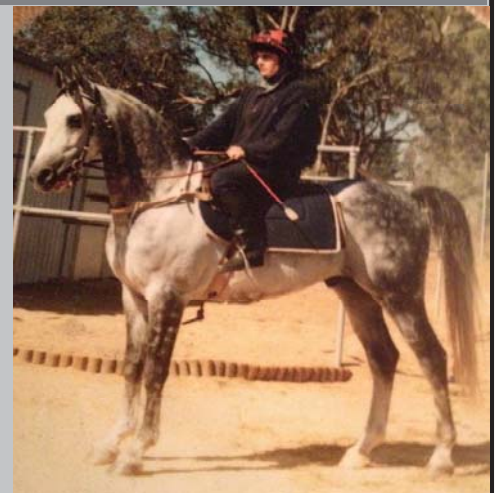

President's Report

Well here it is November again.

A busy year with twenty nine event weekends completed with just two to complete for the 2013 calendar, South Coast championships at Sassafras followed by the Australian FEI Championships at Red Range. The 2014 calendar is filling nicely with sixteen event weekends already booked.

Hendra virus has raised its head in NSW with infections reported at two properties near Macksville and two properties near Kempsey causing some disruption, particularly in Zone 6.

The AERA Hendra Management Subcommittee formed at the last AERA meeting in July has presented its report with recommendations to the AERA and they have been forwarded to the State SMCs for review and member consultation with a view to settling a course of action at the next AERA meeting on the 15th to 17th November.

Following AERA's stance on the removal from the agreement of the acknowledgement by EA that AERA is the exclusive management body for 'Domestic' endurance, EA has reinstated the 'exclusivity' clause and the negotiations continue; hopefully to be finalized following the November AERA meeting.

TQ15; the 2015 Tom Quilty committee presented their proposal and credentials at the July AERA meeting and were awarded the event, congratulations to Neil, Ron and the team.

From all reports the committee has jelled and is forging ahead.

Track Preservation Report

The bureaucratic process continues to roll forward slowly, with the Plan of Management amendments for Garigal NP to reopen specific trails, and Kosciuszko, Deua and Mummel Gulf NPs, to allow horse riding in wilderness areas on nominated routes, going to the NPW Advisory Council for comment in the second week of October. To make sure that the wilderness trial in Kosciuszko can start this summer and does not have to wait another year, NPWS called an extraordinary meeting of the Council mainly to discuss these amendments rather than wait for the next scheduled meeting and delay the commencement.

The amendments for other two Sydney parks, Marramarra and Ku-ring-gai Chase NP, are taking a little longer but the changes are likely to be quicker to implement once they are approved.

Meanwhile around the state the eight "priority regions" are taking steps towards fulfilling the horse riding workplans set for them for this financial year. For example, in Wollemi NP (Q60 territory) horse riders will be doing a lot of bushwalking this summer as we help NPWS staff investigate reopening disused bridle trails and create new link tracks between management trails.

At a recent meeting with TQ15 course planners and the NPWS Area Manager for Parr State Recreation Area about trails in the Colo Heights and Webbs Creek area, the proposed course received full co-operation and encouragement.

I will aim to have a complete update from around the state for you at the AGM in February.

Tie Up Your Dogs

Riders are responsible for the behaviour of their support crews and friends. This extends to dogs associated with their camp, which must be restrained at all times, either on a lead or secured in a float or vehicle.

The Chief Steward may disqualify a rider if that riders' support crew causes disruption detrimental to the running of the ride. Refusal to restrain a dog (of any size) after being requested to do so by the Chief Steward, or an official of the Organising Ride Committee, may also lead to disqualification of the rider.

From Sydney or South NSW

Take the Sydney to Newcastle expressway and follow it right to the end. At the roundabout, turn right and follow the Pacific 'Highway 1' signs, and left over the Hexham bridge. (CAUTION: when you come to the Raymond Terrace roundabout IGNORE the signs that say "Barrington Tops Via Dungog"! Drive straight through the roundabout staying on the Pacific Highway for 20km past the Raymond Terrace roundabout, and turn Left onto the Buckets Way towards Stroud (Gloucester and Barrington Tops). The turn off to Riverwood Downs is on your left, 17kms after the township of Stroud. Do watch for the turn off as it comes rather quickly if travelling at highway speeds. Then just follow the signs 8kms of gravel road to Riverwood Downs.

From Northern NSW

Riverwood Downs is situated between Dungog and Gloucester. Coming from the North, it depends whether you intend to travel on the New England or Pacific Highways. If you are on the New

England Highway, you turn off the Highway at Singleton and proceed through Gresford to Dungog and then on the road to Stroud. You can turn left onto Monkerai Rd about 5 kms further on from Dungog and follow Monkerai Road to Riverwood Downs - There is about 17 kms of gravel road through the Monkerai Nature Reserve.

The other alternative is to continue on the road from Dungog to Stroud, turn left onto the Bucketts Way heading to Gloucester. The turn off to Riverwood Downs is on your left, approximately 15kms from where you make the turn onto the Bucketts Way. Do watch for the turnoff as it comes up pretty quickly if you are travelling at highway speed. Then just follow the signs approximately 8 kms of gravel road in to Riverwood Downs's gateway.

If you are travelling on the Pacific Highway, turn right at Nabiac to Krambach. At Krambach turn left onto the Bucketts Way to Gloucester. From Gloucester, head South for about 35 kms towards Newcastle. You will pass through the villages of Stratford, Craven and Wards River and will find the turn to Monkerai on your right about 5kms South of Wards River. Do watch for the turn off as it comes up rather quickly if you are travelling at highway speed. Then just follow the signs 8km of gravel road in to Riverwood Downs.

Proposal for NSW ERA to donate \$1 (one dollar) from every entrant in NSW ERA affiliated events of 80km or greater (excluding FEI) to Riding for the Disabled Association (RDA) NSW, initial period of 5 years.

Rationale:

My late parents, Lyn and Adrian Bailey, were very passionate about helping out those less fortunate than themselves, the annual Mud Hut training ride was run for over 10 years with all profits being donated to RDA Ryde Branch and the annual Careflight endurance ride a similar event with all profits being donated to NRMA Careflight.

In honour of my parents efforts I would like to see NSW ERA take up where they left off and give something back to the horse riding community and those less fortunate than us.

From the information presented at 2013 AGM the total number of Endurance ride entries for 2012 was 1620, it would be a similar amount by the end of 2013, in fact using your figures the largest number of entries over past 5 years was 1938 in 2010 (possibly a larger number due to Tom Quilty being held in NSW that year), on the whole the figure is between 1500 and 2000, RDA have advised us that it costs them approximately \$1200 to keep each horse per year.

Riding for Disabled NSW has been in operation since 1972 and does not really receive the funding that say the Cancer Council does. We have pink ribbon days, white ribbon days, daffodil days, movember, red nose days etc but what about the smaller quieter not for profit organisations such as RDA who do so much for so little in return.

I do not believe in making this proposal a 'tick a box' on the membership renewal form either, lets face it how many of us would actually 'tick the box' to donate a measly dollar to the RDA, most of us SAY we will but in reality it probably wouldn't amount to much.

I am also not asking that Ride Organisers have to raise ride entry fees to cover this nor do I expect them to make out a cheque to RDA once their event has been completed, rather I would like to see NSW ERA in conjunction with RDA organise a presentation day/evening where a cheque is presented, say at the end of the year, make it a public relations win win situation for both parties involved, get photos, put it in newsletters and on websites, (donations of \$2 or more are tax deductible – not sure if this applies to NSW ERA but could be investigated).

I believe this to be a positive initiative for NSW ERA, if promoted correctly it would go a long way to raising our profile within the community, it would expel those myths that surround our sport and last but not least it's for a good cause.

SHAHZADA 2013 – The 33rd Shahzada.....

The 33rd Shahzada was run in the last week of August in the most perfect weather in the MacDonald Valley north west of Sydney with 58 horses and riders from all over Australia covering 80kms a day for five days from the ride base in St Albans up and down the legendary tracks Johnny Brown's Hill, Lyndrian, Shepherd's Gully, Boyd's, Prestons, Gotches, McKechnie's, Derwent's and of course, The Steps.

The Shahzada could not run without the wonderful volunteers who were there up to ten days prior to the ride to help the Committee erecting tents and gazebos, clearing campsites, putting water up in those mountains, marking the course, sorting out pumps and water in base and staying on to TPR, time keep, help in the office and pencil for the vets.

The fastest time of 34.29 hours for the 400 kms was a three way tie this year with Talea Hasko-Stewart on Blake's Heaven Bombora, Fia Hasko-Stewart on Wantley Kaliph and Ian Curtis on Blake's Heaven Summer Reign. Five horse and rider combinations were called up for the Best Conditioned/Best Managed Horse award - Cherry Cummins on Winter Hill Alice, Gail Fisher on Arasarta Narhalinian, Emma Fletcher on Diamond R Oscar, Stella Harbison on Brechenridge Attitude and John Howe on Ashbend Perazzi with John and "Ears" taking out the prestigious award – a huge trophy and rug. There were 34 completions which included four Juniors – earning a Shahzada buckle in recognition of this amazing achievement.

The Halifax Hayes 'Fit & Well Award' was presented to Karen Anderson on Malleegrove Samsara.

The Newscom Award for first time horse and rider combination went to Rob Vlaanderen on Talunga Park Byjaryja who also received the Tail End Award which is one of the awards donated by the Knihinicki family.

The other awards - the oldest rider to complete was Thomas Hermann on TTH Headliner, the youngest was Cybele Coddington on Burren-dah Narla who, along with Tayla Warren on Warren Park O.B. One, received the Steve Locke Memorial Award and together with Shantel Nagle on Windradyne Ballerina and Georgia Curry on Macquarie Park Shafeeq also won the Teams event sponsored by D-Lua Park Saddle Cloths. The rider who travelled furthest was Melissa Longhurst on Pioneer Park Amurra who is pictured here with Julie Brooks and Aloha Byshara as they came over the finish line.

Cybele Coddington on Burren-dah Narla, Tayla Warren on Warren Park O.B. One, (received the Steve Locke Memorial Award) together with Shantel Nagle on Windradyne Ballerina and Georgia Curry on Macquarie Park Shafeeq won the Teams event sponsored by D-Lua Park Saddle Cloths



There were 76 entrants including one entrant from Malaysia and one from the USA in the Mini Marathon which was held over three days of 40kms per day and gave riders and horses the opportunity to get the taste of marathon riding with the idea that they will take up the challenge next year and attempt the 400 km Shahzada.....60 riders were successful.

Shahzada is put together by a small committee and a large number of dedicated volunteers – thank you to everyone involved in the success of the 2013 Shahzada.

Bahrain Comes to Putty

Sunday 13 October saw the running of the Putty Endurance Weekend held at Putty. A total of 109 horses and riders entered various events over the weekend.

The weekend included the running of the 2nd Annual FEI 1* Bahrain Challenge 80 kilometre and a new event the FEI 2* 120 kilometre endurance ride, as well as the Putty endurance ride over 80 kilometres and the 120 kilometre Zone One Championship.

On Sunday there were 17 in the Social Ride with 12 completing, 26 in the Training Ride with 25 completing, 31 in the Putty 80k event with 20 completions, 12 in the 120k Zone Championship with 9 completing.

In the Bahrain Challenge 1* there was 1 entry in the Youth Division who was successful, in the Open Division 9 completed from 10 starters. In the 2* event again there was 1 entry in the Youth who was successful and 8 in the Open from 11 starters.

The challenging course ran over roads and tracks through private property and country lanes in horrendous weather conditions with hot dry winds up to 40 kilometres an hour causing chaos at the ride base and creating dust storms and temperatures hitting 37 degrees.

In the Bahrain Challenge 120k the Youth Division the winner was Talea Hasko-Stewart riding Blakes Heaven Angelico in a time of 11:05:10 who also won Best Conditioned. The Open Division winner was Jenny Annetts riding Littlebanks Dizzy in a time of 9:08:24 who was followed over the finish line 46 seconds later by 2nd placed rider Ian Curtis riding Blakes Heaven Summer Reign. Third place went to local rider Emma McCormack riding Twynham El Nasiriyah in a time of 9:29:28, Emma also won the Best Managed Award.

The Muster 240/160 elevator 80/35 – 2-7 July 2014.

Greg Moore said Zone One is not happy with the Muster being on the nominated date as it is the traditional date for the Putty Ride. This ride has been constantly moved because the RO has been asked to move to fit in with other rides. We don't want to do move again. Putty would be happy to go one week early.

Two issues: This is the traditional date for the Putty Ride.

Zone One thinks that the Muster will impact on its ride. Manilla could look at another date.

Bago 80/40-60/20 27 July 2014. **Approved**

Q60 – 5th May 2014. **Approved.**

Putty 120/40/20 FEI 1*&2** 13 July 2014. **Approved.**

Coolamon 80/40/20 – 20 July 2014 **Approved**

Kundabung - 29 June 2014. **Approved.**

Bumbaldry – 5 & 6 April 2014 100/40/20. **Approved**

Hendra.

Tom Mc advised what was decided at the AERA meeting. They decided to form a subcommittee to come back with recommendations by 30th September 2013. The committee is to just consider the facts. Leave out the emotions. Talk to the CSIRO, the vaccine manufacturer, the vet association. The subcommittees will report to the AERA which will in turn forward the report to the Division SMCs for their consideration and response.

Tom P said that this committee consists of himself, Mark Grogan from Queensland, Liz Rutherford from WA and Brian Sheahan as the vet. To organize and structure the project the subcommittee has broken it down into a number of key sections for which lines of inquiry and resultant summaries will be documented: the Virus, the vaccine, the host, WH&S, Insurance, etc. These considerations are well in hand.

The virus is difficult to catch. Tom P is to send a link to a website where the virus is discussed at length. There has been one pre clinical horse. Live or dead Hendra virus plays no part in the manufacture of the vaccine. The key component is a synthesized protein. The horse cannot get Hendra from the vaccination. Twelve month trial course is underway. Discussing a people vaccine. Debra Middleton says that a human vaccine is 10 to 20 years away. No incentive for a drug company to get involved in this.

Discussing insurance and the liability of the vets. What happens if we mandate vaccination and a horse dies, who is responsible? Asked the insurance company where the Association stands. Answers still to come.

Brian Sheehan has discussed the matter with QLD WorkCover. NSW Workcover seems to be following the Qld line.

The feedback page has had 27 replies falling into two categories. One group for and one group against.

Tom Mc advised on the current position regarding export of horses and vaccinations. Hong Kong has lifted their ban on vaccinations. Now discussing this with the UAE.

Brief discussion on Hendra vaccination at Shahzada and the requirements for this to take place.

Vet accreditation course.

Steve Roberts tabled this. Five vets attended the course that he ran recently. They received CD's with basics and other necessary information. Want to get the DVD on line so it becomes multi purpose. Chris Pollitt has agreed to be involved as the DVD needs to be updated as it was originally done on tape and needs to be transferred to a DVD when updated. Email sent to AERA enquiring as to what money they will allow for this purpose.

Ride distances.

What can be done when ride distances are greater than what has been advertised?

Background on why problems arise with distances, was discussed. A RO will advertise a certain distance but when they come to measure the course it can be different. This is where problems arise.

Gertraud said that they use Google Earth to work out distances for their rides.

This matter seems to stem from the Harden Ride. This will be discussed later.

Mudgee has its ride listed at 83klm. Manilla has 85klm. If rides were only allowed to be a round 80 klm then this would eliminate the problems with the pointscore.

Resolved: That John Howe examines the rule on distances and will provide a recommendation to the next meeting.

Rider in BC.

Horses being ridden in the BC workout by someone other than the person who rode the horse in the ride, was discussed at length. Discussing the terminology 'under saddle'. We assume it means that the horse be ridden but it isn't stipulated in the rules.

Resolved: Steve Roberts and Tom McCormack will see if they can find something that needs to be put to the AGM to clarify the rule regarding Best Conditioned workouts.

Neil and Ron Males arrived at the meeting at this time.

TQ15 - 50th Anniversary Tom Quilty.

Protocols

Neil said that all is going well. Meeting with the AERA went well. Everything was discussed and all is good. Course is just about set. Need a \$10,000 deposit organized. Written document needs to be prepared to take care of this. Surveyor's fees could be expensive. John to discuss this with Gillian Peirce to see if Angus Tierney is interested in

doing this. Survey needed for the campsite. Roads in and out etc.

Tom Mc handed around a hard copy of the Quilty Agreement which is to be signed by Neil Clarkson and Ron Males on behalf of the TQ15 committee. Tom McCormack as the AERA President and then the AERA Secretary. The document was duly signed.

Tom Mc thanked Neil and Ron on behalf of the AERA and the NSW ERA for putting their hand up to run this 50th anniversary ride. Ron said he feels this will be very special. Feels that we have a good testing course. Peter Bice is working with them on the course design. They have some of the original markers, uses part of the old Quilty Course and takes in part of the Shahzada course. The Hall of Fame have agreed to release the Cup on a national road show to culminate at the TQ15.

2014 State Championships

Neil said that he will see the Hawkesbury Council about this after the Shahzada. Ron and Neil left the meeting at 7.55pm.

AERA Constitution.

Tom McCormack tabled a paper which came from the last AERA meeting.

The first portion of the document related to AERA Ltd wherein the members are the six State Associations. The States to decide how they appoint their people. This is on the basis of one person per 200 members capped at a maximum of three persons per State.

The second section is an AERA National Council. Members are a maximum of 18. Currently it would be 12. One person equals one vote. No block voting. No executive or formal positions within the National Council. They would meet in person once a year for the AERA AGM. The rest of the time they would meet electronically. This Council retains ownership and authority over the Rules and by-laws. The National Council elects the Board of Directors and also has the power to dismiss members of the Board.

The third section is AERA Ltd – Board of Directors. Members equal 6 Directors plus ability to appoint two experts if needed. One person equals one vote. It has a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. There will be no casting vote for the Chairman. A board member cannot be a member of a State SMC or the National Council. Would meet monthly – twice a year in person. The rest electronically. The National Council elects the

Board based on merit therefore no formal State allegiance. Each State can nominate a maximum of three persons for the Board. The Board is responsible for the day to day running of the Sport on a national level. Ec. Tom Quilty, AERASpace, Insurances, EA Affiliation, Websites. Accreditation of Vets. Chief Stewards etc etc.

Tom P took over the discussion at this stage. There was a clause in the Constitution which could be a problem. It is locking in Queensland's version of the Northern Rivers which has never been ratified. Does NSW want to do anything about this?

Discussing how the Northern Rivers Zone came into existence. The understanding in NSW was that riders in this area were able to choose which State they wanted to join as a member. If the proposed clause is locked into the AERA Constitution and administered the way QERA has interpreted it then all people in the area will be locked into being members of Queensland. Tom Mc gave his opinion on why this particular clause was in the proposed Constitution. It was designed by Kerry Spratt and the solicitor involved at the time in order to allow the new Constitution to go ahead and not be scuttled because of the problems between NSW and Queensland over the Northern Rivers area.

Resolved: Tom Perkins will liaise with appropriate parties to amend the proposed Constitution to reflect The Northern Rivers is an area where the individuals who live there, may choose which State they want to be members of.

Annual time line.

John said he has received no input on this. We need an annual calendar of what needs to be done and the time at which it needs to be done. Greg suggested that when this was done, it could be part of the ride calendar.

Resolved: John will follow up on this and prepare a calendar.

John Howe. – Secretary - Correspondence,
The ride calendar is going well.

Secretarial:-Thankfully there are no major problems to deal with.

We do have correspondence from Gay Bonham, Kerry Spratt, Fia Hasko-Stuart and Harden ride, we should be able to deal with these matters relatively quickly.

The new chip details will still need to be verified by a certified vet and the details recorded in that horses logbook. (As per rule H6.2 "identification is by a microchip implant plus certified veterinary ID of same, the details of which will be recorded in the Endurance Horse Logbook for that horse.

" Rule H6.3 states "A microchipped horse must have the certified identification completed in case of microchip reader or microchip failure.")

A Journey Together

I first saw Jasmine in a drought-affected paddock in 2003, a three-month old foal with her mother, sister and a number of very skinny cows and a handful of brood mares. Their owner had sold his property, the stallion, Bremervale Consul, most of his good breeding stock and appeared to have just left the rest to fend for themselves at the foot of Browns Mountain, just outside Nowra. Both the foals looked in reasonable condition considering their environment but the mare was very poor and after some negotiation I was able to purchase all three for \$1500. It took a while but after some good tucker, worming and some TLC, all three started to thrive.

I chose to keep Jasmine for myself as a project and found good homes for both the mare and Jasmine's sister. Fortunately this happened just before my personal world turned upside down. My husband and I separated at this time which started a three year long messy divorce and then, not long after that followed my diagnosis of breast cancer.

Jasmine was broken in as a 2-year-old just before E.I. and proved to be a sharp, sensitive, strong-willed filly and I soon knew she would be handful. I asked a young guy, Ryan Mitchell, who worked with horses, to take her for a few weeks. His programme was to ride Jasmine to work every day through the streets of Albion Park where they would often drop into the McDonalds Drive Through for a feed. It's amazing, to this day Jasmine doesn't bat an eyelid in traffic but if a branch comes down in the bush you would swear there was a tiger behind it. Go figure?

When she came back from Ryan, I was in full swing, building my business, running my 7-acre property and trying to regain my financial stability whilst eagerly planning her training and endurance campaign. Then in 2009 the bombshell of breast cancer dropped. No one can prepare you for a "positive" biopsy result, the turmoil of emotions and the fear that follows. All I can say is, thank goodness for the amazing support that is now available, the unforgettable support of friends and family and from somewhere, an inner strength that just gets you through.

The four year roller-coaster journey with many ups and downs was shared with Jasmine who also

had her own issues to come to terms with.

For me my personal journey with breast cancer started with a lumpectomy in 2010, a spell of reassurance in 2012 followed by a mastectomy in November 2012 and reconstruction in June 2013. During this time I was able to still run my beauty and massage business with the amazing support of my staff and the property was kept up to scratch with the wonderful efforts and encouragement of housemate and dear friend Lynette Elfick.

Tough as it was, I do believe it was my passion for riding and the firm belief that one day I'd ride in endurance again that gave me the strength to keep going.

My first horse was purchased from my brother-in-law's family in Swan Hill and she was a stock horse mare by Cecil Bruce named Celia. Whilst waiting to set up my property, my sister and I decided to breed Celia to a Victorian stallion, Hawkesbury Alpacha, an Arabian who was well known for his good temperament and ride-ability and this resulted in my first endurance horse, Sandalwood.

In 1994, I was introduced to the sport by Ken and Kathy Crittle and it didn't take long before endurance became my passion especially as Sandalwood - beautifully trained by Ken - did such a great job of looking after me in those early days.

Sandalwood went on to successfully complete 34 rides out of 37 of which five were 160s, (two State championships, two Quiltys and a Canberra Challenge) and a Shahzada. In 1999 we represented NSW at the Tasmanian Quilty and that same year was South Coast Zone Champion. Unfortunately a floating accident in 2001 saw the end of Sandalwood's endurance career and after turning his hoof to trail riding and being my daughter's Pony Club horse, he is now retired, living out his days ruling the paddock at home.

After a few attempts to compete with other horses I decided to step up Jasmine's training who was totally different to Sandalwood. Sandalwood, though forward moving and a bit of a character, was a kind, willing and forgiving gelding. Very much the 'girl', Jasmine was bossy, strong-willed and bent on over-achieving. A challenge at every turn!

Jasmine, I later learnt, was suffering from the effects of poor nutrition in her early days and as a result was prone to mood swings, nervous in most environments, tended to over react and became virtually impossible to catch. She had tendon problems, stomach problems and muscle tension from becoming over-stressed and was always anxious whilst away at rides.

Training her was a total frustration that would often have me at my wits' end and forced to make desperate calls to my sister Amanda Hocking, an EA NCAS Level 2 coach and a very accomplished horse woman and competitive dressage rider. Through Amanda's knowledge and coaching Jasmine started to respond positively in negative situations and I began to gain confidence in my ability to ride her through her problems.

Slowly I started to see her ability and potential for endurance. Though we were still having problems with her hind tendons, sensitive stomach, muscle tension and being caught, Brad Innes, my farrier and equine massage therapist, was improving her movement, soundness and muscular flexibility. Also his wealth of knowledge with endurance horses was proving to be invaluable.

But it was when Amanda introduced me to Lucy Prior at Gotcha Equine and I started Jasmine on her excellent vitamin and mineral supplements created for problem horses and took her advice on grazing and diet that I started to see real improvement in Jasmine's moods, emotions, health and wellbeing.

The last hurdle was her over-achieving and stress at rides and it was Bruce Carter and his lovely mare Zara who came to the rescue. We started to train together and Bruce said he would ride with us to help me get Jasmine through her next few rides.

As I started to heal with the help from my Breast Care team, cancer support groups, friends and family, so it seemed Jasmine was healing too, with the help and knowledge from Amanda, Brad, and Lucy and of course the support of Bruce and Zara.

Then in September this year, it all came together I got the all clear from my oncologist and Jasmine successfully completed the 80k ride at Woodstock. You can also imagine how moved I was to be presented, along with my buckle, the LERC encouragement award by the Woodstock ride committee. This acknowledgment meant so much to me.

Well, the encouragement award must have worked as at our very next ride, the 80k at Brookvale, Jasmine and I won first Lightweight and Bruce and Zara first Middleweight.

Jasmine, in her first ride out of Novice, went on to win fittest horse and the Allen Blundell memorial Trophy for first horse over line with all straight As at the vet check.

To every cloud, even cancer, there is a silver lining and to every challenge a chance to learn and grow. Jasmine has taught me so much about tolerance, courage and persistence.

My journey with cancer has made me realise that life is about living not dying and that every day is a blessing.

I am so lucky to have two amazing animals - Jasmine and Sandalwood - gracing my paddocks today, so very different and yet so very much alike and I'm sure I'm not the first person or will be the last who found strength and courage through their horses.

This year, ACTERA turned on the championships for the Snowy Zone. Brookvale looked a picture on the October long weekend, one huge green lawn dotted with glossy black cattle and a flowing creek.

Sixty three brave souls ventured into the mountains for a challenging ride through one of NSW most beautiful National Parks - Brindabella. But to get those stunning views, you have to take the high road!





There was something for everyone, a four-leg 120 km championship ride, an 80 km ACTERA ride, a two-leg 50km trainer ride and a 20km introductory ride.

No vet outs in the introductory ride and even in the 50 and 80 km rides, withdrawal or timed out were as or more common than vet-outs, so horses were being looked after on the testing course that did not lend itself to record times over the respective distances.

In the 80 km ride, first across the line were Bruce Carter on Dasharm Zayesha (MWT) and Wendy Jesson (LWT) on Star Jasmine, both in the time of 8:18 h.

Wendy later also took out the Alan Blundell Memorial Trophy for best-managed horse in an ACTERA endurance ride. First place

in the HWT division was shared by Alan and Mark Lindsay on their home-bred horses Kintamani Silver Motif and Kintamani Jaffah, both completing the course in a time of 8:48.

Twenty one riders started out on the 120 km course and 11 completed successfully, making a completion rate of only 52.4%. This reflected the challenging course that incorporated substantial climbs in the first two legs and combined with an equally challenging period of heat in the middle of the day. This almost fried those who had taken it easy on the first leg and now had to climb most of the second hill in full sun. Luckily, a cool change arrived later in the afternoon, enabling all successful horse and rider combinations to complete the course much earlier than expected and before dark.

Line honours went to Vetea Facchini (LWT) on Trigger in 8:51 h, closely followed by Talea (MWT) and Fia (LWT) Hasko-Stewart on Blake's Heaven Bombora and Wantley Kaliph, respectively, in 9:08 h. Next across the line was Marty Moran (HWT) with his stallion Jelignite Jack, followed by the only successful junior, Georgia Curry on Blake's Heaven Venus.

The 120km championship course and the 15 hour completion time made for a Monday BC workout and presentation for the Snowy Zone Championship. Marty's, Talea's, Vetea's and Georgia's horses took home the best-conditioned rugs and with Jelignite Jack, for the second time in succession a grey stallion was awarded the Chris Walker Memorial Trophy for fittest horse to continue.

A huge thank you to all the 40 selfless volunteers, the dedicated vets and the cherished chief steward who each put in even more than usual this year due to the length of the course. A very special mention also for the truly awesome Kim Stephens from Snowy Zone who kept that computer on task all weekend and taught the ropes to a number of admin tent newbies! This ride could not have happened without the contribution of each one of you!

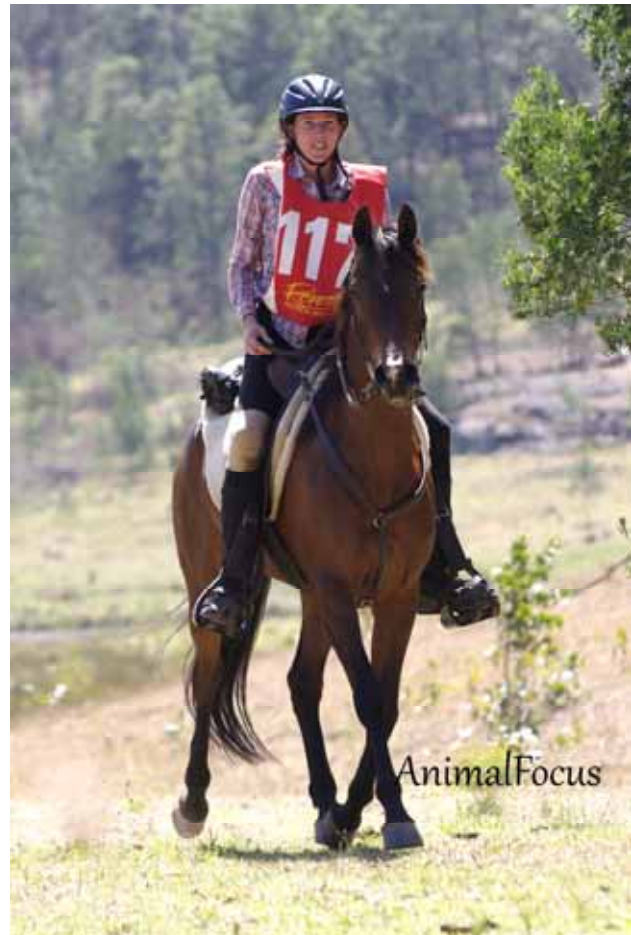

Ride Bases Map

The NSWERA Web page now has a Google map with 'Find it' features that will show the distribution of ride bases through NSW and provide a map with directions from your home to the ride base.

To access the map just go to **www.nswera.asn.au**. When you get there just click on the "NSW Ride Base Map" towards the top of the screen.

To use the map: -

- Click on the ride base in the list on the left.
- A text box will pop up near the flag for the ride base.
- Click on get directions 'to here'.
- Enter your hometown in the start address.

Click 'GO' and print off the map and directions.

If you have a navigator in your vehicle the map coordinates are shown in the text box, but a word of caution when using a navigator to go to a map grid reference, navigators are programmed to find the most direct route (as the crow flies), and as you get close to your destination they sometimes want to turn you down a side road or even a forest trail.

Ride organisers

To have a ride base added to the map,

1. Go to Google on the internet.
2. Select 'Maps' from the menu bar at the top.
3. With a map of Australia showing.
4. the curser (a little hand) on the area you're interested in, right click and select 'Center map here'.
5. Slide up the scale ladder a little.
6. Repeat 4&5 until you have zoomed in on the area.
7. Now select 'Satellite' to see an overhead picture of the area.
8. Put the 'Little Hand' on the gateway to the ride base, right click and select 'Directions from Here'.
9. A green flag will appear at the spot and a 'Get directions' box will appear in the top left corner.
10. If the flag is not quite right, click and drag it.
11. In the 'Get directions' box against flag 'A' will be the map grid reference for the spot chosen, it will look like (-30.294007,147.498579)
12. Jot down that reference with the ride name and email it to me at 'vpe63190@bigpond.net.au'.

To check we have located the marker correctly, or if the ride base has been moved, zoom in on your marker on the Ride Bases Map as described above, switch to Satellite and check the position of the marker. If it is in error follow the procedure above and email me the details.

Also run some tests approaching your ride base from different directions and note any anomalies, see the Shahzada text box for an example.

So, keep in touch with your sport through www.nswera.asn.au. You'll get a surprise at the amount of information on there for you. Remember, this is your website, so stories, photos and articles of interest are always a welcome addition.

NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b)) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.

Transfer of Ownership Procedures

It is the responsibility of the purchaser of the horse to notify the State of the change in ownership details. It is important that the correct person be registered as the owner of the horse as this assists with the correct allocation of National and State distance and pointscore awards as well as identifying the persons responsible for the horse when disciplinary actions need to be instituted.

Process for Changing Ownership Details

When a sale of a horse occurs and the horse has had a logbook issued it is the responsibility of the new owner to notify the State of the change of ownership. A transfer of ownership form must be completed and forwarded to the State, together with a cheque for \$11 and the logbook.

Once the transfer of ownership form is received the logbook can be amended with the change in owners and the transfer verified by the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Procedure for Recording Change of Ownership

Transfer of ownership forms are to be made readily available to all members, preferably through the State Newsletters or upon application to the Logbook Secretary/Registrar.

Once a logbook, transfer of ownership form and fee are received the Logbook Secretary/Registrar will:

1. Record the ownership transfer into the logbook.
2. Verify the transfer.
3. Return the logbook.
4. Record the ownership transfer into the computer records of the State Division.
5. Keep a copy of the ownership transfer form and forward the original to the AERA Registrar.
6. Forward the \$5 fee to AERA.
