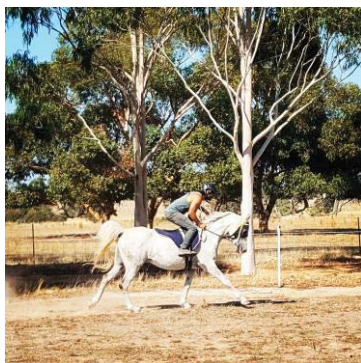

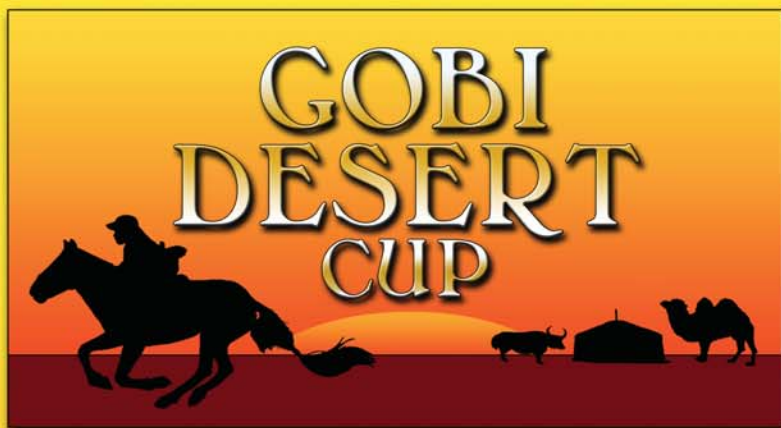

Thanks to the Lachlan Endurance Riders Club crew for organising the venue and Sonya Ruprecht for all your work preparing for the meeting and presentation.

Next year, the AGM will be held on 17 February, probably in Windsor. Stay tuned for more details, but put the date in your diary, it's a week later than usual so we have enough time to get the necessary information to everyone.

Speaking of awards, if you or your horse are already eligible for AERA lifetime distance awards:

- 3000km, 5000km, 6500km, 8000km and 10 000km for horses, and
- 20 000km, 25 000km and 30 000km for people,

please contact Jo Bailey ASAP, and complete the form that's in the newsletter and on the AERA webpage. Jo's details are on the form, if you can't find it please contact me (details also in the newsletter). If you achieve any of these milestones before 31 May 2017, please also let Jo know and send the form. It would be great if we can know ASAP so we can get the awards organised for the South Australian Tom Quilty. **The cut off will be 31 May 2017.**

As you probably know, several motions were put to the AGM to make changes to our Constitution. One motion related to postal and electronic voting, and this motion was lost. At the AGM, the Committee undertook to present a motion to next year's AGM about whether or not we will use postal and/or electronic voting, and if so, how. Before we can decide on the best option, we need your opinion on this. Please talk to one of the Committee with your ideas and any questions. We'll run a survey later in the year too. Thanks.

A very exciting project this year, is the support we have from MAXXIS Tyres which will result in:

- a set of 500 MAXXIS ride bibs that can be used by Clubs (thanks Steve Broadbent)
- film footage that will be used to create TV advertisements and instructional segments for DVDs and social media, and
- an information booklet for new participants.

This project is being run by Emily Streckfuss, Bec Hogan, Renee Kirk and yours truly with fantastic support from John Dawson. Sincere thanks to everyone involved!

Thanks to Greg Moore, NSWERA has received a Sports Development Grant of \$25 000 from the NSW Office of Sport. This will allow us to run events in various locations, to educate and encourage participation by new riders, and to hold courses for our officials, amongst other things.

We will need help from ride committees and others with this project, please. We have a subcommittee led by Jacque Wright to oversee the project and Jacque will be making contact with some of you about this soon. 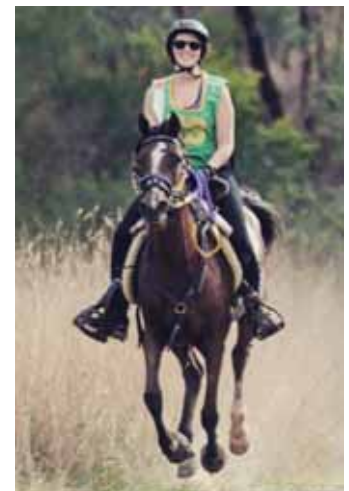
*What do you do on the committee? (no more than 200 words please)*

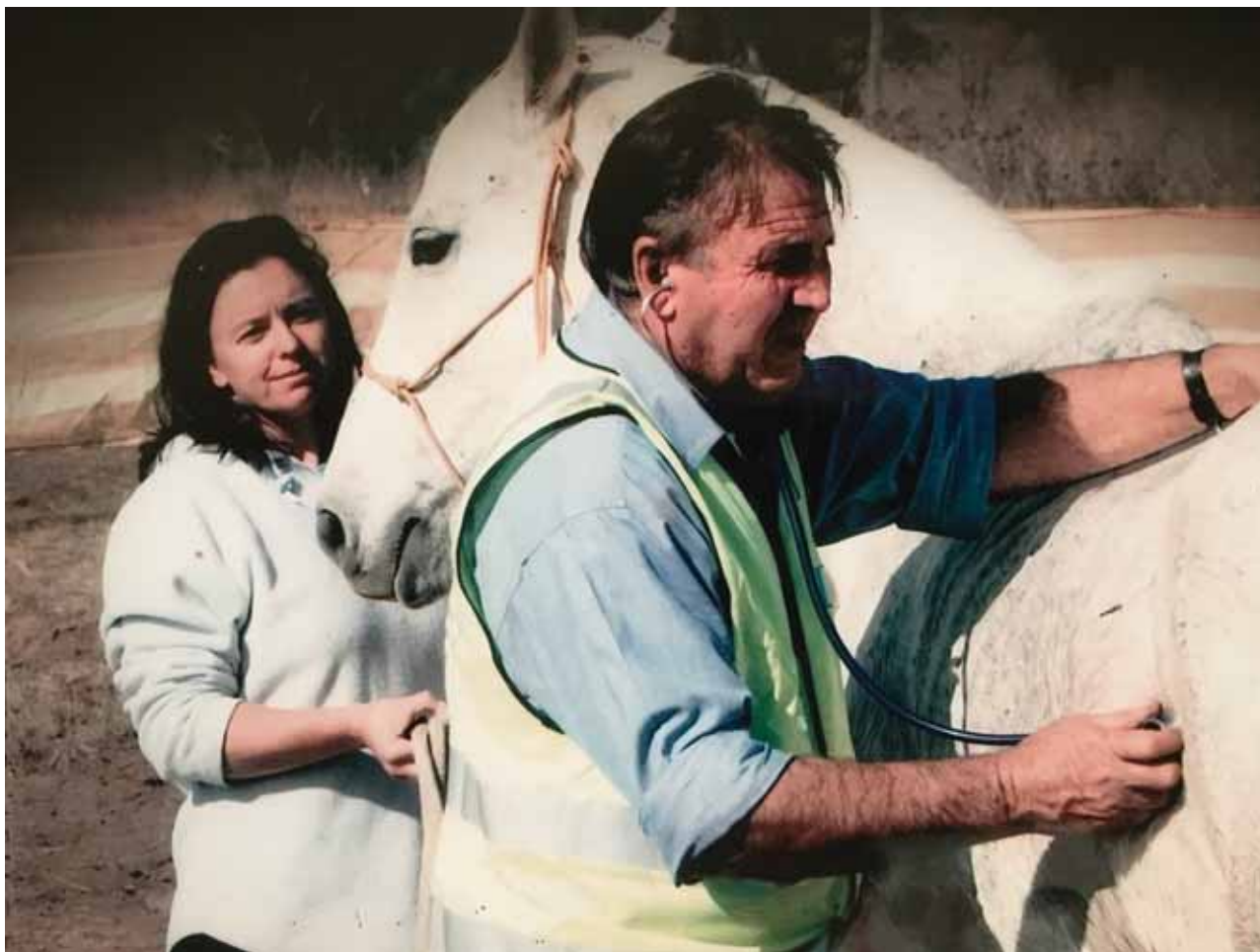

**If travelling from a Hendra risk area and HEV vaccinated:**

- 1 Current vaccination certificate
- 2 10 day Horse Health Declaration and temperature log

## Notice

***Dogs must be restrained at all times.***

Due to dogs being found running loose in increasing numbers at endurance events, it has been resolved that riders are to be disqualified, if their own dog or a dog belonging to their camp is found not to be restrained at all times during the full duration of an endurance event, i.e. from the opening of the ride base to participants until its closure. All chief stewards have been instructed to take action, enforce this rule and report offenders. A 'no dogs' policy may be introduced, if offences against this rule continue to occur.

**NSW ERA Management Committee**



Please read through the document below. There are important changes to the document previously published.

## **The Use of Horse Health Declarations (HHD) for Riders and Ride Organisers. Version 2.**

NSWERA supports and promotes the principles and practices of the management of infectious diseases. This requires the fulfilment of certain obligations prior to and during the ride by -

### **a) people in charge of the horse**

- all horses or livestock entering grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management,
- are expected to be aware of their biosecurity obligation, and that they must take all reasonable steps to ensure their activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant,

### **and b) ride organisers**

- prevent the spread of infectious disease, and to track any person or animal that may have been potentially exposed during the event. All ROCs should be conversant with and promote those principles and procedures.

These are found in the AERA Biosecurity Statement.

### ***For riders:***

The AERA Biosecurity Statement declares that Horse Health Declarations are now mandatory for **all horses at all rides**.

The following actions are required of the person responsible for each horse –

- Name and contact details of the person who is responsible for each horse when it arrives at the ride base, and the duration of the event.
- Full details of your horse identity and property of origin, including PIC. If any horse is returning to a location other than its property of origin, provide the details of this property prior to departure from the event venue (<http://www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/animals-and-livestock/nlis/pic>)
- Proof of current vaccination if your horse is vaccinated against Hendra virus. Accepted proof is a vaccination certificate or notation in the horses' logbook completed by the vet who administered the vaccine or scanned microchip by the Chief Steward, Biosecurity Manager, or Head Vet and compliant in the Hendra Vaccine registry <https://health4horses.com.au/About/Hendra-Vaccination-Lookup/>
- A properly completed Horse Health Declaration (including PIC code) to accompany every horse entering the ride base, and to have it easily accessible for collection on arrival at the ride venue. The declaration states that the horse is healthy to the best of the responsible person's knowledge, includes a temperature log for the stipulated number of days prior to arrival at the ride venue and subsequently, until the pre ride veterinary check. DO NOT bring an unwell horse onto the ride base.
- The HHD is to be completed by the person in charge of the horse using one horse per form – NO electronic copies – and is to accompany the horse (and its logbook if the horse has one) in the towing vehicle. Paper copies will **only** be accepted, as these are attached to the entry form for later examination if required.

## **No HHD form No Ride.**

### ***For Ride Organising Committees:***

The NSWERA SMC requests that ride committees should abide with the following guidelines for the management of the Horse Health Declaration (HHD):

### ***Prior to the event-***

- The AERA Biosecurity Statement details the number of days the HHD is to be taken -
  - \* 10 day temperature logs for non-vaccinated horses in Hendra Risk Zones and
  - \* 3 day logs for vaccinated horses in those areas.
  - \* 3 day logs for horses in all other areas **except**
  - \* a non-vaccinated horse from a Hendra Risk Zone comes into those other areas it requires a 10 day temperature log.

- The exception to this is the TQ and FEI rides where then Head Vet and Biosecurity Manager can decide on the temperature log period.
- Please ensure all riders are aware of the requirements of the HHD for **all** horses entering the ride base is advertised.
- The HHD is to be completed by the person in charge of the horse using one horse per form – NO electronic copies – and is to accompany the horse (and its logbook if the horse has one) in the towing vehicle.
- The Biosecurity Manager will decide if the HHD is to be taken at the point of entry to the ride base or at ride entry, depending on the origin of horses attending the event.
- If the HHD is to be collected at the ride base entry, check with the Head Vet the temperature parameters that s/he wishes to be notified of, usually greater than 38.5°.
- Ensure a quarantine/isolation zone is suitably situated. The guidelines and procedures for this area are to be strictly followed. See the AERA Biosecurity Statement.

***At ride entry-***

- The HHD is attached to the rider entry form. Both forms are to be kept for 6 months. (If the forms are taken at the entry gate, the HHD is sighted and checked by personnel and attached later.)
- The rider entry form must provide the person responsible for each horse.
- Ensure PIC codes are supplied on the HHD.
- Please check if the horse is returning to a location other than its property of origin, and ensure the details of this property are provided before departing the event.
- Crayons for horse identification or green ribbons (proven current Hendra Vaccination) may be required by the RO/CS and will be provided by the ROC.

### Business arising from last meeting (action log review) Updates in bold

#### Older Action items 2016

Allana has been contacted regarding the charges to pursue this matter. We need to confirm whether there will be legal fees. Simon is pursuing the vet panel regarding the EWS guidance. We need a protocol for future AGMs, John will progress this. Kerry asked that a template be developed for the AGM booklet itself.

#### Meeting 9 December 2016

Emily suggests a continuing education course for vets. Alam noted that attendance at the Chief Stewards workshop was disappointing, suggesting that attendance should be mandatory in future. There is an equestrian sports website where event calendars can be shared. Talea will take care of this, liaising with Adeline and Belinda.

#### 2017 AGM (11 February 2017).

Emily will not be at the AGM because she is riding in the President's Cup, and offered her sincere apologies. Alam will chair the AGM. If not on the SMC, Emily would like to stay on the Maxxis Tyres project subcommittee. The SMC wished Emily luck for the ride. All emailed proxies will be acknowledged, if not acknowledged, people must assume Kerry didn't receive it.

There is a motion regarding changing the constitution to limit terms on the SMC. Several current smc members would need to resign because the change would be effective from its acceptance by Fair Trading.

Another motion relating to postal and electronic voting. As members do we want this? The NSW model constitution says this is at the discretion of the committee. Emily mentioned possible conflicts of interest by SMC members with some motions. Opinion expressed that all SMC members should have a right to vote on the motions as members.

Noted that the model constitution applies for

clauses not included in our Constitution. Kerry to supply a copy of the model constitution to the SMC.

#### State Champs 2017

We will probably know on 21 January whether LERC will hold the State Champs. Windeyer will hold a 160 on the June long weekend. If LERC don't host the State Champs, Windeyer could be a possibility. #### AERA meeting

Nothing much to add since the report given last meeting. Mention of Hendra zones (as per DPI) and whether adjoining areas should be included in the AERA and 2017 Tom Quilty Biosecurity Plans. The AERA bio security plan talks about areas where Hendra has been and adjoining zones. Noted bats will travel 200km in a day and hold the virus for an unknown time. Horses going to the SA Quilty from Hendra areas will need to be vaccinated against Hendra unless they spend enough time immediately before the event outside these zones.

John mentioned the problems Sonya has with AERAspace in preparing the mailing list for the AGM booklet. Addresses need to be recorded differently.

### **Promotions (Adeline)**

We need to promote intermediate membership. The internet is a good way to do this, which Adeline is working on.

### **Payment of Chief Stewards: Alam and Belinda**

Suggestion by Alam that we need to make a payment to Chief Stewards because they have a lot of responsibility at a ride. Vets are paid a fee and it keeps going up. If we paid CSs, they would be employees, with insurance implications. Vets are paid honorariums, they are not paid employees. Alam thinks payment should be at least fuel. Some ROs are not even providing accommodation. There is a need for guidelines, particularly to help new ROs who may be unsure of what is required. Belinda considers travel expenses, food and basic accommodation would be enough. John agreed. Prepaid nominations are needed.

Consensus is that fuel should be paid. We need to recognize that we have problems with some CSs not doing what they are supposed to, for example paperwork. Extreme solution could be removal of accreditation.

The Ride Organisers' Handbook was supposed to be sent out to ROs but didn't go to all. Version of 29 May edited by Adeline is current. **Resolved** that Belinda puts together guidelines for reimbursement of Chief Stewards and sends to the SMC. Add visiting ride secretary remuneration to this as well.

### **RDA donation (motion to the AGM)**

The money isn't available to donate. Noted extra fees payable to the AERA which has increased affiliation fees. The rider fee has increased from \$1 to \$2 and now to \$3. John says that if we set this precedent with regard to the RDA then we will have other charities wanting to get involved. From the Ride for Pegasus, there were no fees paid to NSW ERA, only day membership which goes to the insurance company.

### **MOVED**

John Howe, Peter Bice

### **THAT**

at this point NSW ERA is not in a financial position to make a donation to the RDA.

### **Carried**

Unanimous

Noted that the Bago ride is run for the RDA and the affiliation fees are paid to NSW ERA. This ride still makes money for the RDA. Consensus that there is no need to give our affiliation fees to the RDA. The Association cannot afford to pay other organisations.

### **Emily Streckfuss –President, Ride Standards, Tyremax Project**

Emily was disappointed with the Intermediate Award being changed to just a novice award, feeling it was watered down, taking away from what she believes was the intention of the award: Giving intermediate riders something to aim for.

Adeline believes there is now a completely different award from what she intended and proposed.

Adeline set rules that we voted on originally. These appear to have been changed without her knowledge at the last meeting, to a completely new set of rules.

Kerry said she was involved in changing the criteria and has driven this. Adeline asked for the rules on what constitutes a novice rider, for the purpose of this award. Kerry said that at the end of the ride, a summary report in Aeraspace will give this information. Kerry said that at Windeyer, without the novice criteria she used, we would have had a list of well-known endurance riders eligible for the award. SMC members present, the Chief Steward and the Ride Organisers discussed this at the ride and changed the criteria. This resulted in 4 novice riders, including the young daughter of one of the previously selected experienced riders.

Emily said she never wanted this award to go to novices, the award is about trying to change the perception of endurance riders about intermediate riders. It was to be something for novice riders to aim for. Adeline said she thinks the trophy should have been a lot smaller if the award was to go to novice riders. She did not vote for a novice award and is not comfortable for a presentation to the vet and a prize of this level to novice riders. That is not what she proposed, perceived or voted on. The whole idea of the award has been changed.

Talea: Is this to be an encouragement award or was it something to aim for? Aim to be better was the intention. This is what she thought the award was to be for. Emily said this was voted on for a trial period of six months.

Noted that LERC and some other people have said that they don't want to be part of the Intermediate Rider award.

Emily said that Intermediate riders do not feel valued by the endurance community which is what we need to change. Alam gave an impassioned speech on the subject of 40km rides.

**Peter and Anne left the meeting at 10:07.**

#### **Alamdar Dastani – Vice President and International**

South Africa exchange proposal: The document now says 'NSW Endurance Organisation' as opposed to the national body. Deadline for nomination will be in March. Hoping for 10 riders to be nominated. The organiser is excited to make this offer and looks forward to positive feedback. Ride scheduled for around 4, 5 and 6<sup>th</sup> July 2017, 200 km over three days. We are obliged to reciprocate what's being offered. We should keep records of what is received and therefore what is to

be put back, as our duty.

This opportunity needs to be published on the net. The riders must fund their trip, fees likely to be around \$4000. NSW ERA to supply a team uniform, the SMC should have input into the team and while NSW ERA is enabling the facilitation of this ride, we are not involved in who participates.. There should be a written agreement with the riders. If riders either can't or won't reciprocate with a horse, then they should not be given preference to be part of the team. Emily said she has a problem with "Team Australia" in the document, it needs to be something like "Team NSW Australia".

Expressions of interest to go to Alam. We need a selection criteria in case we have over 10 nominations. Discussing character requirements, noting EA has a code of conduct that we could use.

**Resolved:** Alam to prepare a draft selection criteria, send it around, and change the wording to reflect 'NSW' not Australia.

#### **John Howe – Treasurer, Ride Calendar and Zone 2 delegate.**

As we were running low on funds, last Monday, I transferred the balance of one of our term deposits, due to mature 7.1.2017 of \$15,000.00 plus interest, to our operating account.

Subsequently we have a current balance of \$23,485.11 in our cheque account; however, 2 cheques for \$3,361.52 to the AERA and \$1,302.06 to Equestrian Australia are yet to be presented. This will leave a balance of \$18,821.53.

Today Sonya has banked a cheque for \$1,260.00 being the ride affiliation fees from the Windeyer ride. When this clears we will have a balance of \$20,081.53. The only outstanding money owed to NSWERA is the ride fees from Burruga ride. As there were 36 in the main ride, we should bank \$1,080.00 in ride affiliation fees.

So:-

Cash on Hand \$20,081.53

I have recently spoken to Steve Swan and he has told me that AERA has increased ride affiliation fees to \$31.00 for adults and \$16.00 for juniors; these are the annual fees and have gone up \$1.00. The ride levy now stands at \$3.00 per rider for 80km rides and above. Considering this "levy" was meant to be a stop gap to assist the AERA with their liquidity problems prior to TQ15, a matter that was solved at the end of TQ15. However, the ride levy that started as \$1.00 has remained and has morphed into \$3.00.

I am extremely concerned re the size of the honorariums paid by the AERA to Treasurer, Secretary etc. and the cost of Electronic timing, AERA space and it's continual "upgrades". I believe that we are going to have to be extremely diligent re our payments to AERA and the way in which AERA expends its income.

Between now and the AGM we will be up for the following major costs, Trophies \$7,078.00, Sonya's

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wages, the AGM band \$1,500.00, Newsletter \$1,200.00. I am sure that besides minor expenses, like meeting costs we should have enough money to get to the AGM, just. However, I believe that on 21.1.2017 a part of the interest bearing deposit due to mature that day should be transferred to the operating account.

I am sorry to be the bearer of such bad news but with 5 rides not running in 2016 and a smaller income stream, our cash reserves have been eroded. However, I believe that the money we have is to be used for the members benefit and the furtherance of the sport and this aim has been fulfilled.

*Ride Calendar:-I have been approached by the Windeyer club who wish to run a Quilty qualifier ride on the June Long weekend., featuring a 160km ride, and 80, 40, 20 km events. I have requested a written ride booking form.. Windeyer has also asked that as they are putting on a ride that has been requested by the membership i.e. a Quilty qualifier ride, NSWERA contribute the fees for a Head Vet for this ride.*

*I have volunteered to be Chief Steward and the committee would be extremely grateful to any other members of the NSWERA SMC who could help with the running of this weekend.*

*I have again spoken to Lachlan who is meeting on 21st January; when a firm decision will be made regarding the Woodstock State Championship ride that we hope will be held on the October Long weekend.*

*Thank you for your response to the urgent application from Mudgee to include a standalone 120km ride to be held in conjunction with Mudgee's traditional 80km annual ride.*

*The rest of the ride calendar is filling well. I have spoken to Gulgong who feel that Gulgong will again run later this year as it was so popular in 2016.I shall also speak to other traditional R.Os to gauge their aspirations for 2017.*

#### **Zone Two:-**

*Zone Two is having its AGM on Sat 14th January. Zone Two ran 4 rides in 2016 and will run the same number of events during 2017.First will be the Easter Carnival at Tooraweenah, Mudgee, Gulgong and Windeyer June Long weekend. The extensions to these rides bode well for the Zone, in 2017.*

*Zone Two The Best in the West.*

John expressed his concern about how the national body raised money and how it affects NSW. He said the size of the honorariums paid are a problem. AERA space doesn't work too well and costs heaps. We need to be very careful with what we spend between now and the AGM when memberships come in. Kerry noted that NSW AERA delegates started discussion that decreased the money paid to the AERA secretary.

**MOVED THAT** John Howe, Emily Streckfuss the treasurer's report is accepted and the accounts be paid and that it be

noted in the minutes that the signatories to our account will be Emily Streckfuss, Kerry Spratt, John Howe. James Bannatyne and Sonya Ruprecht to have view access only.

Emily mentioned the Office of Sport grant that we received. Tooraweenah is running a TPR school and needs a CS to run the school. John will try to find someone to do this. There is a lot of Quilty merchandise available. **Resolved** to reduce Quilty merchandise by 50% to move it on. John suggested Mudgee could run a TPR school if Tooraweenah didn't go ahead.

#### **Talea Hasko-Stewart: AERA, Website, Facebook,**

Talea has been away and back in business now. Adeline has made the Facebook page as opposed to the Group. Adeline will do a brief for the web with an update. People need to like the Endurance Facebook page and then it will come up in their feed.

#### **Tony Warren – Horse Welfare and Early Warning**

Emily asked what happened at AERA with EWS with regard to including intermediate rides. We did not think about getting points back and need to rethink this proposal. It is on the list for the AGM.

#### **Simon Bain – Vet Liaison, Biosecurity, AERA IDP**

*Vet liaison, Biosecurity and IDP Report January 2017 SMC meeting*

*There is little to report on the veterinary and biosecurity fronts other than what has been prepared for the 2017 AGM booklet.*

**IDP.** A number of incidents occurred concerning a rider at the Burruga ride late last year. The incidents warranted referral to an Independent Disciplinary Panel (IDP). A 3 person IDP was then formed and have received the Chief Stewards report and a number of witness statements. The relevant inquiry is currently under way.

## **Barriers to progress in the New South Wales Endurance Riders Association**

At the NSWERA Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Cowra on the 11 February an attempt was made to alter the Constitution of the association to increase the overall level of participation of the general membership in the decision making processes of the sport and to ensure renewal in the leadership. To help achieve this, three special resolutions were proposed:

1. That electronic and postal voting be allowed;
2. That the number of proxy votes that any member attending the AGM would be allowed to hold would decline from 5 to 1;
3. That the maximum length of office that any individual would be able to serve on the State Management Committee (SMC) would be 10 years and that no one would be able to serve more than 3 terms (6 years) consecutively.

Unfortunately, all of these motions failed by considerable margins with results in favour being 36, 32 and 31 while those against were 79, 93 and 93 respectively. An SMC member told me the day before the AGM that there would be about 70 proxy voters present at the AGM and given that the total number of votes cast in most of the ballots was about 125, this would agree with the total number of voting members actually present at the Meeting (55 to 60). Two other progressive motions (although non-constitutional) also proposed on the day failed, namely: (a) to initiate a pilot, short distance, non-time limited competition of one horse and one rider, in a team event where one horse/rider combination would complete the first leg of an 80 km ride and the other combination, the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg; (b) that for Rides held for the exclusive benefit of the Riding for the Disabled (RDA), NSWERA forgo the collection of its 'Ride affiliation fee' from participants, so that NSWERA while not making a loss, as insurances would still be mandatory, would not profit from such a Ride.

The failed vote that is most disturbing to me is the first one, the rejection of the installation of electronic and postal voting. The total voting membership of NSWERA is approximately 425, meaning that approximately 20% of members are telling the other 80% that unless they attend the AGM in one way or other, i.e. by either attending in person or having an attendee act as their proxy, they won't be able to vote. The absurdity of this situation though is that even if every attendee at the AGM held their full potential complement of proxies there could have only been about 345 votes potentially cast, meaning that about 80 Association members had no chance of making their voices heard! The naysayers will of course respond by saying, 'Well if you want to change things, why don't you just attend the AGM'. Of course this is always easier said than done, particularly in a State as large as NSW where it can be necessary to travel long distances. In response to the 'naysayers' my response is, 'Why can't we make it easier for everyone who wishes to vote, to do so, by installing postal or electronic voting'? What's wrong with giving all of our members the means to vote?

My question then becomes, in whose interest is it, that it only requires a small proportion of members to direct the Sport? I'll leave this up to you, dear reader to make this judgement. But I'm a person who both believes in democracy and am convinced that it's best when as many people as possible are involved in decision making processes. I can't but help feel that this is an unhealthy situation particularly given the on-going decline that our sport is suffering. I also can't but have the feeling that Clinton Cole and his fledgling competing association would be licking their lips at the unwillingness of NSWERA to reform itself.

Finally, dear 80% of members (you voiceless ones), what do we do to turn this around?

- Attend the AGM next year and make sure you collect as many of your progressive minded friends proxies with as you as possible beforehand to maximise the power of your presence;
- Don't give your proxy away to someone who may not vote the way you want. If you're approached by someone throughout the Year at Rides, as you may well be, who is seeking your Proxy, sound them out on issues that concern you. Find out whether they're progressive or of the thinking, common among those with commercial interests, in maintaining the status quo.

There is unfortunately not much doubt that our Sport is in serious decline. The membership numbers continue their downward trend as do the number of Rides. NSWERA won't go out with a great bang but will just continue to get 'less and less'. Our leadership just 'Doing more of the same' is failing. We need more participation from YOU, the silent (disenfranchised) 80%.

*AERA has released their comprehensive Biosecurity Statement – all Ride Organisers and Chief Stewards should make themselves familiar with it (on the AERA website). From 2017, all horses at all rides will require a Horse Health Declaration to be correctly completed including PIC codes. The new HHD forms are now 1 horse per page so it is easier for ride committees to match the HHD with the entry form.*

*A reminder for owners to fill out the owner ID page in the horses' logbook too, it makes it easier for you (the CS) to ensure the horse can be correctly ID'd.*

*Hardhat standards have changed, so please ensure riders are aware their hardhat complies with the current standards as it may impact on the riders' ability to claim for an accident if is not approved.*

*Protective headgear must conform with one of the current approved safety standards:*

*Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.*

*New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.*

*Current American standard ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked.*

*Current American standard SNELL E2001.*

*Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.*

*Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.*

*There has been discussion for giving recognition to the Chief Steward and the role they play in ensuring ride standards are upheld. There should be guidelines along the lines of appropriate accommodation when required, travel compensation and adequate feed and watering. I have asked all CS's for their comments on this issue.*

*The South Coast Zone ran 4 rides last year, and is*

*looking at repeating that this year. They were well organised and well attended last year, so come and see for yourself this year.*

**50.2 A horse that has been issued with a logbook may enter an introductory, intermediate or micro-marathon ride utilising a vet card provided the correct name of the horse and the AERA horse number as recorded in the Logbook are recorded on the Vet Card and AeraSpace.**

Please use your AERA horse ID number when entering these rides as it is easier for the ride secretary to find and enter your horse in the ride entry. This practice also decreases the discrepancies between database ride records and logbook entries for a given horse and makes the checking for rest orders much easier.

## NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

# Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b) ) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.
