## **Currowan Endurance Ride at Nelligen**

**South Coast Zone Endurance 22 & 23 July 2017**

**South Coast Zone 100km Championship**

**10 km ride on the Saturday**

**100km, 80km, 40km, 20km Sunday**

### The ride base:

We have a fantastic ride base 40metres off the Kings Highway at Nelligen. Very easy to get to. Nelligen is 2 ¼ hours from Yass, 1 ½ hours from Canberra and Goulburn, towards the South Coast off the main road from Canberra to Bateman's Bay.

The ride base is on the outskirts of Nelligen off the River Rd (Shallow Crossing Road) 50mtrs off the Kings Highway. We have kindly been given permission to use a large flat paddock.

Only one kilometre away is a four star holiday park with showers and camping, cabins and villas (with spas) on the banks of the Clyde River. There's a good pub with meals across the road from the holiday park. Also at Nelligen is a great cafes overlooking the lovely Clyde River and a park with a children's playground. There will be a raffle drawn on Saturday night of fresh local oysters and prawns donated by Innes Boatshed, Snax on Trax food van onsite.

### The ride:

All the legs are good under foot. With a variety of surfaces.

One 40km ride leg (second leg 80km) winds along the banks of the beautiful Clyde River. Riding along The River Road all the way to Shallow Crossing and then back. This has slight undulation less than 50mtr above sea level. Tracks are dirt road, with fresh water creeks with easy access.

You travel past farmland, forest and the river—all very pleasant scenery.

The other 40km leg follows the river for a while then turns up some less used dirt roads through lovely bush and some rainforest. Still clean good tracks. Again clean fresh water creeks with easy access.

There is approximately 25km of track with slight undulation no higher than 50mtr above sea level. This leaves 6km of undulating going through rainforest then a 4km gradual climb to an elevation of around 150mtr above sea level. Then a gentle 5.7km back down to the river.

The 100km riders will also do the 20km ride

No tar road apart from a very short distance entering a couple of the creek crossings.

The 20km social ride will follow the Clyde River before turning up a bush track looping around and back onto the road further along the Clyde River. The 10km ride 500mtrs along goes onto quiet bush roads and should



have no other horses or traffic for approx 6km then back along the beautiful Clyde River.

# Kiwarra Cup Endurance Ride – Zone 6

## 5 & 6 August 2017

The highly regarded Kiwarra Cup Endurance Ride is scheduled for the weekend of **5 and 6 August 2017**. There will be a 40 km Intermediate Ride and 10 km and 20 km Social/ Introduction to Endurance Rides on the Saturday afternoon; and a further 40 km Intermediate Ride and 20 km Social Ride on the Sunday morning. The Kiwarra Cup 80 km ride is on the Sunday.

The ride base is on private property with all rides passing through the pristine Kiwarra State Forest. This is mostly eucalypt forest with some temperate rainforest pockets. The course is undulating, with plenty of spectacular views. The rides are circuits, and take place entirely on forestry roads and trails, with plenty of shade on track and lots of water.

A canteen will be available for evening meals, snacks, burgers, sandwiches, soft drinks; and breakfast on Sunday. There will be plenty of water and lollies out on track for the riders and carrots for horses.

The ride base is a grassy paddock at **215 Careys Road, Hillville NSW 2430** (S31.990648 E152.343777)

- Vetting for all rides from about 9-00 am on the Saturday.
- Intermediate 40 km departs at 11-00 am on Saturday.
- 10 & 20 km Social Ride departs at 1-00 pm on Saturday.
- Vetting from about 7-00 AM on the Sunday for those only coming for the Sunday Social.
- Intermediate 40 km departs at 7-00 am on Sunday.
- 20 km Social Ride departs at 10-00 am on Sunday.
- Kiwarra Cup departs at 5-00 am on Sunday.

### Draft Plans of Management

Plans of management define if and where you are allowed to ride in a park.

You can make submissions by post, email or directly from the website at

A submission is simply your comments on the plan of management, whether agreeing or disagreeing with what is being proposed.

**Bongil Bongil NP** south of Coffs Harbour. Horse riding permitted on a limited number of designated trails which provide links to other off-park routes and locations where horses are allowed, including North Beach to the south of the park. Submissions close Monday 14 August 2017.

**Cottan-Bimbang NP/SCA** west of Wauchope. Horse riding permitted on specified trails outside the wilderness area. The trails seem to have been selected to create loop rides and allow connectivity with surrounding areas. Submissions close Monday 14 August 2017.

**New England NP** south-west of Dorrigo. Horse riding only allowed on one trail and one dirt road which cross the southern section of the park. Submissions close Monday 28 August 2017.

From north inland, Kyogle and Casino, take the Coraki road, continue 9kms past Coraki on the road to Woodburn, turn right into Reardons Lane for 4kms, turn left into Darke Lane for 1km, then right into Swan Bay/New Italy Road, ride base is 5kms down this dirt road.

# National Capital 'Brookvale' Ride 35<sup>th</sup> Ride (1982-2017)

## 2-3 September 2017

**Saturday:** Besides a full-length endurance ride of 80 km, a 2-leg 52 km and a 30 km ride on Sunday, we will also have an event focused on introductory riders on Saturday. It will commence at 11 am with talks on what to expect at an endurance ride, vetting procedures, strapping, feeding and some tips on training for longer distances. Please arrive in time! Riders will then have the choice of attempting a 13km or 22 km long ride on unsealed tracks through Sherwood Forest, accompanied by experienced endurance riders who they can quiz as much as possible and get some advice for the subsequent strapping. Pre-ride vetting from 10 am or after the talks, just before the ride.

**The Sunday course:** The 80km first leg (50 km) travels through Brindabella National Park and private property and is beautiful though challenging with a climb to an elevation of 1270m. The 80km second leg (30 km), which is also the first leg of the 52 km intermediate ride and the track followed by the 30 km intro riders, winds mostly through Uriarra and Sherwood Forest in the ACT. It offers stunning views of the surrounding areas. The second leg (22 km) of the 52 km ride follows the track of the introductory ride through Sherwood Forest on the previous day. The entire ride is on unsealed tracks with conditions ranging from soft forest tracks to rocky stretches underfoot.

**Admin:** The office opens at 9:30 am on Saturday and vetting starts at 10:00 am with preference being initially given to introductory riders. Both office and vetting will close at 5 pm. Introductory riders for the 30 km ride can vet Saturday preferably, or Sunday morning from 7.00 am onwards. Pre-nomination will be through try booking, available closer to the ride.

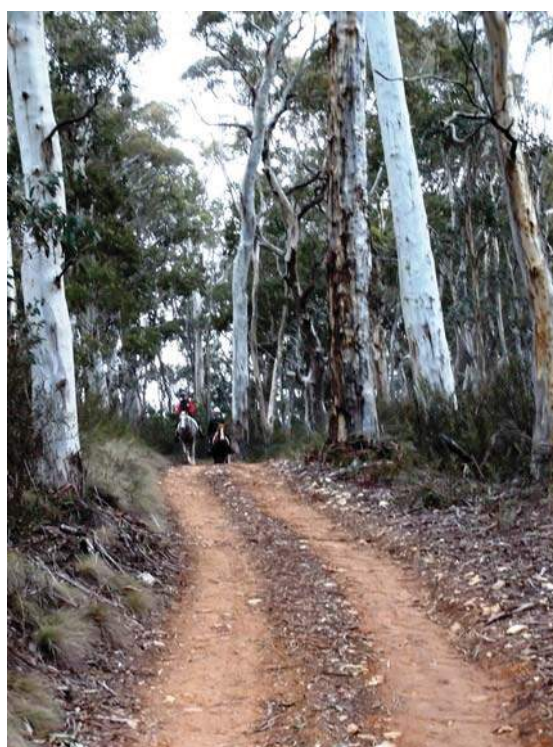

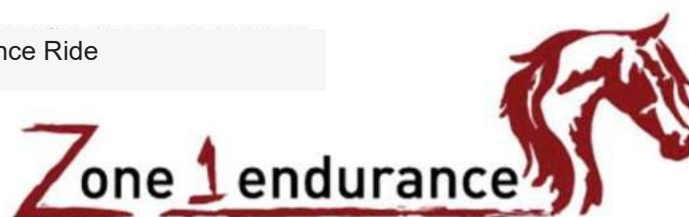

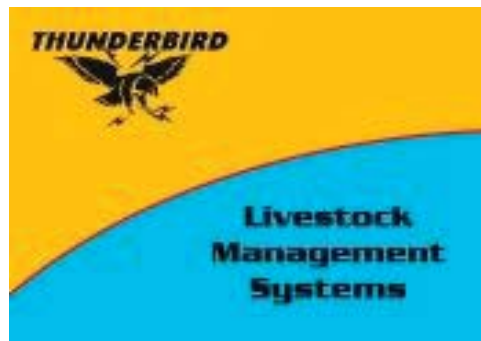

The organising committee from the Table Top Endurance ride would like to thank all riders, vets, officials, landowners and volunteers for making our second FEI & AERA ride such an amazing event. The feedback has been overwhelming and so positive. As a very green and small team of three, as the organising committee, it has been quite challenging and we have welcomed all feedback and will use this information for the next ride.

The ride base was situated inside the "Oso Arabians Stud" in one of their lush green paddocks. The visiting horses from all over the country took advantage of the wonderful green pick. The site offered catering, shower and toilet trailers, trade stands and a line-up of world class vets and officials from Spain, Portugal, New Zealand and Australia.

The ride ran out of Oso's property into neighbouring farm land which gave the ride something for everyone. The terrain was very good underfoot ensuring that it was a very achievable track for anyone looking to qualify for the Tom Quilty, this year to be held in South Australia. There were a couple of good hill climbs thrown in the mix and the ride was a great warm up for the Quilty.

The track included an amazing 40km loop (twice for 120km) around Lake Hume which was run in the dark but with a beautiful moon, running on into the early morning sunrise for the 2<sup>nd</sup> leg riders and 80km riders.

The track then went on to two 20km loops climbing up the side of the 'Table Top' rock - out over to Yambla Station. It then looped back to come up over the back of our property with incredible views overlooking the farm with Lake Hume in the distance. The last two legs made the ride more challenging than last year and required the riders to manage their horses accordingly.

A total of 88 horses took part over the weekend - a good mix of FEI and AERA

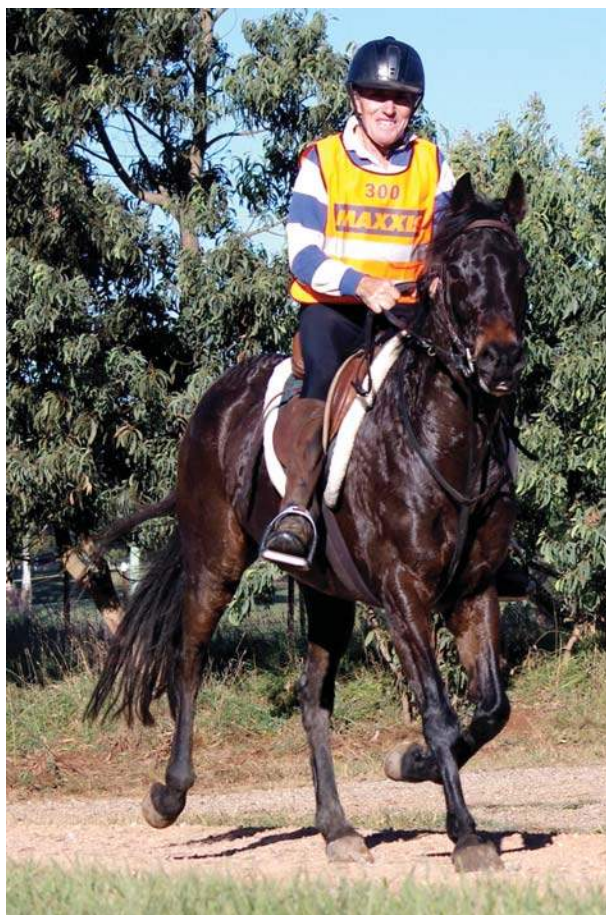

## Vale Richard Chapman (1935-2017)

Dr Richard Chapman, veterinarian and Honorary Life Member of the ACT Endurance Riders Association Inc., passed away in Canberra on Sunday 14 May 2017 after a battle with cancer.

Richard graduated from Bristol University in England in 1958, came to Australia in the early 1960s and settled at Canberra in the mid-1970s.

During the 1970s, Richard became involved with endurance riding, still a relatively new sport in Australia. He had a major part in establishing the sport in the ACT.

Richard officiated as head vet at the National Capital ("Brookvale") Endurance Ride from its inception in 1982 until the early 1990s: his fee for the weekend was a bottle of good double-malt Scotch. In addition to vetting at the local endurance ride and training ride, which in the early years were run separately, he conducted training courses and examinations for aspiring TPR Stewards and spoke at seminars held by the ACTERA for the benefit of new riders. For many endurance riders in Canberra and the surrounding district, he was also their local vet.

Over many years, Richard was part of the veterinary team for several other rides in the local area and elsewhere in the Snowy Zone, including at Tumut where he sometimes took the opportunity to do some trout fishing with friend and fellow-vet Jervis Hayes. He was also a member of the veterinary panel for the Quilty. As well as being a popular and highly-respected vet, Richard was one of the great characters of the sport.

In 1986, ACTERA presented Richard with a mounted buckle, the plaque for which is inscribed "Presented to RICHARD CHAPMAN B.V.Sc., M.R.C.V.S. IN APPRECIATION FROM A.C.T.E.R.A. FOR CONTINUED SUPPORT AND SERVICES TO ENDURANCE RIDING IN THE A.C.T." In 1992, he was made an Honorary Life Member in recognition of his ongoing support for the club and the sport.

In 2012, Richard attended the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Ride reunion at Brookvale, where he caught up with several participants in the original ride as well as with other early riders.

Richard will be remembered for his unfailing friendliness and good humour; his practical, common-sense advice; his willingness to use alternative therapies alongside more traditional veterinary medicine; and for his wealth of jokes and anecdotes, delivered in an impeccable English accent. Much of his experience with horses, cats and dogs, accumulated during nearly 60 years as a practicing veterinarian, has been captured in his book "Do I Call the Vet? and what to do in the meantime", written in 2015.

Although unwell for much of the last two years, Richard continued to practice almost to the end of his life. Only a few weeks before his death, a former endurance rider who had first met Richard in the early 1980s came to Canberra to consult him about a lameness problem in her current horse. The consultation was followed by a couple of hours reminiscing together about the early days of endurance riding, an opportunity that the rider now cherishes.

People who had been connected with Richard in a variety of ways during his four decades in Canberra, including many current and former endurance riders, joined his family for a celebration of his life at the Canberra race-course on the afternoon of 1 June. Richard had a long association with that venue, as official veterinarian to the Canberra Racing Club.

Rest in peace, Richard. You were a legend and we won't forget you.

RE Concerns expressed by NSWERA members

Dear Ieva

I am writing to the AERA with concerns expressed by some NSWERA members at our AGM held last weekend. We ask that the AERA please provide a response to these concerns that we can pass on to these members. Please table this letter for discussion at the March 2017 AERA meeting. The issues are:

1. The continual increase of fees and charges levied on the Divisions by the AERA. There is a general view that these fees and charges are excessive. In particular, the levy of \$1 per rider initially said to be raising funds to cover the AERA's financial difficulties following purchase of the 2015 Tom Quilty buckles. Some NSWERA members are unhappy that this fee remains in place even though these costs have been recovered (in part through a loan from NSWERA), and furthermore, the fee has been increased threefold. Please explain the justification for this fee remaining and the increases.
2. Please explain the current and foreseeable charges relating to AERASpace. There is a perception amongst some members that this program fails to deliver its functions and is not value for money.
3. The honorariums (and ongoing increases) paid to various volunteers are seen as too costly. Considering that in the State Associations these roles are usually unpaid, how does the AERA justify the payments to these positions?
4. The letter from the AERA to the FEI via EA regarding events in the UAE. While we certainly don't condone horse welfare breaches and agree that the current situation in the UAE is deplorable, some members expressed the view that Australia should not be openly criticising other countries while we do not have an impeccable horse welfare record in this country. Further, we do not support the suggestion that the FEI should withdraw from the UAE. To the contrary, it is preferable to have the FEI strengthen enforcement of its rules, as suggested in the correspondence sent by the EA Endurance Committee.
5. The horse welfare risks caused by the 2016 Tom Quilty course are unacceptable and the need to alter the course in response to the weather should have been obvious days before the event. Our members ask that the AERA explain its role in the supervision of this event, and how it happened that the course was not altered before the event, given the known weather and condition of the course prior to the event. Most importantly, how will the AERA ensure no repeat of this problem at future events?

Dear Kerry

Correspondence from your organisation was tabled at the most recent meeting of AERA on 18 March 2017. On behalf of all members of the Australian Endurance Riders Association (AERA) Committee, thank you for the time taken to inform us of your concerns.

As you are aware, the AERA is made up of members appointed by Divisions to administer the sport of Endurance in Australia. The functions of the Committee are in line with the Constitution and decisions made are considered with the intent of fulfilling those varied functions. Our meetings are generally well attended by all Division Delegates, or their proxies, who all contribute to discussions and decision-making processes.

The key functions of the AERA include, with specific reference to your concerns, the provision of control of how endurance rides are run with regard to rules, procedures and accreditation of officials; the promotion of the sport by ensuring compliance of rules and procedures, with specific regard to horse welfare; the supervision of the conduct of the annual Tom Quilty Gold Cup ride; support in working towards the international acceptance of the sport of endurance; and the maintenance of accurate records to support accurate assessments of point scores and robust archiving of achievements of members and their horses.

With regard to the specific items you have raised, the following comments are offered:

### 1. Fees and charges levied on Divisions by the AERA

AERA is very thankful to both NSWERA and TEERA, for the loan that helped cover the temporary shortfall during 2015, brought about, as you correctly said, because of the late decision to purchase specific 50th Anniversary Quilty buckles, after only just having bought a few years' stock of 'normal' buckles. These loans

tided AERA over till the income from the TQ15 buckles was received and the loans repaid in full, with interest. Annual financial reports for the AERA are available on the website. With consideration to the last five years or so, the AERA has not returned any significant surplus of funds but has had to meet increasing costs that have been assessed by the committee as relevant to the administration of our sport. The AERA has limited streams of income available to us and this has resulted in an increase of fees from Divisions. AERA continues to seek other funding sources, such as advertising and sponsorship. Before the increase for 2017, there had not been an increase to the Membership Affiliation fee for some years.

The particular fee that you refer to, the Ride Entry Levy, was not specifically introduced in relation to the buckle issue, but as a way of increasing general AERA income in a less intrusive, user pays manner.

The NSWERA delegates to the AERA have been present and have contributed to the decisions regarding fees and charges and will no doubt be able to further expand on these responses.

### 2. AeraSpace and ongoing costs

The development of AeraSpace commenced in 2011 and went live on 1 January 2013. It has continued to evolve to meet the emerging needs of the Divisions and of AERA. AeraSpace is built using software that is renewable and updatable. This means that it will continue to be a relevant means of data collection and reporting, for and to endurance riders, long into the foreseeable future; it does not have inherent obsolescence, like a new car or ute.

It is acknowledged that there have been some technical hiccups along the way, which have, for some people, created a lack of faith in the program's reputation.

AERA believes that AeraSpace is, and will continue to be, excellent value for money, and that in this modern world where speed of information, and the bountiful reports that can come from it, is considered essential, it will prove to be a great and timely investment by making our past history far more



accessible to all, and our future much more efficient, in both costs and information accessibility. When it became evident that the earlier database, could not remain technically current as it could not keep up with software changes, AERA undertook to replace this system with one that had longer-term sustainability, that would fulfil more practical processes that were still being done manually, such as horse registrations, memberships, pointscores, distance registers, and many others, as well as managing rides.

There are still significant volunteer hours that contribute to the ongoing work on the database as we endeavour to accurately record past rides and history of the sport. Further development of AERSPACE is driven by user requests from the divisions, including NSWERA.

### **3. Honorariums**

The AERA Committee acknowledges that all aspects of the sport of Endurance are supported by many volunteer hours, and that if these hours were accurately costed and included in membership and nomination fees, our sport would become a very expensive activity. The Committee has also recognised that for some people who take on portfolios that require a greater investment of hours, payment of an honorarium is a small offset for AERA, compared to the major benefits that all members receive in exchange. It is further considered that payment of honorariums serves to give the roles that they apply to, legitimacy and credence, as part of the essential “engine room” of the association. These honorariums are regularly reviewed.

### **4. Correspondence to the FEI via EA**

The AERA is optimistic that long and fruitful ties between ourselves and endurance riders in the UAE will continue to grow and prosper long into the future, most notably because efforts will continue to be made by all parties – UAE, FEI, EA, and AERA – to grow the integrity of our sport, in terms of personal conduct, horse welfare, and sportsmanship. AERA has, as a principle of its charter, the representation of all Australians in things endurance, and takes this role very seriously. We are mindful of the intricacies of personal links and conduits that exist between our two countries, and take care to tread carefully whilst simultaneously conveying the necessary communications. We also construct our communications through consultations between AERA members from all divisions, to ensure a balanced outcome.

### **5. AERA's supervision of Tom Quilty Gold Cup**

AERA charges all Ride Organising Committees to accept responsibility for the safety of riders and horses at all events. Our sport is one that challenges individuals and is not exempt from risk caused by individual experiences and external influences.

The 2016 Tom Quilty was, as we know, struck by unfavourable weather conditions before the event. A Chief Steward inspected the course, by vehicle, on the day preceding the event, and was deemed suitable to start the ride. The course was also checked by motorcycles in the hours prior to ride start and although there were sections of mud and difficult terrain to be encountered, these sections did not make up a large portion of the course.

The effect of 200 horses on the course was not anticipated to bring about as many issues as became apparent by the 2nd leg of the event. As vehicles have a less invasive means of travelling the course by way of their load spreading ability via tyres, it was not obvious that the ground in many places was suffering from liquefaction. The impact on the ground surface of 1000 horse hooves could not have been assessed.

Whilst it was known that the course was wet, it was not known how bad the surface would become. As soon as the effect of the number of horses travelling the course was known, the course was changed to alleviate the pressure on these sections of the course and provide a more stable footing environment for horses on track. The most suitable action was taken at its first opportunity.

It was noted that the withdrawal rates were not particularly high for this event and riders were ultimately responsible for choosing to continue to navigate the course.

It is an extremely difficult ask for a TQ to be postponed or cancelled. While the conditions were less than favourable for the event and the track suffered greatly from the amount of hoof traffic in many areas, the final outcome of providing the best options available on the day was achieved through communications with the Ride Committee, the Course Director and the Chief Steward.

In relation to the upcoming TQ 17, preparations for the event have taken on board issues that arose in 2016 and the AERA is approaching the event in a more detailed fashion with extra help being provided to the ride committee. The Chief Steward, Gerard Bou, has on two occasions visited the proposed ride base, once to view the base and see sections of the track from horseback and on another occasion acting as CS for a test event to identify any issues that may impact on the running of the event should inclement weather hamper preparations.

Whilst acting as Chief Steward at the recent Wirrina Cove ride, Gerard Bou participated in driving much of the course checking for suitability and familiarising himself with the layout of the base and track. Realistic risk assessments have been made about the track and ride base and shall continue to be reviewed as we draw closer to the event to be sure that adequate risk assessment and risk mitigation plans are in place. Sections of the track that have been identified as possible problem areas, should bad weather arise, are backed up by alternatives that will ensure the safety of horse and rider. The CS

and assistant CS shall also be in attendance for the full week prior to the event and shall be part of the team undertaking track marking and ride base preparations. As the organisation of such large events typically falls on a small band of willing volunteers, extra help shall be given by the AERA and extra volunteers shall be present prior to and during the event to be sure that it is successful.

I trust that these responses are sufficient to allay the concerns you have raised.

*Currently we are waiting on Jim Bannatyne to complete the profit and loss report, which I will email prior to the meeting.*

*I am happy to report that we have just received a Dept Sport and Rec grant for \$25,000.00 plus \$2,500.00 G.S.T component, Total \$27,500.00. This grant is for Education and sport promotion. Kerry will give fuller details at the meeting.*

*Please note that we owe a great debt of gratitude to Greg Moore who put the grant application together and sourced the necessary information that has made us successful. This is one of the ongoing innovations that the previous committee has been working on.*

*As we have 1 year to expend this money, I propose to invest \$20,000.00 up front for a period of 3 months, rather than sit in our cheque account doing nothing, we can earn a small amount of interest, this will assist with defraying last year's loss.*

*Please note that annual insurance policies will fall due towards the end of March and will account for approx. \$20,000.00.*

*For the new members of the Committee, I would advise you to read the NSWERA Governance Manual, Document No 7.1.5 Committee allowances. Briefly:- For people travelling you are able to claim Fuel expenses up to a tank of fuel. Please provide receipts.*

*Accommodation. If you have to travel more than 2 hours to get home, if the meeting finishes after 12.00 you may claim a motel room. Please note this is to be budget accommodation. If you are tired or fatigued at the end of a meeting and you feel unsafe to drive, if the meeting finishes before 12.00, please claim this option. We do not want people injured on the road.*

*To expedite meetings and to provide a suitable collegial atmosphere, the SMC will provide simple finger food as an evening meal. At The Richmond Club, this consists of Pizzas served in the Board room, a couple of jugs of soft drink will also be provided. Obviously, the earlier that meetings can be finished, the less need for overnight accommodation i.e cost saving. Anyone wishing to eat in the Clubs dining room will do so at their own expense.*

*All portfolio holders may claim reasonable phone, internet and postage costs in regard to their portfolio business. Please furnish appropriate Invoices/receipts to myself for reimbursement.*

*I would like to flag that the President and Secretary are allowed an unsubstantiated allowance of \$30.00 per month, however, the last two incumbents have only claimed via substantiated claims. I personally carry my costs as my donation to the sport.*

*For anyone interested, I will have a copy of the relevant document at tomorrow night's meeting.*

*Ride Calendar:- The ride calendar is filling nicely. The Winter months are filling well, however, if anyone knows of a club who can run a ride either first or last weekend of July or 2nd weekend August, I'd love to hear from them. Freemantle, early in August has left a vacuum in the run up to Shahzada.*

*2018 State Championship. Tooraweenah has indicated that they may be willing to run the State Champs as a celebration of 40 years of Tooraweenah Endurance. I'll contact them after Easter and see if they are willing to commit. I have also had Jenny Shepherd from the South Coast ring me in regard to running a State Championship.*

*Zone Two:- Currently looking forward to Tooraweenah's Easter Carnival, Mudgee in May and the Windeyer Quilty qualifier ride on the June Long weekend.*

**Carried** Unanimous  
Insurance account will be coming in shortly. Horse registration was to fund AERASpace with a sunset clause. Question: a) how much money did they collect via the horse registrations? b) How much was expended on AERASpace. c) do they need to keep updating? The answer to (c) is yes.

John feels that we collect members' money (horse registration fees) and questions whether AERA is using this money for AERASpace, since the original undertaking was to collect money for that project only. The AERA has been asked how the horse registration money is being used, we are told the money is funding other projects.

Kerry Spratt— AERA, Secretary, Public Officer

Letter from Lachlan ERC was tabled, advising that they are not going to present the Introductory Award at their ride. They will present their own award, reasons were given and their criteria advised.

Email from Tangil Kinch —seeking to affiliate a Hendra vaccinated only ride in the NRZ. General discussion on the instructions received from the AGM. This particular ride is affiliated with QERA and is not a NSW ride. Resolved: Kerry to advise that NSW ERA will dual affiliate 16 and 17 June as it is a QERA ride.

Letter from a member about the conduct of another member at the 2016 Burruga ride was tabled. Resolved to write to the member involved stating that NSW ERA has received a complaint about his behaviour at the Burruga ride and comments allegedly made in the vet ring.

Email from another member concerning various issues with suggestions for improvements. Concerns in part, transparency of the Best Conditioned Award. **Resolved** to write to this member thanking him for his email. The member wants BC calculations available at the ride base as he feels that the results are deliberately manipulated at some rides. Kerry will ask Steve Swan for help with the BC link on Aeraspace. ROs would need to have a printer to put the BC awards up at the ride base, many don't. Suggest that the Quilty teams matter be taken up with the AERA. Also mentioned the State of Origin team's event with suggestions for improvement which were discussed.

Distance and points awards were also mentioned in that he feels this is calculated in an unfair manner. Some States run 81k rides, for example. Also discussing risks for reward and overall horse welfare. He would like to see more emphasis placed on rewards for achievement during the year.

Talea to put the National point score awards up on social media during the year. Kerry will respond as discussed.

**Talea Hasko-Stewart: AERA,**

No report. The new riders' information package is completed – reached over 2000 people via Facebook, right now.

**Jo Davis: Zone 1 Delegate**

Zone One is suffering financially. Postponed this weekend ride as the grounds would be too wet. Jo said she found it difficult to get vets for the ride. Has booked Q60 vets. Zone One will look at running the training weekend later in the year. Currently Twenty members in the Zone. Various options were discussed regarding the ride expenses for Zone One rides.

**Noni Seagrim: Zone 4 Delegate**

There is a good ride calendar coming up. Good promotional and fund raising ideas are coming along.

**Belinda Hopley, Zone 5 delegate**

*Tumut Trainer 18-19/2/17. 10k, 20k & 40k both days. Tumut trialled a new ride base and tracks in preparation for endurance format next year. Although a flat paddock, it was quite uneven and the trot out area was the best that could be found. Over 114 riders participated in the events. Although Saturday was cooler than the previous days, it was still quite warm on track, with the first riders in the 40k not arriving until well after minimum time. Sunday events started quite early taking advantage of the very cool night. The property owner had recently graded the tracks, lessening the hardness. The track was well marked, with water well placed. A lap around a small paddock before going up a short sharp hill was placed to prevent tie up. It was a well organised event that was well received by the riders. They were enthusiastic about a longer distance next year. The rider incidents were a rider's horse banging her nose and a rider coming off a horse that was being difficult. Other incidents- the Head Vet spoke to the responsible person about their horse's behaviour after it was noted to have missed kicking the line vet. The generator that was owned by the caterer's was moved and turned off which caused problems with the supply of food and drinks the next day. The Intermediate Award was very well received. Sussex Inlet, 4-5/3/17. 10k, 40k & 80k.*

*Despite terrible weather being predicted, the RO's decided to go ahead with the ride. Saturday had rain until mid-afternoon, and with a huge bog in the 20k, the ride was delayed while Bruce found a new shortened (10k) track and marked it. As the 80k & 40k legs had similar issues (making any rescue attempt extremely difficult), it was decided to find a 40k leg and use that for the rides, i.e. both legs of the 80k. The Sunday rides were started later to allow for better light in view of the conditions. Unfortunately, a rider was kicked approx. 5k into the ride. It did take a little time before the rescue car could get there as it was coming back against*

the horses. An ambulance was called and the rider taken to hospital. Fortunately, she only required stitches to her leg. This incident led to the delay of the 40k ride. The rest of the rides were uneventful. Riders were very appreciative of the decision to go ahead and of the efforts to provide a good track. Although it was mainly dry, there was a good breeze which held the humidity down. Novice riders were very wary of the wet conditions. The Intermediate Award was well received. The RO's also commented that many of the markers (used on the legs that were not used) are not only pulled down, but actually taken away, causing a lot of extra work and worry.

CS/TPR: A TPR school was held in conjunction with Sussex Inlet, and we now have 7 new provisional TPR's. Many thanks to Vetea Facchini for organising and Shelly and Peter for hosting.

Belinda mentioned a problem at Sussex Inlet with course marking being removed. If a solution can't be found, this ride may not run again. Belinda will discuss this with the ride committee with suggestions. Sussex Inlet has a really amazing committee. They did a great job and deserve congratulations on a well-run ride.

TPRs have no contact details in the newsletter. Belinda to put a notice into the newsletter asking for contact details for TPRs so that a RO can contact them.

Belinda – asked about natural water on a ride – do we feel that is sufficient. Some said no, should be considered a bonus.

#### **Adeline Gibson – Publicity and Promotions**

*Well the year has started with a bang with the great news that thanks to hard work from other committee members we have the Maxxis sponsorship deal and we have also secured a Government grant to help us promote and bring new riders into the sport!*

*The new riders' booklet has also been published. After being online for less than 2 days it has*

*reached 1,840 people, and 179 people have opened the document. I hope this will greatly assist new riders in understanding what they need to do for their first ride.*

*The Intermediate Rug has been positively received at Tumut and Sussex (it got a round of applause at the Sussex pre ride and the riders seemed very excited about it), and is now proving to be popular with almost all RO's agreeing to host the trail award. Of course we welcome all feedback on how this plays out in the endurance community.*

*A riders' survey can be run again to help us define our key publicity and promotion goals for 2017. We also have the magazine profile organised last year to do, I will arrange this in April when the season is in full swing.*

*Facebook page is going brilliantly! We have had several people message us through this page asking for advice and info. Being able to publish official news and have a searchable, public page for people interested in endurance gives us a more professional look.*

*With the permission of the SMC, I hope to run our first advertisement to distribute the new riders' booklet.*

*Merchandise—Having recently taken this on, not much to say. We have a LOT (7 boxes) of TQ15 items. We need to decide what to do with these items; they lose more value the longer they sit here.*

## NSW ERA Ride Booking Procedures

1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (**SMC**) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride Committees must be incorporated with the Department of Fair Trading and a copy of the Certificate of Incorporation forwarded with Booking Form.
3. Entry fees for all sections of the ride must be shown on the Booking Form and advertised in the Newsletter when inserted in the Ride Calendar.
4. Rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides must have permission from the NSW ERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE.
5. Existing rides that have run on the same date for consecutive years will have preference for that date over new rides to protect the survival of the existing rides.
6. If a new ride is allocated a date other than as requested, that Ride Committee must change their date in accordance with the Committees decision.
7. A \$10.00 Booking Fee is payable when lodging the Ride Booking Form.
8. A \$50.00 Bond is payable if this is not already held on behalf of the ride Committee. This bond may be used for the next ride by that Committee if all paperwork is in on time.
9. The Ride Booking Form will indicate the Ride Committee's request for their ride to be dual-affiliated with another State.
10. A letter will be forwarded to Ride Committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet and Accredited Chief Steward.

# Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b) ) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.
