President's Report

Kerry has decided to step down from the SMC and spend more time participating in the sport while pursuing other interests. Kerry dedicated a large slice of her life over the last 14 years to serving the association as a member of the SMC, including 12 years as our AERA delegate where in recent years she has been Vice President. Kerry, a tireless worker of exceptional intellect and skills is most effective in 'the engine room', never seeking the spotlight but driving and guiding any group she participates in to achieve a quality team outcome. Any review of the association's achievements over these past 14 years would reveal the extent to which her influence and efforts have contributed to the shaping of the association as we know it today, and Kerry's expertise has been invaluable in guiding the NSWERA through some very difficult situations over the years.

These are, indeed, very big shoes to fill.

Kerry, on behalf of the association, and your SMC and AERA colleagues, we thank you for your efforts and your contribution over the years and wish you and your mare many happy trails.

NEWS FOR YOUR NEXT CAMPFIRE

Tom McCormack - AERA President

July 27th 2012

An AERA meeting was held on the 13th – 15th July. Below is a brief summation of the key items from the meeting.

World Endurance Championships

On behalf of the AERA and the entire Australian Endurance community, I wish our Team attending the 2012 WEC all the best for a safe and successful trip to the UK. The team comprises Talea Hasko-Stewart, Norbert Radny, Alexandra Toft and Penny Toft. Disappointingly, Matthew Sample and

Andre Laws-King have been late withdrawals.

The team will be led by Chef Peter Toft and Team Vet Dr. Narelle Cribb. I thank all the riders, team officials, their families, friends and support crew for the commitment to represent the Australian Endurance Community.

Database

Progress continues to be made on the database development which will be implemented on January 1st 2013. The new database has 3 modules,

- A Management module which contains all the primary data relevant to both people and horses and which will be used primarily by State Registrars.
- A Ride Day module which will be used at the ride base to enter the relevant ride day data.
- A Website module which will be the interface to the general members to view selected data such as ride results, point scores and distance data.

The AERA has booked the 13th and 14th of October for a formal introduction and training session on the new database. The workshop will be held in Brisbane and will be attended by each State Registrar plus 1 other from each State (space is limited). The AERA will then liaise with individual States to roll out further regional training sessions in the later part of 2012 and early 2013.

Constitution

Progress on the Constitutional review has been slow. Essentially a decision must be made whether to change the underlying corporate structure of the AERA which is currently an "Incorporated Association". It has been recommended by a Constitutional Lawyer that we should move to a "Company Limited by Guarantee". There are pros and cons for both models and obtaining a consensus of opinion at the AERA table is yet to be achieved. The AERA is preparing a discussion paper to be sent to the State SMC's for their consideration and input. Once State input has been considered a direction forward should be clearer.

TQ2012

The Tasmanian Tom Quilty was a huge success. The TQ12 committee was a small but dedicated team expertly led by Dr. Pat Hodgetts. The weather was perfect with rain early in the week to soften the course followed by days of clear sky's delivering frosty mornings and cool clear days. 115 riders attended pre-ride vetting and the entire event ran smoothly and efficiently. The AERA wishes to acknowledge the professional effort of the TQ12 Committee and thanks one and all who contributed in any way to make the event the huge success that it was.

TQ2013

The township of Kilkivan will host the 2013 TQ from the 7th – 9th June. The TQ Committee recently conducted the Qld State Championships as their test event over the proposed TQ Course and there was positive feedback on the course and ride base venue. Whilst there is still plenty to do, the TQ13 Committee is committed to delivering a great event for the 300 horses expected to compete.

TQ2014

The Agreement has been signed for the 2014 TQ to be held at Wagin in the Western Australia wheat belt from the 3rd – 5th October 2014. The course will be generally flat to undulating with a first class ride base facility. East Coast members should plan an excursion to the West in 2014 as the trip is a great adventure and should be on every Endurance riders bucket list.

TQ2015 – 50th Anniversary

Whilst the location of the 2015 TQ is yet to be finalised, the AERA is beginning preparations to celebrate our 50th milestone event. A sub-committee is being formed with the intention of identifying and recommending to the AERA appropriate activities to be included in the 50th Anniversary event. The sub-committee is open to all state members so if you feel you can contribute please submit an EOI. Look for details on the AERA website in early August.

Tom Quilty Website

Last year the AERA registered the domain name TomQuilty.com.au for the purpose of establishing a permanent web presence for the event. In September, a new website dedicated purely to the Tom Quilty Gold Cup will become operational. The website will host all the historical data of the Tom Quilty plus provide a pictorial history of the event. The website will also host future TQ event homepages so it will become a one stop shop for all things Tom Quilty. Members are invited to contribute any material relevant to the Tom Quilty from any year whether it be photographs or documents. If you have items to contribute please email the AERA webmaster with details.

National Course Marking Materials

Course marking materials can now be purchased on-line at the AERA website. All items are uniformly priced at \$1.10 which includes GST and postage. An order generated on-line automatically emails a copy to the AERA Bookkeeper who invoices the customer and once paid, the goods will be despatched. Customers should allow 7 working days for delivery once the invoice has been paid. A photo of each item is shown on the order form.

EA Update

As members would be aware, the EA affiliation proposal was unanimously rejected by the States. EA has agreed that a delegation from EA and the AERA will meet in September in an attempt to negotiate an agreement / working relationship that is acceptable to both parties. State SMC's and members will be kept informed of developments.

AERA Chat-Line

Vet, Chief Steward and TPR Accreditation

The AERA is currently reviewing the accreditation process for Vets, Chief Stewards and TPRs and revised accreditation procedures will be effective from 01/01/2013.

Australian Endurance Squad (AES)

The AERA is currently considering the long term structure and format for the AES and members will see more on this in the latter part of 2012.

Manilla Muster Report

The Tamworth & District Endurance Club hosted the second annual Manilla Muster Marathon endurance ride in Manilla last week. The event consisted of a 240km Marathon ride which required horse and rider to travel 80km per day for 3 consecutive days. An 80km Endurance ride and 40km Training ride were held in conjunction with the Marathon to cater for all abilities and fitness levels.

The concept of the Muster was to travel to different properties in the district and offer riders diverse trails and spectacular views and provide another Marathon event on the endurance calendar.

Day one of the Marathon took riders out to Oakhampton. Horses were then strapped and vet checked and riders and crew then enjoyed a delicious lunch provided by Belinda Nixon. Those who successfully passed the vet check then travelled back to the Manilla Showground.

Day two proved testing for both horse and rider, taking them to the Top of Mount Borah through beautiful grazing country to Calool. Vet checks, lunch provided by the Manilla Lions club and once returned to the showground for a good night's sleep.

Day three meant that the marathon riders were joined on course by the riders in the 80km and 40km rides. A cool frosty start at 4am had all riders out on course heading through private property, down dirt roads and then back to the showground for vetting. The 80km and Marathon riders then repeated this leg.

48 riders entered the Marathon ride and 24 managed to successfully complete the ride. Fastest time was Sonia Bonham riding Box Hill Bullzeye in 18 hours and 16 minutes. Local rider (and one of the event organisers) Kim Hagon riding Diamond R Boston was close behind in 18 hours and 24 minutes. The title could have gone either way after these cousins, Sonia (a nurse) and Kim (a vet nurse) both stopped on course to render assistance. Sonia assisted a rider who had passed out and Kim helped a horse which received a tiny puncture wound which severed an artery stripping down to her underwear in the frost to tourniquet the wound with her shirt!

There were 50 riders in the 80km event and 19 in the 40km event giving a total of 117 horses.

Invitation—Potential TPRs

The ACT Endurance Riders Association would like to invite you to our TPR (Temperature, Pulse and Respiration) and Introduction to Endurance Riding Training day being held on the 23rd September at Kambah Pony Club, ACT.

TPR stewards are used at endurance rides to assist the veterinarians by monitoring the Temperature, Pulse and Respiration of the horses before, during and after a ride. Being able to confidently take your horses' temperature, pulse and respiration will enable you to monitor his health and fitness and be responsive to any potential problem that may arise, whether in the paddock or during competition.

The morning session commences at 9.00am and involves learning the meaning and consequence of the various sounds and rhythms of the heart and respiration. It also explains the relevance and application to the regulations of endurance riding. The session will have a hands-on component, taking the TPR of a number of horses. This will be followed by a short test for those that wish to become a provisional TPR. Once you have done the course, you are a Provisional TPR until you have TPR'd at 3 rides and then become an Accredited TPR. To maintain accreditation, you must TPR at 1 ride per year. When you have then done 20 rides, you are awarded your own personalized TPR vest and a thermometer, stopwatch and stethoscope by NSWERA.

Lunch will be around 12md and will be a sausage sizzle, kindly sponsored by NSWERA and the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation. Notes and the NSWERA Handbook will be provided. Please register to receive your free sausage sandwich and drink.

The afternoon component commences at 1pm (finishes around 3.30pm) will consist of short sessions covering your first ride (what to expect, rules and regulations), gear for the horse (including shoeing) and rider, getting your horse fit (including feeding) and how to strap your horse. 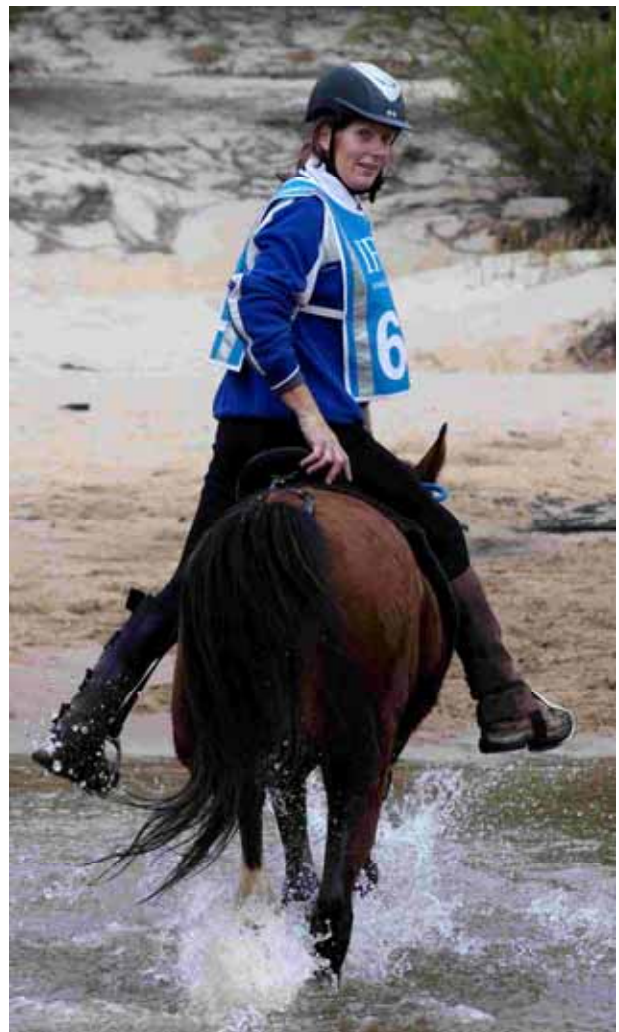

There were plenty of happy smiles on course and some new faces to the sport seemed to be enjoying themselves. New friends and riding buddies were made while older riders on young horses mixed it with some very young riders on trusted ponies.

Twenty-one year old Casey Curtis was 1st Middleweight riding Topline Extravagance in a time of 5hrs 15

minutes. Casey also won Best Conditioned in the division with a rug sponsored by Virginia Blain's stud, Suncrest Arabians.

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Squad News August 2012

World Champs Euston Park

As most would be aware, the World Endurance Championships for 2012 is over. It has been an historic event in terms of riding times travelled by the winning horses and the first time a WC has been stopped (quote from the FEI website) by a powerful thunderstorm, 57 riders and the first 4 teams had already finished. The advice from the nearby airfield radar indicated that the storm would continue for at least 2 hours, as it was getting dark, there was considerable risk due to the torrential rain and fork lightening to the horses, riders and track stewards. The decision was made to allow those already on course to finish the current loop at vet gate 5 and be classified according to the timings on the shortened distance.

The times travelled by the 3 winning horses, which included our own Kurrajong Concorde, Endurance's answer to Black Caviar, no doubting that!, her time was 7:01:04, 49 seconds behind the winning horse, and if you watched the live streaming this mare lead the ride for the majority of the event, but as protocols dictated she would not be first across the line. So that is not so important but an indication of the training and preparation that these horses are able to travel so well over that distance and look so good at the finish.

There was 73 horses to successfully complete and 74 were eliminated, the vast majority due to lameness.

So where to now for Australia from here, (a question that is asked after every World Championship of recent times) our Aussie pride was upheld by seventeen year old Alexandra Toft and her homegrown mare Emily Jones te. Give this combination a couple more years and it will be a very different story, Alexandra, already an experienced and gifted rider with a strong competitive instinct will certainly make her mark in the future. Sincere commiserations to the rest of the team members, World Champs are no place for closed minds or horses with shadows of doubt; it is a place for a huge learning curve, expensive? you betcha, so don't waste expensive lessons, experience the time and mixing with the rest of the world.

To quote the Australian Chef, Peter Toft prior to the start of the ride... "Australia's endurance at the moment is in a re-build phase, so we don't have great aspirations for the winning of medals here"

We will never be able to beat the current wining team, we simply do not have the resources to do so, that's OK, France came second, 2 hours behind the winners for a silver medal, we have beaten the French before, we can again.! The USA team, after years of struggling is getting back up there and knocking on the door, 4th in the Teams event is a wonderful outcome for them.

The World Young Riders Championships are at Tarbes France in the northern summer next year and the World Equestrian Games are at Normandy France 2014, that's 2 years away, and anyone with aspirations, and I have heard of several, need to have their horse qualified and going now to be a serious contender, not struggling 6 months out to start ticking qualification boxes.

FEI National Champs 2012

The Glenn Innes Endurance Riders are hosting the final FEI event this year at the well tried and popular Red Range venue and course. The date is November 24-26th and includes AERA 80/120/160km rides as well as the FEI 1*/2*/3* an invitation has been extended to the South African Endurance Association for 4 riders, 2 seniors and 2 juniors for a friendly competition to take place at the Red Range event. It will be run under the AERA (national) and we will be requiring horses. We have not received any response as yet, the invite was issued some 3 weeks ago so should hear something soon. EOI's for the Australian Team will be called the minute we receive a positive response.

Gay Bonham – Secretary, Ride Administration, Ride Standards

Correspondence in and out tabled.

Tami Parnell sent an email to Tom Mc. Discussing an event at the recent State Ride where a horse was not allowed to represent. There is 30 minutes to present. Note on the list of a horse presenting within 33 minutes. Two riders rode the entire ride together but according to the database the results didn't match. Differing times were entered when they should have been the same. This has now been fixed on the data base. Steve Roberts tabled an email regarding errors on heart rate. This needs to be addressed with the relevant vet.

Brad Dillon - Newsletter, Web Site Liaison

No report has been received. Gay said she was not happy with the photo which was on the front of the last newsletter. The horse eventually vetted out and she felt the horse looked tired. She has had a lot of members comment unfavorably on the photo.

Zone 5 – Belinda Hopley – Horse Welfare, CS & TPR, Vet Liaison,

Ride Reports-

Tooraweenah 15/4/12, 80k, 40k. Was well organized, plenty of grass and water, well marked. Unfortunately a horse was taken ill with colic and despite treatment, passed away some weeks later.

NSWERA State Champs 28/4/12, 160k, 80k.

Everything went very well, especially as everything had to be brought in. Unfortunately, the hot water donkey for the strapping area fell between the cracks. Pre-ride there was a breakout of horses that resulted in one horse going through a fence and was subsequently withdrawn from the ride. One horse came in off the 1st leg and vetted out with a high HR and wanting to roll. Mild colic was diagnosed.

Mudgee 20/5/12 80k, 40k, 20k. All seemed to go well.

Gundagai 27/5/12, 80k, 40k. The usual ride base was used, but due to 25+mm rain the week before, the 2nd leg was not deemed safe by Rick (steep ascents and descents) and so the 1st leg was ridden twice. Unfortunately there was another horse breakout pre-ride which resulted in another horse being injured and withdrawn.

One rider was outspoken at pre-ride. He kept interrupting and speaking over the top of Rick. The CS asked the rider to stop and was told to shut up by the rider. This was witnessed by all present at the pre-ride talk. I believe this behaviour needs to be dealt with.

St Albans 9-10/6/12 85k, 2x40k, 2x20k. Had lots of new riders. Need a new 1st aid kit.

CS/TPR-

TPR School – There will be a TPR school held at Kambah Pony Club, ACT, on the 23rd September this year. The exact format is being formalized at the moment – we hope to have part of the day to talk about getting started in Endurance Riding (gear, training and feeding) combined with a sausage sizzle. Candidates sitting the TPR course can claim petrol expenses, courtesy of the NSW Department of Sport and Recreation.

TPR membership – All TPRs must be a current member of an AERA division. The membership category can be either as a Full Riding Member or an Associate Member. This is required for insurance compliance. If you do not have membership please fill in and sign a membership form and indemnity form on the day for Associate Membership and forward it to NSW secretariat for processing. No fee is required for working TPRs.

If you are a current Associate Member, you are entitled to free Associate Membership as a working TPR and may apply for a refund if a membership fee has been paid.

Once you have TPR'd for 20 days, you will receive your own stethoscope, thermometer, stopwatch and personalized Cherished TPR vest. Please remember that you need to TPR at 1 ride per year to maintain your accreditation.

The published TPR's are those TPR's that have remained active, i.e. maintained their accreditation, so please ensure the Chief Steward has correctly noted your name and day(s) attended.

Congratulations to Bernie LaFrance on becoming an accredited TPR.

Vet Liaison-

Vet Accreditation Course – There has been some interest from vets for another accreditation course to be held. We have 3 more vets – Karim Kooros, Terri Eckel and Daniel Sims.

Horse Welfare-

Swabbing - Please be aware that swabbing has been conducted at the NSW State Championships at Wingello, and will continue to be conducted at a number of events this year.

If you are swabbed, please keep your paperwork as it has the sample number (N – Urine sample, B – Blood sample) that is displayed on the Equestrian Australia website under EA Rules and Regs/ Negative (Clear) Sample Analysis Notifications. This notification may take 6-8 weeks.

Horse names: Riders are reminded to use their horses' AERA registered name and logbook when entering **any** ride – 80k, 40k, 20k or 10k. **Rule H 4.3**

Horse Yards: Riders are reminded to read Duty of Care with regard to Horse Containment at rides. There have been 2 incidences this year that have resulted in significant injuries to withdraw from the ride, with one of those horses receiving serious injuries to be out for quite a few months. So please, think about where you camp and how you contain your horse and try to have your horse supervised at all times.

Chief Stewards are also asked to record the name of rider and the horse that escapes and the circumstances surrounding the event so that serial offenders can be identified and warned.

Hendra Virus has reared its ugly head again. Horse owners particularly in the northern areas of NSW are asked to pay particular attention to their horses' health in the weeks leading to a ride they intend to participate in, and consider withdrawing if there are any doubts. Also, please be mindful of cleanliness and biological control procedures whenever in the company of other horses.

South Coast Zone-

Sassafras has been cancelled this weekend due to copious amounts of rain.

Other Stuff-

Child Riders: While it is important that children participate and understand the procedures undertaken at a ride, it is recommended as an extra safety measure that riders under 10 keep their hard hat on when running out or leading their horse.

Tassie TQ: We had Jennifer Gilbertson, Jenny Annetts, Alan Lindsay and Alan Caslick as the NSW team. Can we reimburse Graeme G \$60 please (team entry) and send the other team members' their funding.

Having a TPR school in Canberra in September. Kerry confirmed that these expenses would be covered by one of the government grants. Sport and Athlete Development Grant.

Belinda suggested we write a letter to Marty Moran regarding his stallion getting out of its yard at a ride. He needs to do something about better containment of his horse at rides. The SMC believes that your horse has escaped from its yard on at least one occasion, please do something about better containment of your horse. Please advise within 21 days if you disagree with anything that is in this letter.

Chief Stewards – two new rider invasive treatment forms on the AERA site.

Query – what do we do about chief stewards that aren't members? They must be a member for insurance purposes. Max Gowan isn't a member.

Graedawn Cruisin'

While on a caravan vacation to FNQ with my wife Val and our dog Millie I spent a week at Herberton catching up with friends in the local Endurance club and was the Chief Steward for the Pioneer Trek week of endurance in early July.



peppered with old abandoned mine shafts, one of which was off the track some 4 meters from where Greg and 'Cruisin' were standing. This shaft was very familiar to the club members and others that frequented the area, however what nobody knew was that a horizontal tunnel about 3 meters down had been dug under what was now the track.

Standing there waiting for Kandy to arrive Greg was holding the reins of Cruisin' who started to tug as if walking backwards; Greg turned around and to his horror saw the back half of his horse already in a hole no bigger than a meter across, that had just fallen away in what appeared to be solid ground. He later said that trying to hang onto the horse and having to let go as the horse slipped through the hole was the worst moment of his entire life! The material from the cave-in formed a ramp that had the horse slide down and across so it ended up in the vertical shaft some 6 meters down in water that was 9 meters deep.

John Robertson, the head vet and a group from the ride were dispatched to the site, joined by the

Everything was going along smoothly; pretty laid back and relaxed until Wednesday just about lunch time a frantic call came in "*Can somebody help us – Kandy's Horse has fallen down a mine shaft – it's 6 meters down in water?!!*"

This was the start of a 6 hour period of frantic activity, high emotions, and everyone believed the only possible outcome was going to be a tragedy!

As it turned out it was Kandy's husband, Greg Fisher's horse that had fallen into the mine shaft. Graedawn Cruisin' is, to quote his owners Graeme & Rose Cameron, a family pet and a 'gentle Giant'; they loaned him to their friend Greg so he could ride with Kandy in a 40km training ride that day.

Greg had just topped a very steep climb where three tracks come together at the top of a peak where there is a compacted clear area around the 'Tee' intersection, dismounted, he went off track for a 'comfort stop' and then returned to the edge of the track to await Kandy's arrival.

The whole area was mined for tin and is



local SES and fire crew volunteers and an emotive plea to *'please get the horse out of there!'* was made to Bill Robinson, a local civil engineering contractor who was in Sydney at the time; he sent instructions to his plant to *'do whatever's necessary!'* The only piece of equipment that could get to the site was a tractor with a backhoe attached, driven by Kerry Flower.

Meanwhile Cruisin' was keeping his head above water by bracing his front legs against one side of the shaft and his head and withers against the other side, thrashing about, even barrel rolling when he lost his grip. They thought they had lost him several times; he went under upside down one time then reemerged minus the saddle; he knocked himself unconscious at one point but they managed to keep his nostrils clear of the water. With the backhoe they tried opening out the shaft but everything was solid granite. They tried dumping material into the shaft to raise the water level in an attempt to float the horse up onto the ledge he had been trying to climb onto, but by then he was too exhausted to try.

It was too dangerous for anyone to get close enough to the horse to give him an injection so a rifle was brought to the site in case Cruisin' had to be put down; it was referred to as 'Plan B'. Several times through the operation 'Plan B' seemed to be the only option left but was postponed while some other remote possibility was tried.

Finally with the horse exhausted and hypothermic, even his breath was cold, the decision was made that Cruisin' would not survive much longer and a deadline, approaching darkness, was set for implementation of 'Plan B'. Kerry Flower insisted on an attempt to lift the horse with the backhoe. This had been ruled out several times earlier because there was a risk that the tractor and driver could end up in the hole with the horse.

Kerry very carefully prepared the ground to make a solid platform for the tractor, somebody else managed to get slings around each of the horse's legs and they plucked him out of there. Cruisin' lay, completely exhausted, covered with blankets and warmed by the SES floodlights for about 40 minutes before he struggled to his knees and stood up 15 minutes later, he was led, slowly and carefully, off the mountain, having a pick along the way, and was floated to a local veterinary hospital. (He has made a full recovery)

A feel good, good news ending!!

We all went to the pub for tea and to watch the third state of origin game and with NSW leading 8-nil John Robertson the head vet, who is a keen football fan and fanatical Queensland supporter, arrived late from tending the horse and started barracking; I can't prove it but I'm sure he turned the game around.

A Queensland country pub is a lonely place for a lone New South Welshman on state of origin night, particularly when Queensland wins!!

Important Notice—PICs

**Reproduced below is a letter from Mr Ian Roth, Chief Veterinary Officer of NSW
Concerning the need to obtain a Property Identification Code by people living in NSW who
have horses on their property.**

**You need to obtain a PIC by 1 September 2012. This letter sets out how to go about this.
Please note that there is a cost involved of some \$60 per property.**

Dear Horse Industry representative,

I wish to provide you with some important information about extended requirements for property identification codes (PICs) in NSW. Please forward this information to your members and/or place it on your website so that your members can readily access this information and better understand the NSW PIC requirements.

From 1 September 2012, all properties in NSW with one or more resident horses must have a PIC.

Following the equine influenza (EI) outbreak in 2007, a task-force representing all major NSW horse industry groups (including racing, eventing, breed and show societies) recommended to Governments that PICs for horse properties be introduced. This decision was based on the recognition that it is essential in an emergency involving horses to know where horses are located.

The initial response to EI was hampered by not knowing the location of horses, especially where there were high concentrations of horses. It is likely that the disease would have been controlled more rapidly if we had been able to target areas with the highest density of horses for surveillance and vaccination.

As a result of this industry consensus, the Chief Veterinary Officers from all jurisdictions agreed in 2008 that PICs should be mandatory for properties with one or more horses.

In 2009, the Australian Horse Industry Council (AHIC) strongly expressed its support for the introduction of PICs for properties where horses are kept to the NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI).

PICs are a well-established national system of property registration used by all States and Territories for other livestock. Many horse properties would already have a PIC as they run other livestock or pay rates to Livestock Health and Pest Authorities (LHPAs). Extending PICs to all horse properties makes low-cost use of existing administrative systems and databases.

The introduction of a PIC system for horse properties brings NSW into line with Queensland, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia, Western Australia and the Northern Territory which already have this requirement.

Please note that the introduction of PICs for horse properties DOES NOT mean that horses will be subject to any requirements of the National Livestock Identification Scheme (NLIS). It is not mandatory to supply a PIC before a horse can be bought, sold or moved, nor record the horse's movement on the NLIS database. However, it would be good practice for horse owners to keep a diary or other record of where their horse has been, which ideally would include the PIC of the property or event ground.

In time, sections of the horse industry, as part of a biosecurity risk mitigation strategy, may require entrants to provide the PIC of the property the horse normally resides on when attending an event. This has already been introduced in Queensland and for some events in Victoria. It is this industry requirement that is expected to encourage the uptake of PICs for horse properties in NSW. It is not the intention of NSW DPI or LHPAs to enforce compliance from September 1 and we expect that industry will encourage compliance over time as best practice.

The requirement for PICs for horse properties has been introduced primarily for the benefit and protection of the horse industry. The NSW Minister for Primary Industries has recently written to the AHIC thanking them for their strong support for the introduction of PICs for horse properties and requested that their support for PICs be conveyed to NSW AHIC members. NSW is the state with the largest horse population and possibly the largest economic impact if another disease outbreak occurred, so biosecurity measures such as PICs increases the knowledge and contact with the horse industry, which is a positive step.

Property and horse owners can apply for a PIC by contacting their local Livestock Health and Pest Authority <<http://www.lhpa.org.au/districts>> , or applying on line <<https://customerportal.lhpa.org.au/pic-registration/>> . More information is also available in the Frequently Asked Questions <<http://www.lhpa.org.au/identifying-and-tracing-livestock/property-identification-codes/frequently-asked-questions-for-horse-owners>> for horse owners on the LHPA website. I also attach a brochure which may be of assistance to your members and which could be published on your website or forwarded by email.

Ride Bases Map

The NSWERA Web page now has a Google map with 'Find it' features that will show the distribution of ride bases through NSW and provide a map with directions from your home to the ride base.

To access the map just go to **www.nswera.asn.au**. When you get there just click on the "NSW Ride Base Map" towards the top of the screen.

To use the map: -

- Click on the ride base in the list on the left.
- A text box will pop up near the flag for the ride base.
- Click on get directions 'to here'.
- Enter your hometown in the start address.

Click 'GO' and print off the map and directions.

If you have a navigator in your vehicle the map coordinates are shown in the text box, but a word of caution when using a navigator to go to a map grid reference, navigators are programmed to find the most direct route (as the crow flies), and as you get close to your destination they sometimes want to turn you down a side road or even a forest trail.

Ride organisers

To have a ride base added to the map,

1. Go to Google on the internet.
2. Select 'Maps' from the menu bar at the top.
3. With a map of Australia showing.
4. the curser (a little hand) on the area you're interested in, right click and select 'Center map here'.
5. Slide up the scale ladder a little.
6. Repeat 4&5 until you have zoomed in on the area.
7. Now select 'Satellite' to see an overhead picture of the area.
8. Put the 'Little Hand' on the gateway to the ride base, right click and select 'Directions from Here'.
9. A green flag will appear at the spot and a 'Get directions' box will appear in the top left corner.
10. If the flag is not quite right, click and drag it.
11. In the 'Get directions' box against flag 'A' will be the map grid reference for the spot chosen, it will look like (-30.294007,147.498579)
12. Jot down that reference with the ride name and email it to me at 'vpe63190@bigpond.net.au'.

To check we have located the marker correctly, or if the ride base has been moved, zoom in on your marker on the Ride Bases Map as described above, switch to Satellite and check the position of the marker. If it is in error follow the procedure above and email me the details.

Also run some tests approaching your ride base from different directions and note any anomalies, see the Shahzada text box for an example.

So, keep in touch with your sport through www.nswera.asn.au. You'll get a surprise at the amount of information on there for you. Remember, this is your website, so stories, photos and articles of interest are always a welcome addition.

NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b)) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.

Transfer of Ownership Procedures

It is the responsibility of the purchaser of the horse to notify the State of the change in ownership details. It is important that the correct person be registered as the owner of the horse as this assists with the correct allocation of National and State distance and pointscore awards as well as identifying the persons responsible for the horse when disciplinary actions need to be instituted.

Process for Changing Ownership Details

When a sale of a horse occurs and the horse has had a logbook issued it is the responsibility of the new owner to notify the State of the change of ownership. A transfer of ownership form must be completed and forwarded to the State, together with a cheque for \$11 and the logbook.

Once the transfer of ownership form is received the logbook can be amended with the change in owners and the transfer verified by the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Procedure for Recording Change of Ownership

Transfer of ownership forms are to be made readily available to all members, preferably through the State Newsletters or upon application to the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Once a logbook, transfer of ownership form and fee are received the Logbook Secretary/Registrar will:

1. Record the ownership transfer into the logbook.
2. Verify the transfer.
3. Return the logbook.
4. Record the ownership transfer into the computer records of the State Division.
5. Keep a copy of the ownership transfer form and forward the original to the AERA Registrar.
6. Forward the \$5 fee to AERA.

Please remember that if your horse does not successfully complete an endurance ride for 13 months, it's status reverts to Novice and you must complete your next ride in novice time. Should you complete a ride outside the novice times—you face disqualification and your points and mileage disallowed.

Remember—ignorance of this rule is no excuse.

Tie Up Your Dogs

Riders are responsible for the behaviour of their support crews and friends.

This extends to dogs associated with their camp, which must be restrained at all times, either on a lead or secured in a float or vehicle.

The Chief Steward may disqualify a rider if that riders' support crew causes disruption detrimental to the running of the ride. Refusal to restrain a dog (of any size) after being requested to do so by the Chief Steward, or an official of the Organising Ride Committee, may also lead to disqualification of the rider.
