Track Preservation Report

Riding in Wilderness Areas

Following the conclusion of the horse riding in wilderness trial period, NPWS has put forward further Plan of Management amendments to continue to allow horse riding on the specified routes in Deua, Monga, Kosciuszko and Mummel Gulf National Parks until the end of 2017. By that time the outcomes of the monitoring and assessment should be finalised, and a more permanent and long-term decision on NPWS policy can be made.



Draft Plans of Management

Keeping Kids Safe at Rides

Endurance riding is a true family sport and it is always good to see whole families at rides enjoying the love of horses and the great outdoors. Whilst the endurance ride base is generally a safe and supportive environment where kids can mix with friends and have a healthy sense of freedom, there are some potential risks we should bear in mind.

Recently some riders expressed concerns to the SMC about unsupervised young children at ride bases and the potential dangers this might pose. Specifically this case involved young kids playing in and around the shower and amenity blocks unsupervised, for an extended period of time. We feel this is a good opportunity to address a range of safety issues in the hope of preventing any injuries or incidents.



The ride base can have potential hazards such as:

- large vehicles often reversing in camping areas
- open fires and water troughs
- creeks, rivers, dams
- electric fences
- obviously young and excitable horses
- the occasional territorial dog (hopefully tied up)
- and as the ride base is open to the public, possibly undesirable strangers.

We can all get very busy at rides as participants, strappers and volunteers and it is easy to lose track of where kids are. Some simple suggestions to avoid accidents could be :

- Walk young children around the base and point obvious dangers and places you feel they should not hang around.
- Give kids another familiar adult or two to go to if they have a problem.
- Assign a sensible older kid to keep an eye on little ones.
- Talk to them about safety around moving vehicles and horses.

On the flip side, unsupervised, exuberant kids can pose a danger to riders and horses. I have seen footballs, soccer balls and frisbees thrown or kicked in the vicinity of horses both mounted and unmounted. Once again education and supervision may help prevent a serious accident.

I know a lot of this is stating the obvious and most parents probably already do these things. Please do not be offended we just want everyone to have a safe and enjoyable time at our wonderful sport.

The Use of Horse Health Declarations (HHD) for Riders and Ride Organisers

The management of infectious diseases requires the fulfillment of certain obligations prior to the ride and at the ride by people in charge of a horse, on the one hand, and by ride organisers on the other.

All people who bring horses or livestock onto the grounds are expected to be aware of their biosecurity obligation, and that they must take all reasonable steps to ensure their activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant.

All horses or livestock entering grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management.

For riders:

The AERA Biosecurity Statement declares that Horse Health Declarations are now mandatory for **all horse at all rides**. The following actions are required of the person responsible for each horse –

- Name and contact details of the person who is responsible for each horse when it arrives at the ride base, and the duration of the event.
- Full details of your horse identity and property of origin, including PIC. If any horse is returning to a location other than its property of origin, provide the details of this property prior to departure from the event venue.
- Proof of current vaccination if your horse is vaccinated against Hendra virus. Accepted proof is a vaccination certificate or notation in the horses' logbook completed by the vet who administered the vaccine or scanned microchip by the Chief Steward, Biosecurity Manager, or Head Vet and compliant in the Hendra Vaccine registry <https://health4horses.com.au/About/Hendra-Vaccination-Lookup/>
- A properly completed Horse Health Declaration to accompany every horse entering the ride base, and to have it easily accessible for collection on arrival at the ride venue. The declaration states that the horse is healthy to the best of the responsible person's knowledge, includes a temperature log for the stipulated number of days prior to arrival at the ride venue and subsequently, until the pre ride veterinary check. DO NOT bring an unwell horse onto the ride base.

Paper copies will **only** be accepted, as these are attached to the entry form for later examination if required.

No HHD no Ride.

For Ride Organising Committees:

The NSWERA SMC requests that ride committees should abide with the following guidelines for the management of the Horse Health Declaration (HHD):

Prior to the event-

- The Event Director, Head Vet and Chief Steward decide on the number of days before the event the HHD is to be taken. The Biosecurity Statement details-
 - 10 day temperature logs for non-vaccinated horses in Hendra Risk Zones and
 - 3 day logs for vaccinated horses in those areas.
 - 3 day logs for horses in all other areas **except**
a non-vaccinated horse from a Hendra Risk Zone comes into those other areas it requires a 10 day temperature log.
- The exception to this is the TQ and FEI rides where then Head Vet and Biosecurity Manager can decide on the temperature log period.
- Please ensure all riders are aware of the requirements of the HHD taken for **all** horses entering the ride base is advertised.
- The HHD is to be completed by the person in charge of the horse using one horse per form – NO electronic copies – and is to accompany the horse (and its logbook if the horse has one) in the towing vehicle.
- The Event Director, Head Vet and Chief Steward decide if the HHD is to be taken at the point of

entry to the ride base or at ride entry, depending on the origin of horses attending the event.

- If the HHD is to be collected at the ride base entry, check with the Head Vet the temperature parameters that s/he wishes to be notified of.
- Ensure a quarantine/isolation zone is suitably situated. The guidelines and procedures for this area are to be strictly followed. See the AERA Biosecurity Statement.

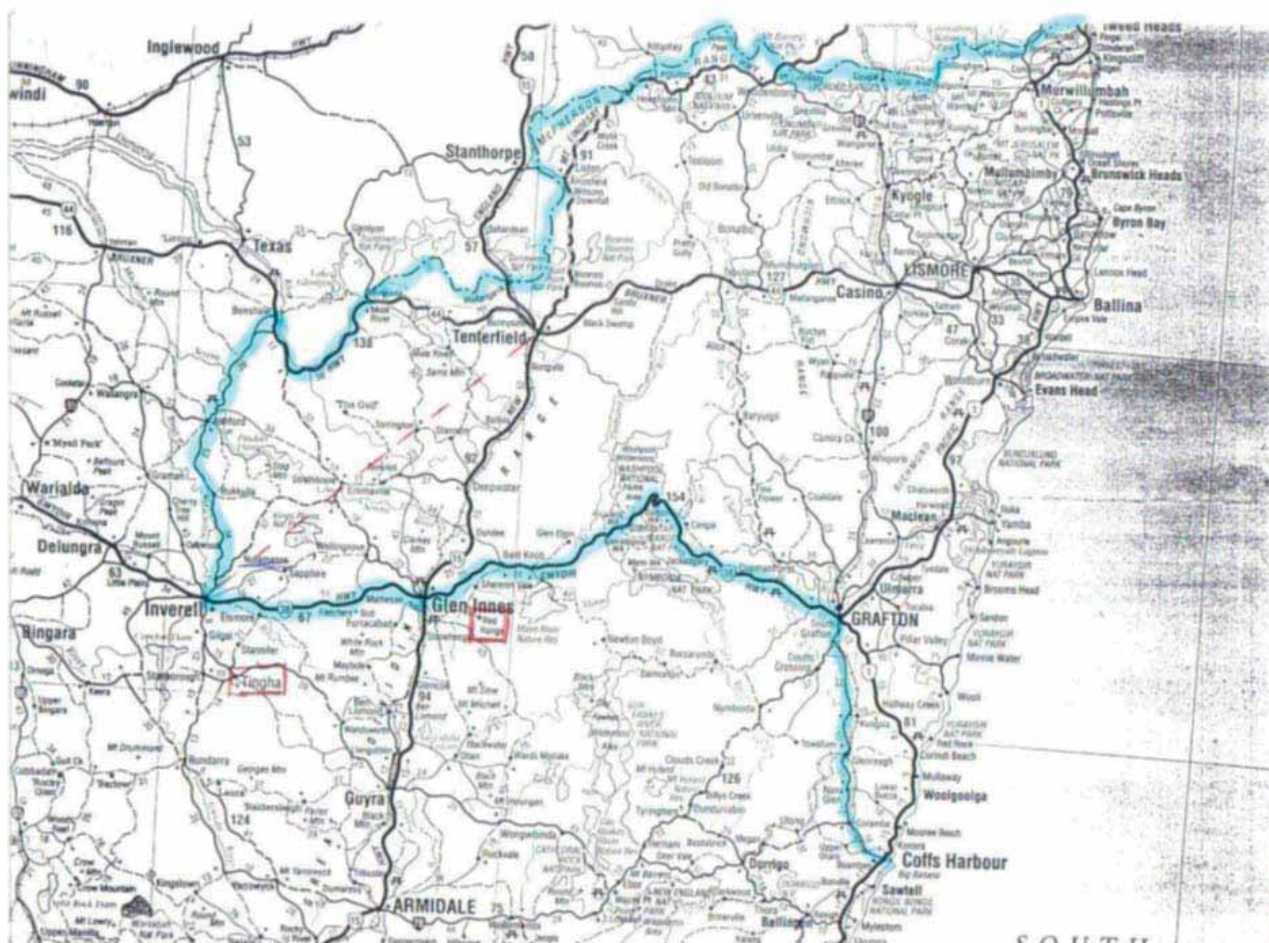
At ride entry-

- The HHD is attached to the rider entry form. Both forms are to be kept for 6 months.
- The rider entry form must provide the person responsible for each horse.
- Ensure PIC codes are supplied on the HHD.
- Please check if the horse is returning to a location other than its property of origin, and ensure the details of this property are provided before departing the event.
- Crayons for horse identification or green ribbons (proven current Hendra Vaccination) may be required by the RO/CS and will be provided by the ROC.

Nominations must be made by two current Senior Members (quote membership numbers). The nominee must be a current Senior Member and must give his/her written consent. Nominations for election to the NSWERA Committee will be accepted by the Secretary up to seven (7) days before the date of the AGM (NSWERA Constitution rule 17.1).

If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies, the people nominated as per rule 17(1) will be deemed elected and further nominations will be received from the floor at the Annual General Meeting (NSWERA Constitution rule 17.2). If insufficient further nominations are received, any remaining vacant positions will be deemed casual vacancies (rule 17(3)). The committee will attempt to fill any casual vacancies in accordance with rule 16(4)).

If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies, the people nominated will be deemed elected (rule 17.4).

If the number of nominations received prior to the meeting exceeds the number of vacancies, a ballot will be held at the meeting and the five people with the most number of votes will fill the vacancies (rules 17(5) and 17(6)).

If further nominations are required to be taken at the meeting, and those nominations exceed the number required to fill the remaining vacancies, a ballot will be held. In this case, the number of people required to fill the remaining vacancies with the most number of votes will be deemed elected (rules 17(5) and 17(6)).

This weekend has been designed for both less experienced riders and newcomers to the sport and experienced riders wanting a great weekend of riding. As we are holding rides on both Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning you are welcome to bring more than one horse. However, please note that with the start times reasonably compressed, you will not be able to do more than one event per day.

Subject to a couple of final approvals and the river levels not being too high, instead of riding along the side of the road to Comleroy Road, the course will leave the ride base, cross the river and then head upstream on easy going tracks and open ground, crossing the river again near Comleroy Road. **This will remove all of the tar road along the river.** We will return back to the ride base using the same track. A detailed map will be placed on our website in mid-January.

Everyone is encouraged to camp on Saturday night at a nominal cost. We are putting together some very interesting guests to both inform and entertain us. As it may be warm, don't forget to have a swim in the beautiful Colo River while you are here.

We will have a lot of riders new to Endurance so we are seeking to provide some mentors both on course and in the strapping area on the day.

Vetting and start times will be posted on the Zone One web page and Facebook, see details below, closer to the event.

Pub with no Beer – Training Rides

Taylors Arm

11 & 12 March 2017

Once again Zone 6 will be running our early season training rides on March 11 and 12 at Taylors Arm just 30mins west of Macksville. The picturesque ride base is overlooked by the famous “Pub with No Beer” which provides an excellent venue for pre-ride and presentation.

Similar to last year there will be the choice of either 20km or 40km rides on both Saturday and Sunday and the track is a good mix of forest trails, quiet country roads, lovely open paddock sections and stunning views from high ridge trails. There are a couple of good hills that will provide excellent legging up for the season and the track is very good under foot. Creek crossings and ocean views are features of this very scenic ride.

Food will be available from Saturday lunchtime onwards at both the canteen and the Pub. Water will be supplied by the local Bush Fire Brigade. No fires are permitted on the Recreation Ground area but may be permitted in paddock camps provided no fire restrictions apply.

Dogs must be restrained at all times.

Due to dogs being found running loose in increasing numbers at endurance events, it has been resolved that riders are to be disqualified, if their own dog or a dog belonging to their camp is found not to be restrained at all times during the full duration of an endurance event, i.e. from the opening of the ride base to participants until its closure. All chief stewards have been instructed to take action, enforce this rule and report offenders. A 'no dogs' policy may be introduced, if offences against this rule continue to occur.

Scenic City Ride Review

Scenic City Endurance Ride Carnival in Canberra's south has again given riders from near and far a great demonstration of why it is so named.



November 5th and 6th saw Kambah Pony Club fill with horses and riders, many of whom had travelled from interstate. Overall there were 150 competitors, with the biggest event being the 80 km endurance ride which had 59 starters.

The weekend was perfect for riding, not hot, with a good breeze to cool the horses off. Dawn over the city, seen from Mount Stromlo was a spectacular treat for riders in the 80 km event. Riders in all distances also enjoyed beautiful views over the Brindabellas and the city's south as well as parts of the city itself.

First over the line in the 80 km ride was heavyweight rider Allan West riding Tollarta in a time of 4 hours 31, a very good time on quite a challenging course. Allan beat fellow heavyweight Robert Caitlin on Avita in a gallop finish.

Seconds behind them were equal 1st Lightweight April Newman on Taeaurea Shayarnah and Kristie Wright on Brookleigh Shiralee, and 1st Middleweight Clare Feary on Die Kinder Junrei. First junior was Laura Kelly on Yinbilliko Shaka Zulu.

Best conditioned horses were Avita, Brookleigh Shiralee, Die Kinder Junrei and Yinbilliko Shaka Zulu.

There were also some unusual awards. A "Dead Centre" award was given to the "competitor who finished right in the middle of the field". This was calculated two ways, firstly on the median time (equal number of riders faster and slower) and secondly on the average of fastest and slowest. Interestingly, both methods produced a "centre" of just under 7 hours. The trophy was presented to Nicole Allan who took 6 hrs 54 mins. Nicole was equal with Ben Hudson but as Ben has won the Quilty, it was felt that the award would give a bigger thrill to Nicole, and that proved to be true.

Another special award was offered for the "Veteran Horse", i.e. the oldest horse to complete the 80 km event. This went to Monica Ballard on 21 year old Blake's Heaven Ventura who also completed in just under 7 hours (just pipped for the dead centre award). Many years ago, Ventura often attended rally days at the ride base, Kambah Pony Club. The award is designed to recognise the good management which allows endurance horses to keep successfully competing into their veteran years.

The first of the NSWERA's encouragement awards for intermediate riders was also awarded at Scenic City. An embroidered rug was proudly won by Caitlin Langley riding Tonki Dee Boo Becky for Al Jeda. The award recognises a well prepared horse ridden not too slow (within 1.5 hours of the fastest 4 k completion).

Head vet for the second year in a row was Georgia Ladmore. Chief Steward was Belinda Hopley. Gordon Smith came to TPR along with Neil Seagrim and others.





A huge amount of work went into running the rides, with 10 and 20 km events on Saturday and 40 and 80 on Sunday. B7 Events would like to thank everyone who assisted beforehand and on the day, especially Katrina Newitt, Andrew Hollingsworth, Ian Bassingthwaite (Shade4Hire), Monica Ballard and Maxine Macarthur. Talea Hasko-Stewart managed to mark a lot of the course before she jumped on a plane (delayed by a week) for Asia. Ian Curtis again took on the huge job of getting the results into the computer and was also out until 11pm on Saturday night with Fia Hasko-Stewart (on crutches) re-marking parts of Stromlo Forest Park after "friendly" locals messed with our signs.

This is one of the disadvantages of running a ride in a major city but the rewards are also great in terms of the easy access to the base, proximity to shops etc and of course the spectacular views.

Most of all, every rider owes a massive thank you to Adeline Gibson. Adeline not only handled all of the entries before and on the day but multiple other jobs and also had to do a lot of course marking and de-marking which Fia normally does, because of Fia's accident at the Quilty. Please let her know that you appreciate it.

We did not seek sponsors for the ride as that is "just another job to do" and subsequently ran at a small loss, but our tiny club continues to develop its asset base and now owns a set of bibs. We are pleased to be able to offer so much fun to riders of all levels and assuming we recover and have no more accidents, we may do it again next year, either from Kambah Pony Club or our new ride base on the slopes of Mount Stromlo.

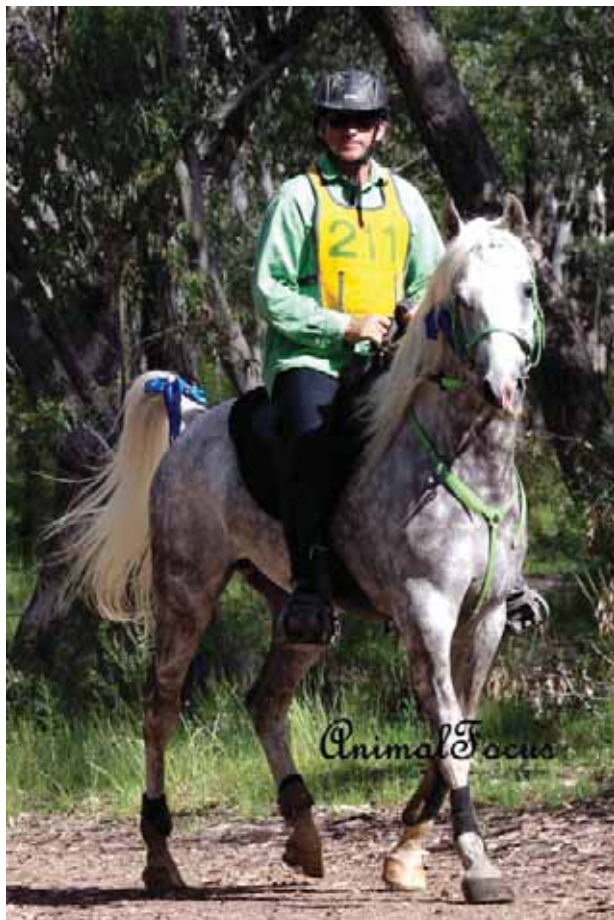

Emily reported on her discussions with Andrew (Snowy Zone President) about the support for this ride from Zone 4. Greg Moore – Development Grant proposal

Greg was working on a Sports Development Grant application. The project must encompass training: ride secretaries workshop, training weekends, entry fees for new riders are some ideas. Greg will send the proposal around before it is filed. Greg left the meeting at 9:57.

Feedback on 2016 Quilty.

The AERA has requested balanced feedback on the running of the 2016 Victorian Quilty. Consensus amongst the Committee that:

The first two legs of the ride were 'very scary'. There were some quite serious injuries. The recent severe weather is noted but there should have been a safer track identified early to avoid the dangerous sections

Communications were ineffective: ride base, updates to the outside world and the vet hospital

A NSW rider sat at a check for an hour with a badly broken foot. An incident form is required but the rider hasn't been approached regarding this. The First Aid Person should have followed up.

This is the second big ride in a row where our technology has let us down. (Other was 2015 Quilty). AERAspace couldn't run live because it would clash with the timing system. Both cannot run together, this requires rectification.

Ground organisation left a lot to be desired. Emily

was left to deal with a problem with a rider with horse in the vet hospital. This should have been done by the ride officials.

Care of volunteers was abysmal, vets didn't have access to food either.

A band that played on the night of the ride so the riders didn't get any sleep.

Campsite allocation was extremely disorganised. With some riders with no allocation of space at the start of the event.

Emily Streckfuss –President, Ride Standards

No report. Woodstock wet but no major dramas.

Scenic City and Windeyer coming up soon.

Emily expressed congratulations to Simon and Alam for what they did for the teams at the Quilty.

Kerry Spratt– AERA, Secretary, Public Officer

Discussing the proposal for Renee Kirk to become a chief steward, noting the verbal assessment needs to be done. Suggestion from Steve Swan is to nominate Renee for accreditation at the next AERA meeting subject to satisfactory completion of the verbal component with Gerard Bou before the meeting.

John Howe – Treasurer, Ride Calendar and Zone 2 delegate.

This second half of the year has seen the cancellation of 4 rides, rain 3, other 1. We have therefore lost, in my estimate the following money, estimate based on last years affiliation fees:-The Rock \$3,500, ACT \$1,325, Neville \$3,500 Kiwarra \$1,600. Total loss of revenue approx. \$9,925.00.

We have also spent a lot on the teams for the Quilty:-Uniforms \$2,354.76, Jodhpurs \$1,287.00, Team entries \$120.00, Fuel for Simon as Team Vet \$262.76. Total spent to date \$,4025.52. We are also still committed to paying \$100.00 to each team member for fuel to attend. We paid Ben Hudson \$1,500.00 to defray his expenses to attend the world championships in Slovakia. We are committed to \$1,100.0 for our ad in Equestrian news and we will incur extra expenses re the upcoming Chief Stewards seminar. The costs we have incurred are necessary towards the running and advertising the sport.

Therefore, yesterday, as our liquid reserves are running very low, I took \$15,000.00 from an interest bearing deposit that matured at midnight, last night and deposited it in our cheque account. The other \$15,000.00 I rolled over for 3 months at 2.1%, the option was for 7 months at 2.2%. As it is now very hard to break any term deposit, I felt that the lower rate of interest was prudent. Please note that we also have another term deposit maturing on 11th November.

Bago's ride fee of \$2,150.00 is in the mail, Ride fees will come in from Scenic City and Windeyer which should net us approx. \$4,000.00, for a total of \$6,150.00.

At the beginning of this year we had cash reserves of some \$101,000.00, taking into account the above losses, that are beyond our control and the money due to come in, we are in the same financial position that we would have been except for unforeseen circumstances. However, for the rest of this year, until the AGM's over, we do need to be very aware of any financial commitments.

Scenic City and Windeyer to go this year, with ride bookings coming in for 2017. Lachlan is still the only contender for the 2017 NSW State Championships. The Lachlan Club wish to run the October Long weekend at Woodstock.

Tooraweenah has announced its proposed calendar for next Easter. 20, 40 and 80km rides Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Depending on interest and volunteers, at least a 120km elevator over 2 days, possibly a 160km 2 day ride.

At the Quilty Kerry, Alam and I spoke to Andrew Kettlewell, President Snowy Zone re Burruga. Emily also spoke to Andrew. Andrew is offering for Kim Stephens to run the office, and will donate the buckles. However, he has no other manpower resources to offer at this stage due to the distance from his home. To date Jacque has not lodged an appropriate booking form, nor has she answered the requests put to her earlier this year as a requirement for having a ride approved.

Zone Two:- Zone two is looking forward to the final ride of the year, Windeyer Twilight being part of our calendar.

At Tooraweenah, Easter next year, Jeff Pike will be doing a spit roast dinner on the Saturday night and there will be a huge communal bonfire to make Tooraweenah a very social ride as well as a great weekend of Endurance.

2018 will be Tooraweenah's 40th Anniversary and the club is being strongly encouraged to tender for the NSW State Championship ride.

NSW waratahs secured 11th position with total riders combined time of 52hrs39mins18secs. The team performed well under dangerous track conditions and NSW teams in their uniforms did make quite a statement and marked their presence making NSW ERA proud. Simon Bain – Vet Liaison, Biosecurity, AERA IDP

Vet Liaison, Biosecurity, and IDP Report October 2016

On the veterinary front it was interesting to attend a vet meeting the day before the Quilty near the ride base. Mostly the NVP but vets also 2 from USA, and one each from New Zealand, and I think, Thailand. Topics were varied but included the relationship between vets and riders and the need to fund a national endurance vet treatment course.

Personally, as the vet for the two NSW teams at TQ16 I was very proud of the degree of professionalism and attention to detail team members and their crews exhibited. They did NSW proud! Thanks also for a great working relationship with teams manager Alam Dastani.

On the biosecurity front new 3 day and 10 day Horse health Declaration (HHDs) specifically written in a one horse per form format have been approved and are presented on the NSWERA website. These have also been approved by AERA and posted on its website.

There is nothing to report on the IDP front.

Belinda Hopley – Zone 5 Delegate, Chief Stewards and TPRs

Shahzada, 22-26/8/16, 400k & 120k. Still awaiting the CS report, but have the paperwork for the following - 2 horses had colic (1 receiving a RO for 8 wks), 1 horse hurt its shoulder slipping downhill, 1 horse had electrolyte depletion and 1 horse tied up. 1 rider fell off Monday morning injuring her ankle, and 1 rider fainted while mounted during presentation.

Woodstock, 18/9/16, 80k, 40k & 20k. This ride had quite big numbers despite the rain and mud. Was well organised, and had a second CS. A team of 5 vets ensured the vet ring ran smoothly. 1 horse tied up in the 1st leg.

Now that the TQ is done I will start to finalise the CS rulebook workshop next month.

South Coast Zone News- Jenny Shephard thanks NSWERA for the computer. Kim helped Brett initially at Currowan and Wingello, and then Brett did Wandandian and had the results up Sunday night.

Meg has agreed to write an article getting a young horse ready for it's first season, and see where Danni is up to with her article.

I thought to put a new rule a month on the website, FB and the newsletter.

Adeline Gibson – Zone 4 Delegate - Snowy
The story across the Snowy zone has been RAIN, RAIN, RAIN.

An extreme weather season saw the zone loose The Rock, Brookvale and Neville due to unusable ride bases and unsafe courses. There was nothing that could be done to change the situation, and it was disappointing for RO's and riders.

Thankfully the Woodstock ride committee, headed up by Erica Allen, had a usable ride base and went to great lengths to amend their course and hold an 80, 40 and 20k ride with an enormous 120 entrants in the 80k. The ride did have some nasty boggy sections, but given the conditions riders were grateful to have a course!! It was also crucial

preparation for a lot of riders who went to the Quilty. Congratulations to the committee, the office and vet ring ran perfectly and electronic timing was well used.

AERA expenses.

The amount of money spent by the AERA is extensive and AERA is constantly putting up our expenses. NSW is absorbing these costs without increasing ride fees. An example is the rider levy, was \$1 per horse in 2015, now up to \$3 per horse for 2017.

NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b)) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.

In consideration of the New South Wales Endurance Riders Association Inc. ("the Association") permitting me to participate in an event conducted by the Association:

This agreement is compulsory and is entered into by:

And covers my participation in all endurance riding activities affiliated with or endorsed by the Association.

I understand that –

There are potentially significant risks and hazards involved with endurance riding, and that horses are powerful and potentially dangerous animals;

There are certain inherent risks in the terrain, public roadways, weather and other forces of nature which may arise during my participation in endurance riding, and that such risks may vary from ride to ride;

The Ride Organisers and the State Management Committee make every effort to ensure the safety of the ride base and ride course, and the safety and well-being of all participants and their horses, and to minimize any risk of injury, death or loss due to negligence or omission by the organisers and the Association;

It is compulsory to wear an approved safety helmet at all times while on a horse at any event affiliated or endorsed by the Association;

I am responsible for the control and welfare of any horse in my care or which I elect to ride and for ensuring that I am capable of managing any such horse in the interests of my own safety, and that of other participants, horses and property;

If I fail to comply with any reasonable instruction, request or direction by Ride Organisers or other designated officials, upon my being so warned by the appointed Chief Steward, she/he may terminate any further participation by me, such termination being at my expense, and I waive any claim or refund;

I am free to withdraw my participation at any time should I determine that to do so is in the interests of my safety and well-being or that of other participants and horses.

I agree –

That if I have a medical condition or impairment which may affect my capacity to act safely and in the best interests of the welfare of myself, other participants and horses, then I take full responsibility for any consequence of such medical condition or impairment;

To comply with AERA and the Association's Ride Rules and any reasonable instruction, request or direction from ride officials as to the safety and well-being of myself and other participants, and the management of horses;

That due to diseases such as equine influenza, the Department of Primary Industries or other state or commonwealth government body, may restrict or prevent the movement of horses, vehicles and personnel for a period of time, otherwise known as a "standstill".
