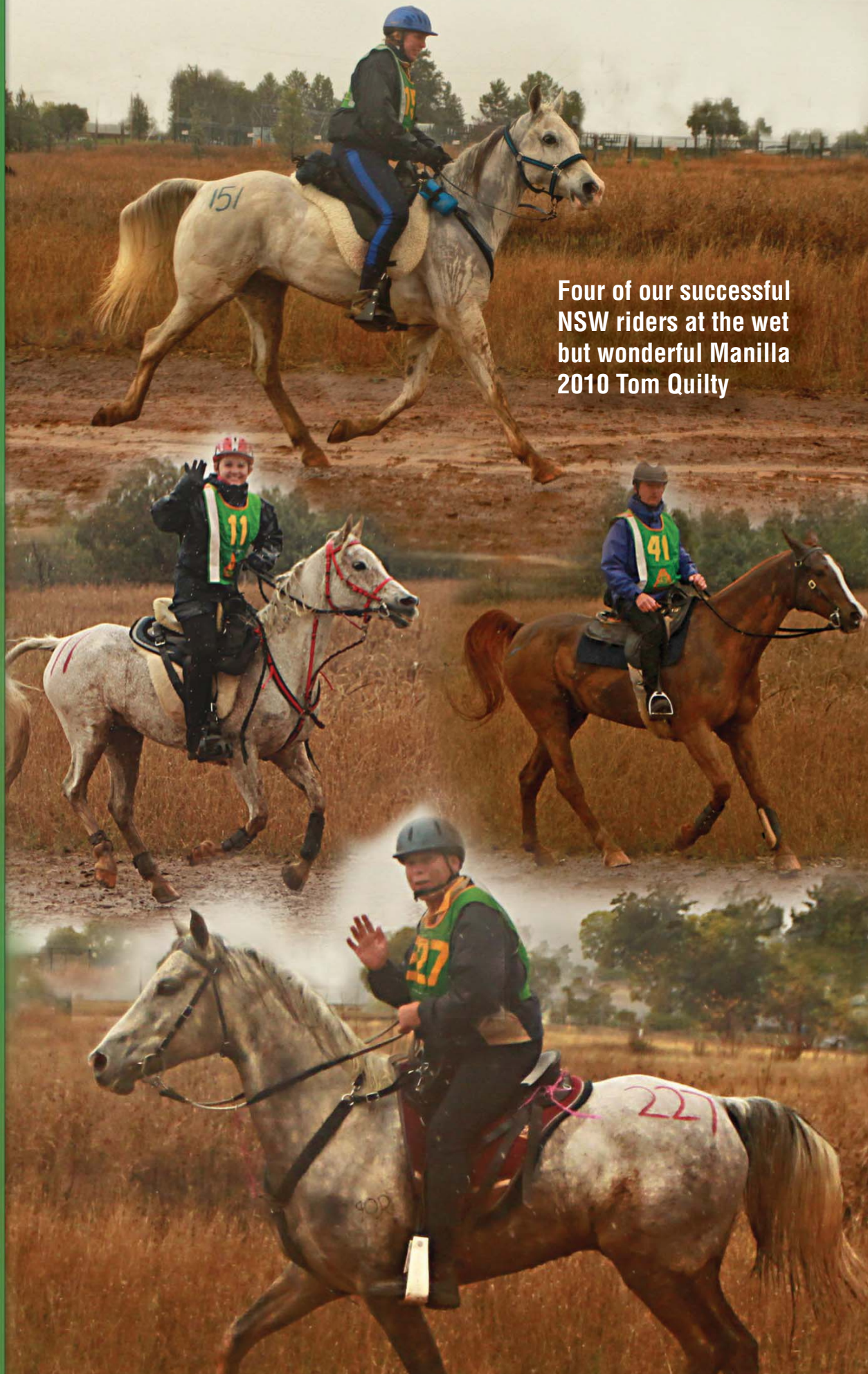

The new track arrows have been given to ride committees and from all reports they have been very successful. Another recommendation from the ROF, the SMC is looking into providing some additional signage for rides such as "Ride Base" arrows, "Horses Crossing" etc. We are also looking into other options to make rides more efficient and user friendly. The additional scales have been ordered and vests for Vets and TPRs have also been ordered.

John Howe has been working hard on next years provisional ride calendar and contacting ride committees to negotiate suitable dates and so far with great success. We need all ride organisers to think about their preferred dates for next year and apply to Sonya at the Secretariat ASAP so we can move the new process forward.

Draft Plans of Management

Note: all National Parks & Wildlife Service Plans of Management, whether draft or finalised, can be viewed at the NPWS website - www.nationalparks.nsw.gov.au

You can make submissions by post or directly from the website. A submission is simply your comments on the plan of management, whether agreeing or disagreeing with what is being proposed.

Broadwater National Park – north of Evans Head. Horse riding not permitted except below the mean high water mark along the beach (which is outside NPWS control). Submissions close 19 July 2010.

Binjura Nature Reserve – north-west of Cooma. Horse riding not mentioned therefore not permitted. Submissions close 16 August 2010.

Aberbaldie Nature Reserve – between Tamworth and Walcha. A public road crosses the reserve but is excluded from it. Horse riding not mentioned therefore not permitted within the reserve. Submissions close 30 August 2010.

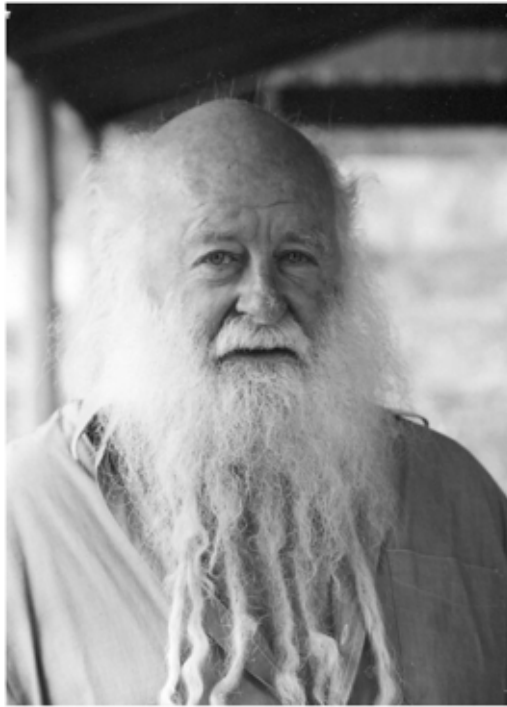

The Magnificent Halifax Hayes

Founder and Patron of
Shahzada

23rd June 1934 – 9th May
2010

Hal was unique and is a legend in endurance circles. However, Shahzada may never have happened, had he not wandered down into St. Albans village in 1971 and instead gone North, as so many did in the heady flower power days of the new free and easy early 70's. At that time, Hal is described as a 'Hercules' having red hair and a

red beard. Oh! yes and he was wearing his legendary thongs. I don't think those who knew him could ever look at a pair of rubber thongs again and not think of Hal.

Hal first became interested in horses and their feats when his then partner Sue May rode endurance. Hal was strapper and became further involved being Chief Steward at the Tom Quilty he did some endurance rides on a buckskin called Max. Hal got the idea for 'Shahzada' following their involvement in the 'Bite the Bullet' ride Melbourne to Sydney in 1976. Sue May with Hal strapping went on to win the Tom Quilty in 1979 on her appaloosa Karella Buckshot. His idea was then further fuelled, he read about military tests and the horse Shahzada who excelled. Hal had discussions with the Baileys (Lyn and Adrian), Allan Mackinder and others. The Shahzada 400 was born in 1981 with 26 riders attempting the unknown, 15 horses and one mule completed the first Shahzada. Hal was Chief Steward and Ride Organisor and with a lot of help from his friends continued running Shahzada until 2002.

One of his proudest moments was when he presented Maddie, his daughter, with her Shahzada buckle, she rode Poppy (Propodollah Peresteri), a feisty 10 year old grey mare given to her by Peter Cole. Hal still managed the running of Shahzada that year but first and foremost he was Maddie's strapper.

There was much more to Hal than the Shahzada legend that he created, Stonemason, Fireman, Artist, Photographer, good friend and adviser to many but most of all Hal loved being "Dad " to his beloved daughter Maddie. When Hal stepped down from his many years of devotion to Shahzada, he and Maddie undertook his first overseas holiday, adventuring together to New Zealand, Singapore and Europe, where Hal marvelled at the stonemasonry in Lyon and Paris.

Jan Slattery who has been associated with Shahzada since the beginning and is the former long time, hard working Secretary of Shahzada, and her partner Bruce, opened up their home to farewell Hal. It was packed to the rafters with those celebrating the many facets of the life of Halifax Hayes. They were work mates, friends, locals, Fire Brigade and National Parks members and officials, endurance committee members, riders and

My Quilty Story.

The Tom Quilty Gold Cup is one of the world's iconic Endurance Rides. It is known the world over and is a ride that, although I completed it at Tooraweenah, is one that always excites me.

My journey to Manilla commenced on 23.9.2008 when I purchased my Arab Stockhorse, Ashbend Perazzi aka 'Ears' from Leanne Le Claire. I qualified Ears in 2009 and then completed Shahzada on him. He's a fantastic horse and I knew that he would not let me down. Before heading to Manilla we had completed 900kms of Endurance without a vet out and no worries or problems to contend with.

I set off to Manilla and arrived on the Thursday afternoon, wow, what a camp, it was huge. I was escorted to my campsite and couldn't believe my good fortune. Right under the old railway Viaduct, directly opposite the start line on the other side of the river.

Thursday afternoon and again before vetting on Friday, I rode out from camp and had a look at where we would be heading off to on Friday night. Everywhere I looked there were the most beautiful horses, riders from every State and riders from overseas; all there to do what I wanted to do, to win a Quilty buckle. Naturally I was able to catch up with scores of people I know in the sport and of course, to meet people for the first time.

The atmosphere builds and builds, there is something final about doing that last bit of paperwork and weighing in. It's here at last. I'd been waiting 7 years for the Quilty to be back in NSW and I'm here and it's happening! The Trevor Knight concert, the feeling of being a part of the whole Friday pre ride vetting in that huge showground arena, the walk through of the Vet gate into hold process that we would follow. After the preride talk I had a lie down but didn't sleep.

Midnight. The start. To stand in my camp with Ears all saddled up. Watching all those horses that were the "Pointy end", walking up behind the 4WD Motor bike, the sound of the hooves, the cheering of the crowd, the lights on every rider's helmet, then the bike peeling away and that one beautiful leggy grey jumping into the lead, they were away. It was the sort of spectacle that no one there could ever forget. Then, mounting up and away, Ears and I and our riding buddy Jodi Dewick, finding our way out of the grounds through the huge crowd of well wishers waving us off, the lift that the start gives has to be worth 50kms.

The field spreading out and that ribbon of light, visible for miles, a huge almost religious procession of the Endurance faithful winding out across the North West plains. The full moon peering through the clouds stage lighting our way. The riders with glo sticks on their saddles, reflectors on helmets and gear, some with red and green lights like ships navigation aids. The riders calling to their fellows, all exhilarated to be there, to be part of the ride.

The riders along the way. The Girls from California, here for their first visit to Australia, hoping to see Kangaroos and Australian wildlife. The UFO's in UFO gully, the things to break the tension and give everyone a good laugh. The good natured checkpoint people ready with a drink or a joke.

To come back into the showground and see the communal strapping area. The diversity had to be seen to be believed. Alongside the Aladdin's cave of saddlery, a single biscuit of Lucerne with a neatly folded Wool rug, a plastic bucket of water and a coiled lead rope. Never before had "To finish is to win" mean so much to me.

As the day wears on the news of so many vet-outs, the rain at the end of the Second leg, getting soaked to the skin and cold. The mud. Watching every step, getting off and walking as much as possible to spare my mate from slips and falls, to give him a break knowing that he must be getting tired, I know that I was.

My riding Buddy, Jodie is gone at the end of the 2nd leg, I feel her pain and miss her company. On and on we go. At one stage we are riding with the oldest and the youngest Quilty first timers, it's

great to listen to why they are there and what they hope to achieve, now and later on.

We come in at the end of each leg. The showground is getting boggy. The Officials whisk us through to a different vet each time, all are happy with Ears, all have a ready smile and words of encouragement. The crowd, keeps up its encouragement and the omnipresent Kieron Power is there all the way, recording for posterity. I'm in my own world, focused on our task, I can no longer feel hot or cold. Just keep going.

My wonderful partner and strapper, Helen keeps feeding me, giving me my riding orders and keeps me focused. All over the ground strappers are doing the same for their riders.

Day ends and night, overcast and black, begins. The moon is full, but can't get through. On we go, to begin the 4th leg, try to get up a little speed but it's slippery as glass. I walk lots to the sound of my boots squishing and sliding through the mud. I wonder if I'll ever get my saddle clean again!

The last leg. The night sky black as an old boot. I have a great torch, its warm comforting glow lights our way. 11 kms is a long way at the wrong end of a 160km ride. We walk the whole way. Splashing through the river revives us a little.

We arrive back at base. Cheering from the crowd. Ears pulse is well under 60. Here we go. The final pulse is done and good, now the trot, the three Vets watching, saying nothing, the Chief Steward holding the slips, I've watched him count and read them several times. The initial Vet is doing Ear's final metabolics. The tension finally gets to me, "Well, how did we go?" "We have to wait for the Vet to finish the metabolics". She gives the chief the nod, "You've passed". Total relief. Elation. Leanne Le Claire is there, so is Ilona Hudson and Helen, we're all hugging each other and Ears. Everyone is congratulating us.

The presentation the next day. What a mammoth task – two and a half hours. The looks on the faces of those who got the prize of a beautiful buckle. The joy, emotion and jubilation. The happy smiles, the feeling of being a part of something that was so much bigger than any one of us.

The dinner dance that night, when the tension bled away. The revelers dancing on the tables, the crowd surfers, the pole dancers, everyone dancing with everyone else. I knew that Endurance riders know how to drink and party, but this party left all others in its wake.

I left the Manilla showground at 11.58am the next morning. The place was well on the way to being empty. Had it really happened? All the years of planning, training and dreaming was over. I have the most wonderful memories and in years to come I'll only have to look at my buckle and Ears and I will be there, reliving every wonderful moment of the 2010 Manilla Tom Quilty Endurance Ride.

Course Description

1st leg—40 km

The Start is approx. 1.5km road work which will turn into a track running beside a railway line which leads into a laneway travelling for 8kms and then you will travel through private property, laneways, stock routes, etc. On this leg there will be 2kms of tarred road which will have a bridge which will be designated “**WALK ONLY**”. **Any rider not walking at this point will be automatically disqualified.** You will return to the Harden Showground on a safe tarred road for 5kms.

2nd Leg—40 km

Approx. 3kms tarred roadwork, turning onto approx. 7kms quite dirt road, another short section of tarred road, before turning into laneways and paddocks, back onto a dirt road and returning to the Showground on approx. 12kms of dirt & sealed road.

3rd Leg- 30km

To be determined.

Social Ride—20 km

The Start is approx. 1.5km road work which will turn into a track running beside a railway line which leads into a paddock behind the old abattoirs onto quiet dirt roads before returning to showground back through paddock, along railway line and 1.5km road work.

“The Manilla Muster”

This is an early ride preview to make everyone aware of an event we have named “The Manilla Muster” – scheduled for early May next year (final date to be confirmed).

This event is a three day 240km marathon ride based at the Manilla Showground. We have already put together numerous **completely new tracks** that have never been used for any ride in Manilla before.

The emphasis of the event is on ‘old-style’ endurance riding - challenging riding befitting of a marathon, warm campfires, new and old friends having fun on and off the track, and a major emphasis on excellent horse management.

Each day will have two legs – the first of which will have a travelling checkpoint. We have property owners that are keen to support the event and put on lunches at their shearing sheds/cattle yards.

The main benefit of having the first vet check out of town each day will be that we can access some fantastic riding further out from town. And all that riders need do is pack their strapping gear in the communal trailer for that first check, whilst we return to base for each evening.

Of course marathon rules will be used with a strong emphasis on horse management.

This should be a great opportunity for riders to dip into marathon riding without interfering with any of the other ‘big rides’ later in the year – in fact it will result in a supremely fit horse ready for any of the aforementioned big rides.

TIE UP YOUR DOGS—or else !!!!!

Unrestrained dogs are roaming the campsite stealing food, urinating on camping equipment, hay and feed and generally creating a nuisance. They also represent a very real danger to the safety of horses and riders.

Riders are responsible for the behaviour of their support crews and friends.

This extends to dogs associated with their camp, which must be restrained at all times, either on a lead or secured in a float or vehicle.

The Chief Steward may disqualify a rider from the ride if that riders' support crew or friends cause disruption detrimental to the running of the ride. Refusal to restrain a dog (of any size) after being requested to do so by the Chief Steward, or an official of the Organising Ride Committee, may also lead to disqualification of the rider. Unless the control of dogs at rides improves significantly, the SMC will be forced to review this situation further.

So if you want to continue taking your dog(s) to rides, do the right thing by ensuring they are restrained at all times.

Australian Endurance Squad

World Equestrian Games Kentucky 2010

Four horse rider combinations have been short listed to represent Australia in Endurance at this years World Equestrian Olympics. One rider, Matthew Sample, has qualified with 2 horses

Penny Toft and Don, successful competitors at the World Endurance Championships in Malaysia in 2008, Penny, previously a Gold, Silver and Bronze medal winner, and Don, a 14yo unregistered gelding have many successful 160km competitive completions over the previous 5 years and will be well suited to the Kentucky course.

Matthew Sample and Brookleigh Ricardo, competitive duo, several wins and second placings in major FEI rides during the last 5 years. This will be Matthew and Ricardo's second attempt at World Championship level, being unsuccessful in Malaysia 2 years ago, a dual Quilty winner in 2009 and winner of the H/W Division in 2008 Quilty, Matthew is determined to do well in Kentucky. Brookleigh Ricardo is a 12yo unregistered gelding, now reaching his prime as an endurance horse, should do well in Kentucky

Tarrangower Crecendo owned and ridden by Matthew is also qualified to enter this event. Crecendo is a 14yo Arabian gelding, with a distinctive white face and strawberry roan in colour, dual Quilty winner 2009 and winner Qld state Championships 2010

Norbet Radny and West Coast Acheron, a very successful combination in their home State of WA and now taking on the world at Kentucky. Acky, as he is commonly know, is an 11yo Arabian stallion with many endurance wins as well as being successful on the show circuit both in hand and under saddle when shown and ridden by his other owner of this successful family, Jane. Acky together with Jane, Norbet and their daughter Rebecca travelled to the Queensland State Championships, to competently complete their qualifications for Kentucky.

The horses are due to fly out on the first stage of their Kentucky adventure in early September, they will be accompanied on the flight with Team Veterinarian Dr Robyn Mather and met by the Chef D Equipe Dr Trish Mackay Annetts in Los Angeles, where the horses will spend 3 days in quarantine before flying onto Kentucky.

We wish the Team all the best of good competition.

Team South Africa 2010

Six riders and their support crew will fly out for Johannesburg on June 30 for the South African Championships at Fauresmith Orange Free State, to defend the trophy of the winning team's event that the successful Squad Team won last year.

The Team, Kristie Taprell, Jil Bourton (A member of the successful 2009 team) Linda Tanian, Jess Dastani Bawden, Allix Jones and Talea Haskow Stewart will be riding horses supplied to them by local endurance riders. The Championships is a 3 x 80km/day event run under the South African

Endurance rules which are very similar to Australian rules, the number of starters are usually between 350-400 horses and riders.

This will be a great experience for these riders and crew, while it will be good to bring the Teams trophy home again, it is also satisfying to see our riders go out and represent us well and have a great experience at the same time.

The Championships take place July 6-9.

The Trans Tasman competition will be hosted by Australia this year, following the very successful event held in the North Island of New Zealand last November we will be looking to keep this standard going in 2010.

The ride, which will be a FEI 1* 90km event, will be held in South Australia on 8-10 October, the team will consist of 4 riders, 2 senior and 2 young riders and a Chef D' Equipe. Expressions of interest from interested riders will be called for in early July.

The success of the Trans Tasman largely depends on being able to obtain suitable horses for the visiting team to compete with. The generosity of riders and owners to make horses available for the Kiwis team is needed, the Aussie team were supplied with very good horses when we competed over there last year, so good that we managed to beat them on their own horses, so we need to return the favour, without having them beating us!. Horses need to be yellow book horses and at least six years of age.

The final of the Young Horse Challenge will take place at Oberon on the week end of 28 November. Thank you to the Freeman Family for including this Championships in the calendar. The finals will be a 2* 120km ride and open to young horses that have qualified at rides during the year

The NSW State Management Committee would like to remind riders that it is the riders responsibility to maintain the minimum weight if you chose to ride middleweight or heavyweight at rides.

Please remember that you must weigh in pre-ride with the gear you will be riding in (excluding your bridle) and nothing else. Some people may lose weight during a ride, so please ensure you have a couple of kilos up your sleeve so you do not risk disqualification at the end of the ride.

At the Victorian Quilty the CS said that all strappers running out a horse, must have a ride number. General discussion on how to manage this. There can be no second set of numbers. It's up to riders and strappers to work this out. The person in charge of the horse must have a ride number on.

Vet hospital at the Victorian Quilty. There needs to be some sort of vet hospital coordinator to deal with the horse and the owner. There were no treatment sheets so that riders knew what drugs etc their horse received. If treatment was needed on the way home, there was no treatment information to give to any other vet that you might need. This needs to be rectified.

Robyn Mather is our treatment vet this year. Belinda will speak to her about Roy's observations. It was agreed that a treatment summary would be very helpful. Neil will speak to the Quilty committee about some creature comfort for the humans in the vet hospital area.

Cedar Ridge 21.3.10

Another excellent ride. 2 horses floated back to base. Rider had a fall.

Kiwarra 28.3.10

A well-organised ride that was hard underfoot. Hot, humid ride. Four invasive treatments and a number of rest orders issued.

A long, well established ride, very well run.

Kundabung 11.4.10

Ride Bases Map

The NSWERA Web page now has a Google map with 'Find it' features that will show the distribution of ride bases through NSW and provide a map with directions from your home to the ride base.

To access the map just go to **www.nswera.asn.au**. When you get there just click on the "NSW Ride Base Map" towards the top of the screen.

To use the map: -

- Click on the ride base in the list on the left.
- A text box will pop up near the flag for the ride base.
- Click on get directions 'to here'.
- Enter your hometown in the start address.

Click 'GO' and print off the map and directions.

If you have a navigator in your vehicle the map coordinates are shown in the text box, but a word of caution when using a navigator to go to a map grid reference, navigators are programmed to find the most direct route (as the crow flies), and as you get close to your destination they sometimes want to turn you down a side road or even a forest trail.

Ride organisers

To have a ride base added to the map,

1. Go to Google on the internet.
2. Select 'Maps' from the menu bar at the top.
3. With a map of Australia showing.
4. the curser (a little hand) on the area you're interested in, right click and select 'Center map here'.
5. Slide the up the scale ladder a little.
6. Repeat 4&5 until you have zoomed in on the area.
7. Now select 'Satellite' to see an overhead picture of the area.
8. Put the 'Little Hand' on the gateway to the ride base, right click and select 'Directions from Here'.
9. A green flag will appear at the spot and a 'Get directions' box will appear in the top left corner.
10. If the flag is not quite right, click and drag it.
11. In the 'Get directions' box against flag 'A' will be the map grid reference for the spot chosen, it will look like (-30.294007,147.498579)
12. Jot down that reference with the ride name and email it to me at 'vpe63190@bigpond.net.au'.

To check we have located the marker correctly, or if the ride base has been moved, zoom in on your marker on the Ride Bases Map as described above, switch to Satellite and check the position of the marker. If it is in error follow the procedure above and email me the details.

Also run some tests approaching your ride base from different directions and note any anomalies, see the Shahzada text box for an example.

Attention Ride Secretaries

Following a recommendation from the AERA International Committee (AERA IC), the AERA has agreed that a \$5.00 affiliation fee should be paid to the AERA IC for each horse entered into a FEI ride. Ride Organisers should add this amount to their ride entry fee.

Transfer of Ownership Procedures

It is the responsibility of the purchaser of the horse to notify the State of the change in ownership details. It is important that the correct person be registered as the owner of the horse as this assists with the correct allocation of National and State distance and pointscore awards as well as identifying the persons responsible for the horse when disciplinary actions need to be instituted.

Process for Changing Ownership Details

When a sale of a horse occurs and the horse has had a logbook issued it is the responsibility of the new owner to notify the State of the change of ownership. A transfer of ownership form must be completed and forwarded to the State, together with a cheque for \$11 and the logbook.

Once the transfer of ownership form is received the logbook can be amended with the change in owners and the transfer verified by the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Procedure for Recording Change of Ownership

Transfer of ownership forms are to be made readily available to all members, preferably through the State Newsletters or upon application to the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Once a logbook, transfer of ownership form and fee are received the Logbook Secretary/Registrar will:

1. Record the ownership transfer into the logbook.
2. Verify the transfer.
3. Return the logbook.
4. Record the ownership transfer into the computer records of the State Division.
5. Keep a copy of the ownership transfer form and forward the original to the AERA Registrar.
6. Forward the \$5 fee to AERA.

RIDE SECRETARIES

If you intend to change your ride details these changes **MUST** come in the form of a new application for approval by NSW ERA through the proper channels. No ride change requests are to be made direct to the newsletter.

NSW ERA Committee.

NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b)) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.

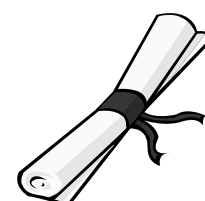
