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
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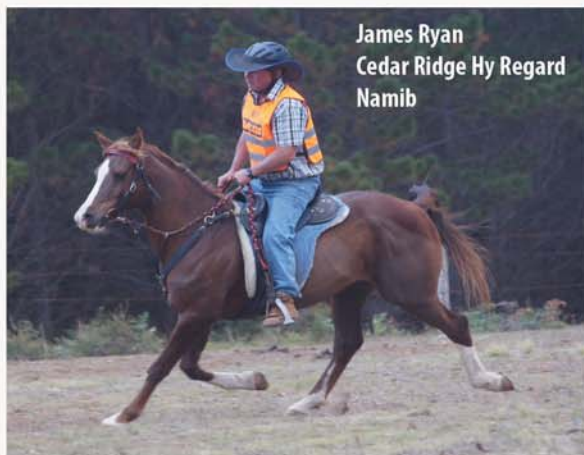

Sand Colic During Drought Conditions

With many areas of the Eastern states declared in drought, there has been an increase in horses that are reported suffering from symptoms of sand colic. Many horses and ponies fossicking for food in bare paddocks often start to paw and dig in search of plant roots or the remaining grass stems to eat. They have a high risk of ingesting soil, especially on sandy areas as they search for the roots.

Horses will also ingest sand and dirt as they forage around on limited pasture or sandy soil, as well as when they are fed their hay on the ground. Fine beach-like sand compacts more readily as compared to coarse river type loamy sand. The ingested sand tends to settle out in the lower segments and corners of the bowels of the hind gut as the digesting feed mass slowly moves through at around 2 cm per minute. Often, over time, a large amount of heavy sand deposits build-up, mixed with digestive particles, leading to partial blockage of the hind gut in the narrow lower flexures. The accumulated sand mass can damage the digestive lining as its weight can devitalise the hind gut wall, causing it to rupture into the abdominal cavity which can result in acute peritonitis. Often, the restriction within the hind gut can also increase the risk of impaction colic after consuming hay and other dry feeds.

Studies have shown that heavy burdens of Small Redworm resting stages within nodules in the lining of the hind gut can result in thickening of the lining and loss of normal contraction movements to propel the food mass through the hind gut, increasing the risk that reduced motility will facilitate sand build-up and result in colic.

An easy and simple way to approximately measure your horse's sand throughput is to take a few pieces of fresh manure and place them into a bucket of clean, fresh water. Break the manure up as much as possible by mixing it with a stick and then let the mixture settle overnight. Any sand that is present will settle out into the bottom of the bucket. Tip out the contents of the bucket slowly to reveal the sand remaining at the bottom. This will provide an indication of how much sand is present in your horse's manure, thus the amount of sand your horse is ingesting. In most cases, a layer of sand more than 2 – 3 mm thick is an indication that a significant amount of sand is being ingested.

If you are concerned about how much sand that has accumulated, your vet can X-ray or ultrasound scan the lower flexures of the hind gut to detect the degree of sand impaction, especially if your horse has a recent history of repeated low grade episodes of colic.

Sand removal is best achieved by feeding 70 – 100 g of dry psyllium husks per 100 kg body weight, mixed with coarse roughage, such as long chop wheaten chaff (or sunflower hulls) at 2 litres per 100 kg body weight to help carry the psyllium husks through to the hind gut and gently shift the sand mass and psyllium mucus into the passed manure. Many horses do not enjoy this meal and we advise not to mix the psyllium with water as it becomes gluggy and even more unpalatable. We have had excellent results in improving acceptance with a good 'slurp' of Kohnke's Own Energy Gold oil, which has a garlic flavouring that horses love!

The psyllium husk meal is fed on two consecutive days for best results and can be repeated monthly if necessary where horses have a high risk of ingesting sand. It is unwise to feed small amounts of psyllium husk on a daily or even weekly basis as the hind gut microbiota can adapt to digest the psyllium fibre and reduce the efficiency of the sand removal.

When the season breaks with heavy rain, or even flooding, there is an increased risk of sand ingestion as sand is splashed up onto any residual grassy stems or covers grass shoots and is ingested by hungry horses, often with a risk of sand colic about 3 weeks after the rain or flooding.

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NSW STATE CHAMPIONSHIP 2018

Tooraweenah Ride Review



The NSW State Championships was a huge success with the support from riders travelling out to the west to compete in the 160km and 80km events.

A total of 36 riders set off at midnight in very icy conditions to tackle the tough and challenging 100 mile track throughout the Warrumbungle mountains.

Equal first across the line in a ride time of 12hrs 18mins was Courtney Anderson riding Cedar Ridge Carbine and Andrew Bailey riding Twynham El Zephyr. Both horse looked amazingly fresh when they crossed the finish line in front of a crowd of cheering supporters. Amazingly Andrew Bailey had returned 27 years later to win on the same course as he had won the 1991 Tom Quilty event. What an amazing competitor he has been.

Not far behind was April Newman in 2nd Middleweight riding Taeaura Shayarnah in a ride time of 12 hrs 45mins. Elizabeth Moir finished in 12hrs 53 mins riding Prince Emani Spa to gain 1st Lwt. Junior rider Modena Schofield-Foster did an amazing job into 1st Junior riding Sharabel Kalarney in 13hrs 30mins.

Best conditioned horses were awarded to all four of the first place riders in each division. The workouts on the following morning was spectacular to see with horses putting on an amazing display of athleticism, agility and character with Courtney Anderson's horse forgetting he had even been out of his yard in the previous 24hrs and Andrew Bailey's mount giving an amazing dressage routine. Those not familiar to the sport were truly amazed at the ability of the Arabian endurance horse and how well they were presented and managed.

The 80km event was won by Jenny Berg riding Cedar Ridge Dee Why and Shirley Clark riding Oso Zoltan in 5hrs 24 mins. 1st Heavyweight was Peter Birkett and equal 1st junior was Telyn and Sanjay Nix.

The Tooraweenah Club would like to thank all of the generous sponsors who made this event possible and the volunteers and landowners who support our club every year. Thanks to NSWERA, Tom and Lou McCormack and Kim Stephens for



all the work and help throughout the event.

Agistment for non Tassie horses

Are you looking for a stopover point to rest your horse/s on the way to the TQ18?

We have decided to show some initiative and have put a request out through social media and local papers asking all farmers and small property owners with suitable paddocks available, to register their interest with a Tasmanian contact, Sonia Hodgetts. Sonia will pass on names and contact details of property owners to mainland riders on request so you can contact the property owners directly to discuss requirements and negotiate terms of agistment for your horse. Please note the negotiations are your responsibility and we would encourage you to ensure the paddock/s offered are safe and meet your requirements (perhaps a photo of the paddock/s might assist in this). Sonia is available on Facebook or by emailing Soniah@utas.edu.au.

Mainland competitors travelling on the Spirit of Tasmania ferry will dock at Devonport. Prior to heading to the Scottsdale ride base; they are invited to have a stopover at Pat and Dicky Lamprey's property, which is located at Sassafras, 20 minutes from the ferry terminal. Facilities there are basic but do include a permanent toilet and shower, green pasture and extensive training tracks. The ride base is 170kms from there via Launceston and on through Lilydale. The ride base is located at the Santarena Park complex, which gives direct access to the fabulous Quilty tracks.

Biosecurity

The biosecurity arrangements will apply for TQ18.

In summary and in part:

If travelling from a non-Hendra risk area you are required to complete a 10 day Temp Log and Horse Health Declaration.

If travelling from a Hendra risk area and your horse is HEV vaccinated you need to supply a current vaccination certificate and complete the 10 day Temp Log and Horse Health declaration.

If travelling from a Hendra high risk area and your horse is not HEV vaccinated your horse needs to be out of the Hendra high risk area for a minimum of 28 days. In addition you are required to contact Dr Pat Hodgetts (pat.hodgetts@gmail.com) before 1 September 2018 and complete:

- a quarantine and location declaration and
- the 28 day quarantine Temp Log and Horse Health declaration commencing the day the horse arrives at the quarantine location outside of the Hendra risk zone

Wandandian Ride Review

Following a break last year due to issues with flooding, 2018 saw the Wandy Ride back on the calendar and, well, we certainly didn't have to worry about too much water this time! Previous dry conditions had made the area even tougher than usual only alleviated somewhat by downpours in the previous fortnight, slightly softening the tracks up and putting a little water in the creeks.

Thanks to the generous support of local landowners, Forestry NSW and NPWS we had a lovely new ride base and a great course which was traversed by 138 riders over the duration of the weekend.

The 5, 10 and 20km rides were held on the Saturday over tracks consisting of wide fire trails and shaded bridle tracks varying from gently undulating to steeper gullies. Fifty two riders, including two racehorses kitted out in their racing gear, turned up to tackle the shorter distances and an amazing 95% successfully completed – including the racehorses. Six of these lucky training riders, selected for their horses having the lowest heart rates, were given gift vouchers courtesy of the Mobile GG Spot. Well done to all these riders and let's hope a few of them have been bitten by the endurance bug.

Sunday began with 53 riders heading out, very sedately, at 5am for the 90km, followed at 7.30am by 33 riders in the 40km. Despite the challenging terrain the day remained fairly incident free, apart from one horse who decided to try some base jumping on one of the steeper sections. Fortunately there were no major injuries and once again completion rates were above 95%. This is a huge credit to the riders as this course is quite demanding in places and definitely required excellent horse management skills.

Huge congratulations to April Newman riding John Dawson's horse, Taeaura Shayarnah, who crossed the line first in 5.50hrs and also took out 1st MWT and BC. April was followed closely by Ian Curtis, 2nd MWT on Blake's Heaven Summer Wind and Fia Hasko-Stewart on Blake's Heaven Venus, 1st LWT and BC. Not far behind this pair was 1st HWT Con Bouzianis and Conderosa Agamemnon, this combination was also awarded BC as was 1st JNR rider, Alison Noble on Spelldancer.

Fia and Ian, and their Blake's Heaven horses, were also jointly awarded the very special Peter Norman Memorial Award. This award celebrates the first riders across the line who train, compete and ride their own horses - things that Normie always considered a true part of the spirit of endurance riding. Tony Warren, Belinda Hopley the minutes of the SMC meeting of 13 April 2018 be accepted.

Carried

Unanimous.

Neil Clarkson – Mudgee ride

Neil said that a rider who had a novice membership card but had completed three 80km rides (could be an endurance rider) was disqualified for riding under novice time. The rider thought she was automatically upgraded to endurance status. Neil thinks this is very unfair, considering we don't need to produce membership cards any more, why should these riders be disqualified? There should be a better way. Answer was that the rule book says that she had to be disqualified and the CSs had no choice but to enforce the rule book. It was agreed AERAspace should advise the secretariat of any changes in rider status.

How do members know that they need to be officially upgraded to endurance status? There is also the question of intermediate riders upgrading.

Neil noted that the newsletter has been late on the website for the last three issues. Tony feels that a problem arises if the written newsletter is mailed and the web version is posted at the same time and that the internet version should go up a week or so after the print copy is out. Kerry said we made a decision a long time ago that members who access the newsletter on the web pay a lesser membership fee. John thinks we should charge for internet viewing to help finance the newsletter.

Kerry suggested the following motion:

That rule 29.4 be rescinded and that AERAspace be reconfigured so that the Registrars are notified automatically when a rider reaches Endurance Status to enable riders to be upgraded.

Agreed to print a reminder on the back of the membership cards about upgrading. Jacky to sort out the wording.

Due to the over whelming correspondence we receive on various issues, we need members to read the rule book. Notices to go onto Facebook and the website asking members to do this.

Neil Clarkson – General Chief Stewards [CSs] AERA requirements.

Discussion about recent requests made of Chief Stewards. Neil is asking about the information sent to CSs by Belinda recently. Neil noted it is physically impossible for a CS to check a course on a Saturday before the start of the ride. CS are

unpaid volunteers and increasingly rides are held on Saturdays, which necessitates CSs taking Fridays off to allow time to check courses. Neil said he doesn't check entire courses and does not know of any CSs who do check the entire course prior to a ride. Neil is not prepared to sign off on a course being checked if he hasn't checked it. Agreed State rides and TQ rides need to be checked off. Neil said we all know there are rides out there with bad marking, but at rides which run continually the standard of marking is known, and there is possibly no need to check the entire course at established rides. How can CSs be asked to sign off on a course when it has not been checked? They can't. Tony agrees.

This issue was discussed at the April meeting when the requirements were put in place, Kerry read the relevant section. Belinda has also sent information previously. Belinda said that CSs used to check courses but this was changed to advising that part of the course was to be checked. Additionally, Neil said that he leaves when the ride is finished. Belinda says there is a rule that CSs remain until after presentation and she feels that CSs have to obey the rules if we expect riders to obey the rules. Tony read the current rule. General agreement that the current rule on CS attending rides needs to be changed.

We cannot comply with the climatic requirement of the CS report either, for example at Mudgee they had rain on part of the course and none on other parts.

Question: Does the CS need to sign off? Are we going to minute that CSs do not have to sign off on the course? Belinda gave her version of an email that had been previously sent and said there was nothing in the minutes about this. Yes, we want CSs to sign off but how can they do this if they don't see the entire course? There must be some trust/belief in the course designer's ability.

Neil left the meeting at 6:57 as did Jacky Barlow.

Charlie Gauci and Faith Robinson. Zone One report and Vet fees at rides.

Faith gave a report for Zone One, plans coming along well for Q60, rides on both days. As there is a 40k ride each day, Zone One requests two intermediate prize rugs. Agreed. There are new members of NSWERA who reside in the Sydney area. The Zone would like to be issued with these email addresses, but if this is considered a breach of privacy, the Zone would like NSWERA to send a welcome email etc. Kerry thinks it's ok to supply email addresses for uses strictly related to endurance, but doesn't think this job should fall to Jacky Barlow. Faith will email Kerry. What is the rule on Vets who want to renegotiate their fees? What do other Zones do with regard to increased charges and accommodation and meal requests? Recommended vet fees are on the Internet.

Resolved: Peter to write to all ride organisers (RO) advising of the AERA suggested vet fees.

The Zone suggests that in respect to the Mt

Lagoon ride, the CS report should be shared with ride organisers. Belinda shares this information with her ROs, Charlie asked if this was a general rule or just occasionally, believing that CS reports are not always shared. Charlie believes the passing of information between the NSW SMC and ROs is not working, and no one tells the ROs about any discussions that may have taken place at committee meetings. Charlie feels CS reports should be shared with ride organisers. Belinda believes that people should be more descriptive in their CS reports. Agreed that CS reports will be provided to the relevant ride committee.

Ride Matrix – Charlie Gauci

Charlie referred to the NSW AGM and the ride matrix discussion. He believes the discussion was shut down and he was told to take it to the ROs forum, where it was shut down again. Charlie said that if there are changes to be made to how rides are allocated dates, it needs to go back to the AGM because it was previously agreed to at an AGM. Why did the matrix and the current rules come about? Charlie believes that a few years back, people who were sitting around the NSW SMC table got to decide whether you got a ride date, depending on who you knew or who you were friends with at the time. Kerry disputed this. The basis of the ride matrix has been around for many years.

The ride matrix was put in place so that an individual did not control the granting of a ride date. Jo Davis spoke on the reason for not using the matrix but Charlie said that a rule needs to be put in place explaining the allocation of rides. Jo has done an article for the newsletter and the webpage. John said someone has to have ownership of the portfolio. Charlie says that it's the process that needs to be changed, we need to change the set of rules which was the ride matrix. Tony understands why Charlie was going down that course. Charlie asked who was going to provide the minutes for that RO's forum meeting held previously as none had been forthcoming. Belinda has notes on the ride organisers forum but no one has done the minutes.

Charlie left the meeting at 7:56. Dinner break from 8:00 until 8:15.

Steve Roberts at 8.15pm: Gundagai, Wingello, IDP

The discussion about various issues at the Gundagai and Wingello rides were held in camera. Talea left the meeting at 9:03 while one matter was discussed. Talea returned to the meeting at 9:32 and spoke on this matter. Talea left the room again and further discussion occurred. Talea returned at 9:45. A letter from Steve Roberts about the IDP was also discussed with Steve present. Steve Roberts left the meeting at 9:26. Correspondence to be sent as agreed.

Business arising from last meeting (action log review)

The Business Arising list was gone through in some detail.

State Champs 2018 (Tooraweenah)

John covered this in his report for Zone Two. Email tabled and read by Kerry. **Resolved** that the State Ride Committee [SRC] need to be advised of the matters that need to be attended to. Belinda asked Matthew to advise why certain ratings are given in log books. Matthew says it is for the benefit of the other vets, not the riders, the scores are not like a show. They are for the next vet and are very subjective. Belinda asked Matt if he could write something on log book ratings for the newsletter.

Ratification of decisions made between meetings: Only one was to invite Steve Roberts to the meeting.

Maxxis Project (Emily Streckfuss chair, Kerry Spratt, Bec Hogan, Renee Kirk)

More filming done last weekend, now have approval from Maxxis on the footage and Bec is full steam ahead. Kerry to confirm cost to print the books.

AERA meetings

Next meeting is 29 July, Peter will be an apology. Plaques for 21 old Quilty buckles are being made, these can be mounted with horses' details, will sell for \$400. Must be successful Quilty completions!

Insurance. Riders were being asked for their medical conditions, perception by some people that this information would be available in the event of an accident, which doesn't happen. AON asked for this but the current insurer doesn't so this has been removed from the membership form.

NSW Office of Sport grant project: Belinda Hopley (chair), Jacque Wright, Adeline Gibson, Clare Feary

Belinda read her report. The remainder of the money could be spent on signs and vests.

New members incentives:

We have Adeline's report but need to hold this over to another meeting because of the late hour.

Tony Warren: President, Horse Welfare, Early Warning System

Wow, how fast is the year going? The rides are well underway & seem to have been very well attended so far, hopefully this continues for the rest of the season. This past weekend we had Wingello ride attended by around about 300 horses & riders, the usual vetting lines did not occur due to the few changes Bec & her entourage of helpers put in place. Congratulations to all the Vets, Chief Stewards, TPR's and volunteers on a job well done.

Our NSW State Champs are just around the corner, I hope everyone is getting their horses ready, hopefully it will be a successful weekend for all who attend.

On a committee front we are inundated again with

issues which put us on a back foot, we are continually putting out fires rather than being proactive & trying to build the sport. One day we will get the chance to concentrate on where we wish the sort to go, maybe one day!

Horse Welfare and Early Warning: Sorry have had time to do a hand over to Matt as yet, so I will do a quick report for him.

Rider Early Warning: Quite a few riders on this list which have been there for a while slowly receiving anniversary points to drop the points level, only one rider sitting at the 30 point mark. No letters written this month.

My Q60 ride by Faith Robinson

Q60's started for me in 2008 when I inadvertently joined the Zone One Committee. It was a great learning curve, having joined with the goal of doing 40km rides, but volunteering alongside people such as Sue Todd, Marita Rifai, Charlie Gauci, Jacky Barlow, Helen Rich and Claudia Reid, I was inspired (even directed) to increase my distances to 80km rides!

I had no idea what the Tom Quilty was or that it started in the Hawkesbury Valley, or that it was now a national event that circulates the states of Australia. I just liked riding.

As I understood it, the Q60 was a spinoff of the Quilty, being a 60 Miler (100km for the youngsters) instead of the 100 mile (160km) Quilty, however, delving into AERAspace records, I see that the first Q60 was run on May 1, 1984 and the Quilty a month later, still in NSW.

When marking the track this year, we found some of the original markers from the Tom Quilty. Ron Males and others originally marked the track with paint tin lids, stencilled arrows and venetian blind slats, cut on an angle to form simple arrows.

Last year I got as far as the first 80 kms of the Q60, timing out due to a torrid second leg from which only two riders finished in time to elevate to 100km. That third huge hill on Leg 2 knocked our times (and my horse) around so this year I was determined to find an easier route.

It's a hard enough leg now that the rock hopper four-wheel drivers have transformed a simple fire trail along a ridge into a series of steep rocky descents and ascents requiring concentration, skill and trust, without that extra "hill" up to Blaxlands Ridge and down!

Locked gates and absentee owners, bogs, vines and wombat holes; weather, personal issues, a tangle of red tape and lack of time all got in the way of renovating this old track from the East Kurrajong Ride. Pray for rain, pray for dry – if it rained, the bogs would be virtually impassable, if it didn't rain (which it really hasn't) then we'd have little feed on the ground.

The locked gates belonged to a lovely man, John, who kindly fenced off his agisted horses so that there would not need to be two extra volunteers on his remote property's gates. The bogs and vines were cleared with the help of Wiki Winton and Jake Finnane, kayaking our tools to the beginning of the track on a frosty winter morning.

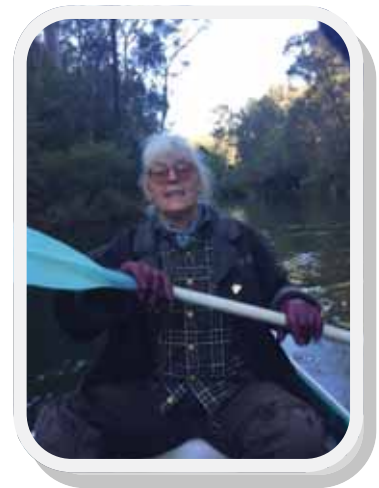
Geraldine Stuart helped mark the track with pink tape and Tony Parker helped the weekend before the ride, spending 8 hours in the saddle marking 30kms of track which is only accessible by horse or on foot. After all our attention to detail and careful marking, I was disappointed that one person missed a turn, however upon checking the marking, I was confident that it was clear which way to go. It pays to remember the rule – *if you're following arrows in one direction, don't look back*.

My little horse, Serena, (her first ride since Shahzada last year) did me proud once more, soldiering on to carry me through those last 20kms to give me my first 100km buckle - so proud (not to mention stiff and sore). Serena, like all my horses, spends her life barefoot and wears boots for competition and longer training sessions.

Ian Dreghorn managed the paper war, red tape tangles and also distributed the glow sticks down Wards Track by push bike... Gosh, I thought I knew Wards Track pretty well, but I can tell you, it is WAY harder in the dark.

Good on you, Ian for doing that. There are so many volunteers, all doing different jobs, willingly giving their time, I would never be able to name them all, so please accept a group "Thank you".

It was great to meet Paul Chandler and Steve Webb on the Friday before the ride, helping set up and I believe Paul may even be considering dusting off his saddle and throwing it on a horse again! There are always new friends to make and so many mentors willing to encourage and share. That's why I love endurance!

purchasing ribbons and trophies for the AGM presentation and of course the AGM costs. Insurances occur at the beginning of the year and there is a second half of the year top up.

Areas where we may have some discretion are in the area of how much drug testing do we do? What sort of sponsorship do we indulge in? What sort of expenses do we indulge in in the area of teams?

I note that we are going to pay to re accredit two swabbing stewards, this is excellent however we must have an undertaking from these people as to how available they will be to work in this role at rides. What will be their ongoing priority.

Newsletter: *The deadline for the July August Newsletter is 10th June. I request that all members of the SMC get all E.O.I's, Minutes, Articles to the editor by this date. We require professional conduct by our Editor but for this to happen we need contributors to assist by getting their material to the editor within a timely manner, not the last second. Portfolio holders who have lists in the Newsletter, Chief Stewards, T.P.R's, Vets must ensure these lists are up to date and current.*

Zone Two and State Championship:-

Tooraweenah held their annual 80 km ride on 21/22 April. The ride was a success, the vet gate into hold that will be used at the State ride was trialled. However, electronic timing was not used due to technical difficulties. The unit, I believe is currently in Tasmania, being repaired.

There are 6 Vets now booked for the State ride. Nadine Allen H.V assisted by Kym Hagon and 4 local vets. Jo Holt was to have been there but has had to withdraw. The Chief Steward team is now Peter Bonham, Jeff Bonham, assisted by Haydn Fisher and John Howe. Haydn and John will be part timers, but will assist as required with any peak times.

Matthew Walker has provided technical assistance and I believe that the compulsory represent will be held at the end of the second leg, rather than the third leg. This is an initiative of Matthew who feels that horses can be compromised by the end of the 2nd leg. Naturally, the Vets will be looking at all horses at all times during the ride and horses may be asked to represent at any time at the end of any leg.

Currently we are holding 21 State Championship buckles, when we have a better idea of numbers I'll have the engraving done. I'll also get a quote on obtaining more from the supplier.

The Tooraweenah committee is going to upgrade and hold working bees to make all facilities top class.

Anyone who can't ride, please come along and help make this our premier ride of the year.

Zone Two, the best in the west.

Belinda said we need a schedule of swabbing that is to be done. Matthew to organise this and advise the stewards. John said in days gone by, NSW

ERA has spent money on people to get the necessary accreditation and they have then refused to swab.

Kerry wants to see the rolling budget prepared. John said yes, he could do this but we must allow for unforeseen events. There is the \$3 to go to the AERA to be taken into account which is variable.

How tight do we want this budget to be? John said that we should have a look at the P&L from last year. It's all there. Kerry said that Bob Peirce came in and told us stuff but we haven't formally done a budget.

Kerry Spratt: Secretary, Public Officer , AERA, IDP, Grants

*Emails from two people raising concerns about issues at the Gundagai ride. **Resolved** to respond advising that we will take their comments up with the ride committee and the people concerned.*

*Email from a ride committee about fees paid to NSW ERA. **Resolved** to write as agreed, noting that the NSWERA committee needs to generate income to run the sport.*

*Letter about the age of horses and containment at rides. **Resolved** to respond advising that after discussion with our State vet, three years is too young and the rules for containment cannot be changed.*

*Emails about various issues from a member. **Resolved** to advise that: we will contact ROs asking that where possible they give completion buckles; we have already made some changes to the annual awards addressed this by replacing some of the awards; and riders are responsible for complying with FEI rules. .*

Dual Affiliation in general. Bom Bom ride committee wants dual affiliation of this ride to be reconsidered. Noted that AERASpace shows all NRZ rides as dual affiliated in compliance with an AERA directive, and we have no say in the matter. Jo to speak to Tangil Kinch.

Belinda Hopley: Zone 5 Delegate, Chief Stewards and TPRs

Mt Lagoon, 8/4/18. 40k, 20k & 5k.: *The ride organization, base and track were all good. An excellent ride attracting about 120 riders. The course was challenging but scenic, with the riders riding slowly to the conditions on the day. Due to events on course, the water truck was prevented from getting more water on course for the end of the 40k ride. 2 vets were required to deal with 2 horses (1 was kicked, walked in and vetted thru') and the other horse required further treatment. (Note 3 vets were named for the number of riders, with only 1 accredited vet.)*

Weather conditions at 10am were 27.4C, humidity 61%, wind speed 1.3kph, and at 1pm 36.1C and 43% humidity.

Tooraweenah, 21 & 22/4/18. Sat 7 & 20k, Sun 20k, 40k & 80k: *No reported problems, however, the vetting area will need to be moved back if*

doing VGIH to allow vets more room, and a few more markers on track.

Only 2 vets were noted for the ride, but 40 riders attended on Saturday and 90 on Sunday.

Gundagai, 29/4/18. 40k & 80k.: No problems were reported, but commented that all rides could be improved. 1 horse presented post ride (after a V/O) with severe metabolics and received a 6 week RO, 1 with a moderate lameness during the hold time on leg 2 and a 40k horse also vetted out with a moderate lameness.

Mudgee, 12 & 13/5/18. 80k, 40k, 20k & 10k.: The weather was fantastic during the event compared to the Friday before. According to all reports from the riders the course was great and very well marked. There was a great atmosphere throughout and the committee did a great job, with the pre ride talk being a highlight but unfortunately missing the presentations. There was a bit of confusion around vetting times as 2 times were advertised, and there could have been a bit more water around base. There were 4 incidents – 1 rider falling off after a shy. Another horse tripped and the rider fell off. Another rider was disqualified for being under novice time. The last incident was a horse kicking in the vet ring. The head vet was listening to gut sounds when it moved forward and kicked out with both back feet, connecting with the vet in his knee region. The vet was knocked to the ground. He was taken to Mudgee hospital and returned to continue vetting. The CS was concerned with this as he was in pain and limping badly. The CS would like the owner of the horse written to asking that the trainer or an experienced horse handler that knows the horse handle it in the vet ring. Notes that this could have been a more serious injury. Approximately 155 riders attended with 3 vets noted.

Neville report still outstanding.

South Coast Zone News-

Had a Zone meeting last night but have not heard how it went.

Grants Subcommittee-

Bago declined our offer, so to date we have spent \$19,300. I am waiting to hear back from Sue Todd at Shahzada what day for a TPR school. The costs for the vet school (approx \$2000) and EA MCP (costs?) course are to be finalised. Ideas to spend the remainder are on signage, vests. Any other ideas?

Riders Forum cancelled as it was hard to get presenters to commit. Had good interest so would like to see it run in conjunction with AGM next year.

Other Stuff-

Has AERA Form 20 (Volunteers Form) been passed as it just appeared on the website and is NSWERA using it?

Still trying to get info to the ROC's from the forum and on the website.

Tony is working towards a handover of the EWS portfolio to Matthew. Belinda said some rides did not have enough vets for the rider ratio and spoke about pre nominations. Discussion about Mt Lagoon and the vet ratio. John advised they had three horse problems at once. Matthew discussed a bio security meeting (AERA), where the paperwork amended without Matthew having any input. The other participants tried to mandate vaccination, end result nothing much has changed. The original document was a pretty clean document. Matthew now has access to AERAspace and has started looking at invasive treatments. Around 160 treatments, 45.6% of the treated horses were Hendra vaccinated horses but this requires more work to work out the exact data.

Charlie's 2018 Tevis Adventure



My Tevis story starts way back in 2011.

It was my intention to ride Tevis in 2011 on my own horse, a character named Cheys Cocamoe Joe. I had found Cocamoe in Missouri when I was searching for horses to do the Pony Express(XP) ride across the USA in 2011. It was my intention to

ride him in the 2011 Tevis at the end of the XP. The weather had other ideas and the trail was heavy with snow and that was the end of that dream.

I gave Cocamoe to a legendary rider named Dave Rabe at the end of the XP with the proviso that I get to ride him in Tevis "one day". Well that day came in August, 2017 but again the weather was against us and the ride had an alternate start that played havoc with Cocamoes sensibilities (aka hothead meltdown) and he vetted out at the first major vet check at Robinson Flat. Again the dream went unfulfilled.

This is where persistence pays off.

In early 2018 my wife asked me if I was thinking of having another crack at the Tevis and I, of course, said yes but my deal with Cocamoe's owner was fulfilled the previous year and I didn't really want to ride any other horse at Tevis. I decided to contact Dave with a deal in my head that he couldn't refuse, I thought, but he did. I wanted to lease the horse and pay Dave for the privilege of riding his horse again. Dave wouldn't have a bar of that and said Cocamoe was mine to ride with no strings attached. Ride him I did.

2018 turned out to be our year and we had the ride of our lives...We set out to the ride base at Robie Park for the start, hopeful and excited like everyone else and set up our rooftop tent on our camper much to the amusement of people who knew the area was a haven for bears. We were given a can of bear spray and wished good luck for the night.

The following day was the big day and we set off to ride 100 miles of the most beautiful and treacherous land I have ever ridden over. Canyons, mountains, thousands of feet in elevation changes all throughout the day and night, switchbacks too numerous to count, heat that would have knocked a goanna for a loop and zillions of rocks underfoot and last but not least heavy smoke in the air from nearby bushfires.

Many hours riding in the dark under a blood moon with no headlamp, as they were frowned upon by my fellow competitors. You really have to trust your horse and hang on while you cross a river, a suspension bridge and the odd hissing or rattling wildlife.

It takes a small village to get through a ride like this and I had one working for me for the entire ride and I couldn't have ridden it without them. I count them all as my friends and would be happy to repay anyone of them in any way I

can.

I finished the ride with about 14 minutes to spare giving my team a very nervous wait and fingers crossed while I came over that final finish line - but there's more. That's not a pass! You then have to walk down to the Auburn Fairgrounds Arena and do a victory lap, and yes I cantered over the finish line with my hands in the air, no reins and the horse kept running - all before the final vetting.

Cocamoe's heart rate and soundness were in check pretty quickly and when that final vet check was a thumbs up my entire team whooped and hollered with the sheer relief of a gargantuan task completed successfully.

We were amongst the 42% of the field that completed and I thank them all and especially Dave Rabe and that fantastic horse Cheys Cocamoe Joe - look him up on the AERC website. He has completed nearly 6,000 miles since I started him in 2011 and he is an awesome horse with an awesome owner. Thank you Dave.

Tevis 2018 by Sally Fenner

Note: What follows is an extract from the story written by Sally Fenner. Sally's article makes very interesting reading but unfortunately it is way too long to put the entire story in the newsletter. My hands are clammy and stiff, frozen into a claw shape. My head is spinning, dizzy I feel as if I am about to faint. As the world is rotating, rushing around me I feel nauseous and I swallow with a loud forced gulp, my mouth is so dry!

My head and eyes are drawn to a place I do not wish to look at again – to my right, to the terrifying depths of the canyon floor, 1000s of feet below me.

"Damn girl, you did it again! Are you stupid? You looked down! DON'T LOOK DOWN!" All the physiological symptoms of vertigo hit me hard and all at once and I felt as if I was losing my balance and falling to the right and down to the depths below.

"Where was I? Why was I feeling this way?" I was at Pucker Point on the Western States Trail, in the Sierra Nevada, in California, in America competing in the Tevis Cup 100mile (160km), in one day, endurance horse race.

Pucker point was infamous. It was deemed by most the worst section of an already terrifyingly narrow trail that had no barrier between you and your horse and a horrendous vertical drop-off, 1000s of feet to the river and canyon bottom below.

My lead up to the Tevis cup had been a rather tumultuous affair, a roller-coaster ride of epic proportions, to say the least. A sort of a smorgasbord of disasters. I so very nearly did not make the start line!

I had experienced a rather calamitous endurance season in Australia. I had not been able to find a good horse since my very successful and special partnership with Cherox Aladdin ended when he retired. I had been through 5 horses who either turned out to be unsuitable for endurance or who kept vetting out from lameness on the longer distances. I finally brought back into work my endurance-qualified mare who had been off having a couple of foals. She was doing well until a suspensory ligament rupture, 'catastrophic' in nature, as described by the vet put her out for good. I was shattered. I was only a couple of months out from Tevis and I had not even managed to get one 80k ride in. I was NOT ride fit for Tevis. I pulled my young boy out of the paddock to at least do a couple of smaller rides on. The first ride back he stood on a branch that snapped and flicked up and hit him under his belly. He leapt like a cat up in the air and bucked in one motion. I had broken my coccyx for the fourth time since I had been back riding in the last 12 years! This trauma was on top of a broken back (L2) years before from a car accident. The pain was immense.

I pushed through the pain and borrowed a horse for the last 80km on the calendar. Success at last, not only a completion but second place and BC.

There was only a week to go to my flight and two weeks till the Tevis. Then, the day before my flight, I began frantically packing and my heart sank as I opened up my passport and realised it had expired on 4th July, just a couple of weeks before. Then I had an idea. I was a dual citizen, originally from the U.k., I had a British passport. Yes there could be problems getting back into Australia but I would deal with that if it arose.

After navigating my way through other problems with my USA visit, I eventually caught my flight to the USA and on landing in LA I was pulled aside, the ESTA had not electronically shown up for my British passport and I was asked so many questions that I missed my connecting flight. Angry and upset I messaged Claire and Troy Eckard the people who had agreed to do an exchange with me—where I ride one of their horses at Tevis, they ride one of my horses at the Quilty. Claire was so reassuring and told me everything would be fine and before I knew it I was relaxed in their company and enjoying a beer outside their RV with their

horses on Terry Howe's ranch. I had made it this far. I could not wipe the grin off my face.

Troy's horse was a stunning 15.2hh Arab, Rymoni and my ride was an equally stunning bay 15.3hh Arab, Flash Gordon. These were good looking horses, great conformation, strong backed and FIT. Troy had done a wonderful job getting these boys ready for Tevis. I felt like I had won the lottery.

I had a week to ride Flash and get to know him, he was a powerful boy and attacked mountains like a mountain goat! He was rangy, and forward moving with amazing depth of girth. He must have a huge heart and set of lungs. He was a lot of horse but I felt comfortable riding him.

We camped a few days at the finish line in the Fairgrounds in Auburn so we could familiarise ourselves with the end of the ride. The horses had completed Tevis last year and seemed to know the trail extremely well already. *"Trust your horse, they know where they are going,"* Troy told me over and over as I gasped at the drop offs down to the American River below.

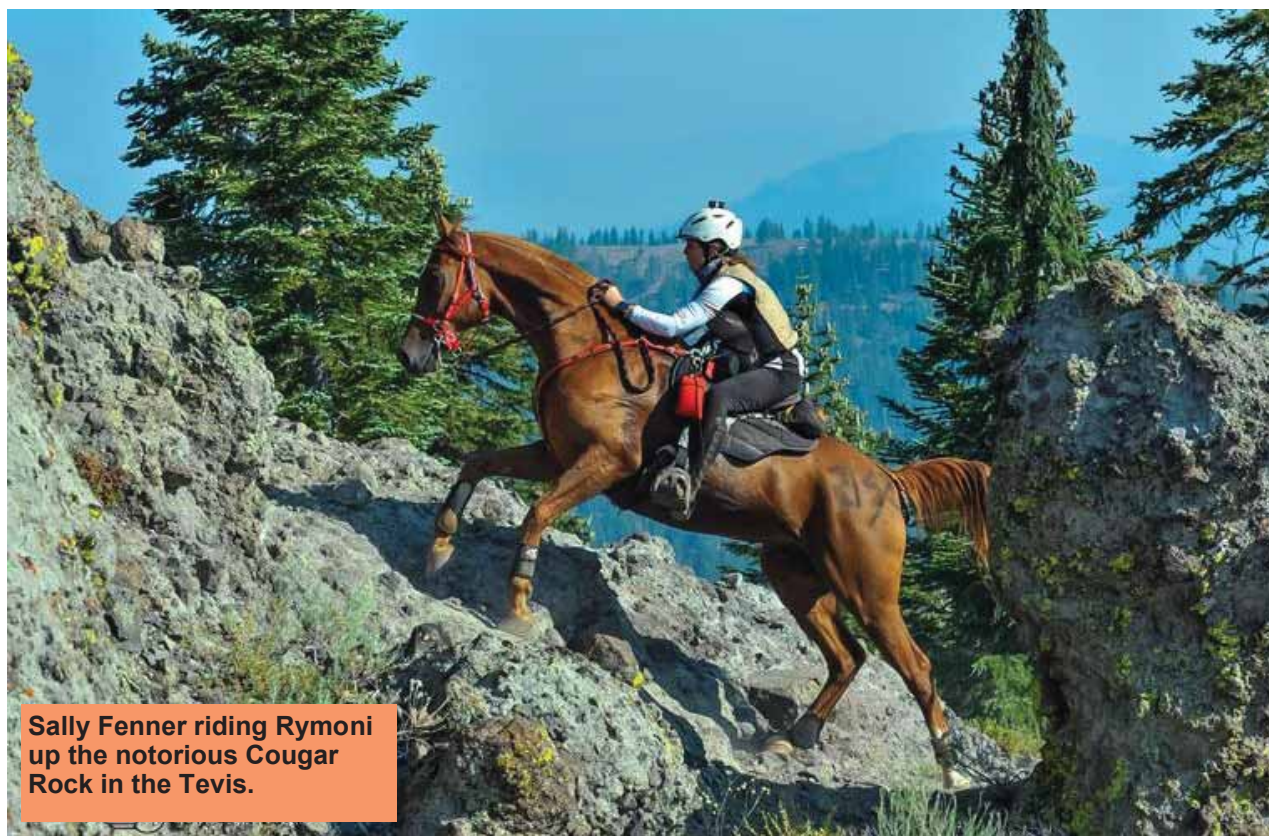
We made the beautiful drive up to Robbie Park passing through some scenery that was extremely dramatic.

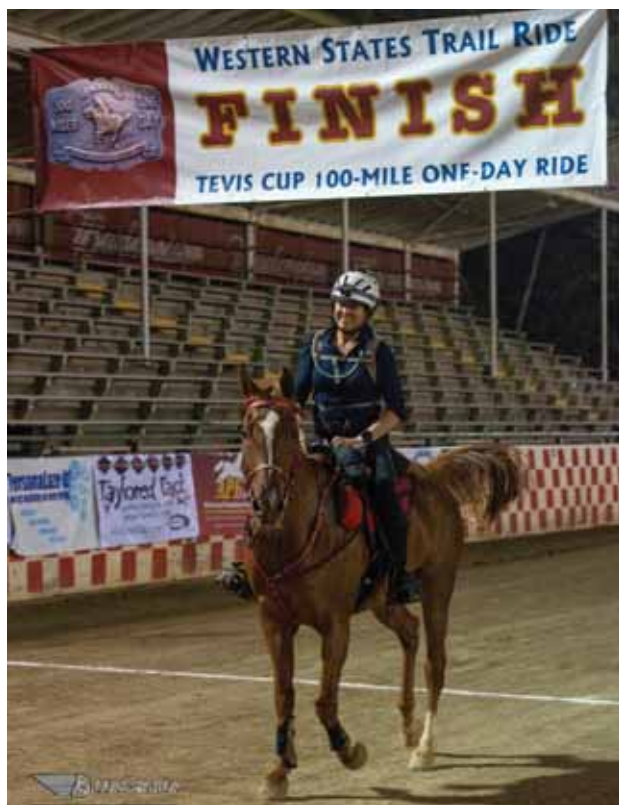
As we passed Squaw Valley and Lake Tahoe and then the official start of the Tevis Cup, it all finally began to seem very real. I was here. I was actually going to do this. It was at last a reality. It had been a dream for so long. I loved it when a lifetime plan comes to fruition.

One last ride to check out the first few miles of the Tevis trail and then pre-ride vet check. Flash and Rymoni passed with all A's. We were good to start. I could hardly contain my excitement.

Then it happened. All my dreams went flying out of the window. Troy and I were sitting in the shade watching all the beautiful Tevis horses trot out for their pre-ride vet check when he received a call from Lynn our camp neighbour. *"Flash is hurt, he got himself caught in the high tie system!"*

Flash was trotting out lame, mostly on his near fore. I was out. My Tevis dream gone, just like that. I went to the pre ride talk for riders new to Tevis. This was very insightful but I couldn't help feel devastated that I wouldn't be riding. I was just going to have to be crew for Troy. I would learn a great deal doing that. There was always another year.

At first, the words fell on deaf ears. "Sal," shouted Troy. "You are just going to have to ride my horse." Said Troy. "Take my horse, ride Rymoni!" "I've got my Tevis buckle, I live here, I can come back again, I can't let you come all the way from Australia and not ride, take my horse. No argument, you are riding Rymoni."

I knew Claire and Troy were special people but for Troy to offer me his very special Rymoni, his horse, his Tevis ride, this was true sportsmanship. What a gentleman. But, how could I? I was meant to be riding with Troy, not riding his horse. The reality of what this actually meant hit me. I would be on the trail on my own, no guide, no Troy to pace me, on a strange horse!

And so it was that at 4.30 am on Saturday 14th July 2018 I found myself sitting on a horse I had never ridden before, in the dark, in a strange saddle and about to attempt the hardest, toughest most frightening endurance race in the world, the Tevis Cup. I felt weak at the knees and had butterflies in my stomach. Rymoni was not happy about not having his buddy Flash by his side and fidgeted and neighed in protest.

Out on the trail it was not long before a girl behind me

said "Cougar Rock is coming up isn't it?" "You are asking the wrong person, I'm a Tevis virgin, from Australia, I have no idea," I laughed in response.

Then it dawned on me. Oh My God, Cougar Rock.

Troy had stated he would not ride Rymoni up Cougar Rock as he is a daisy cutter causing him to be quite the stumbler with a heavyweight on his back. I had asked if he was ok with me taking Flash up Cougar Rock and Troy said yup go for it. But now I was on Rymoni, what was the right thing to do? The next thing I knew I was following a mule up Cougar Rock!

At our first 1 hour hold at Robinsons flat Rymoni was quite stressed and he was only picking at his food. He missed his buddy. We couldn't finish 100 miles on an empty stomach. He had to eat. Troy eventually found some grass and Rymoni settled in to eat a good stomach full. We had taken an extra half an hour beyond our hour hold time. After eating as much as I could consume and popping a couple of salt tablets Rymoni and I set out again.

I rode two canyons on my own. Where had all the other riders gone? The field had spread out so far. The smoke from Yosemite fires was hanging around and choking me and my horse in the already humid and high temperature day and extremely dusty trail.

I made it out of the second canyon and wished I had had at least one other rider to accompany me as Rymoni was not as great a climber as Flash and this was where he suffered. Troy usually got off but the heat and humidity forced me to stay on, sorry Rymoni.

When I emerged at the next check point I felt quite emotional and said to a volunteer I don't think I can do another canyon on my own. She pointed to a guy riding in to the checkpoint at that very moment and said stick with him he knows these canyons like the back of his hand. I took her advice. I later found out this was the legend Rob Ribley who had ridden approximately 117 one hundred mile rides and completed 100 of them.

We rode together for several more checkpoints and into Michigan Bluff where I was very happy to see my crews' smiling faces. Troy ordered me back aboard Rymoni and said come on Rob is leaving, you have to stick with that guy, don't let him out of your sight. Everyone knew riding with Rob was the best thing I could do right now. We yo-yo'd our way to Forest Hill, the second hour hold.

"Only 36 miles to go!" "It's all down-hill from here!" "You're on the home stretch!"

As Rob and I walked out of Forest Hill and back on to the single track the light began to fade. We rode into the darkness before the full moon rose to give us some relief from the strain on our eyes. I was glad the darkness disguised the drop offs. I was exhausted from being nervous from seeing them.

Rymoni seemed to get stronger and flew along the trail leading a huge section in the dark and into our second to last check point.

We vetted in at Fransicos and I was impressed to see hot coffee on offer. They had surely thought of

everything. Now where were my doughnuts?

Rymoni floated along with such determination and energy he knew he was barn bound. This felt good and I let him move along and set the pace. Trust your horse, Troy's words whispered to me in the darkness.

As Rob and I approached the Quarry, the last vet check, Rob warned me that many a horse had vetted out there and to take it easy trotting along the rocky trail into the check point, only 6 miles from the finish. Rob stated he had been vetted out there in the past. He didn't want a repeat of that experience. Nor did I.

Back on board again Rymoni dropped down the trail to 'no hands bridge'. I felt myself inhale a gulp of elation. This is where Troy and I had ridden to when we were familiarising ourselves with the trail camping at Auburn. It seemed an eternity ago.

I practically walked that last 4 miles, jogging a little where the trail allowed, which wasn't much, it was a tough few miles.

I had seemingly been dicing with time cut offs half way through the ride. You cannot ride the Tevis cup too slow or you won't make the 100 miles in the 24 hours. I felt like I had covered good ground early in the morning when it was relatively cool, however, the extra half hour at Robinsons Flat put us back a little and I had taken a wrong turn early on at Squaw Valley ski resort. So, when check points people were telling me I only had an hour to get to the next vet check and I had a huge canyon in between me and the next check point, I was beginning to think I wouldn't make it.

Eventually I knew I had it in the bag. I didn't quite know how, but we had made great time in that last 36 miles and as I turned the last corner in the trail there it was. The Dunny! and I knew we were home.

Now, just for the last hurdle, the last vet check at the finish.

Troy, Claire and the crew were cheering me on and playing 'I come from the land down under!'

I didn't know if I should laugh or cry! We all walked that champion horse down to the oval. I could see relief in his eye and I matched that feeling of relief in my stomach.

We trotted our lap over the finish line, hands in the air for, our final Tevis photo.

We vetted in 'one of the best trot outs of the day' stated the head vet.

We did it. Hugs and cheers all round. I could not thank my crew enough. I was the first International rider and in the top 20, unbelievable! 'To complete is to win' – but this was the icing on the cake. My fairy tale had come true.

Forty three riders set off on the 400k event at 4AM on Monday morning with 26 being successful, that's a success rate of 60.47% a considerably higher rate than at past rides. With NSW being in drought it was a pleasant surprise to see that St Albans still had a little grass and as there was rain on the weekend before the ride, the tracks were a little softer than anticipated.

Friday afternoon was cold and wet so the 'peanut gallery' was a little depleted in its numbers but those who braved the weather gave great support to the riders as they came in and vetted through.

Unfortunately three people joined the Friday Club. Kerryn Agnes, Cody Holloway and Dean Walkom.

The fastest time went to Tammy Woodgate riding Castlebar Galaxy in a riding time of 41:21 with Kylie Jonkers riding Girilambone Comet achieving the second fastest time of 41:54. Comet was also the first stallion home, had the lowest average heart rate for the week and was part of the winning team.

NSW ENDURANCE RIDERS ASSOCIATION INC. RIDE BOOKING PROCEDURES



1. A ride must be booked a minimum of three months prior to the proposed date for the ride. This requirement may only be waived with the consent of the State Management Committee (SMC) under exceptional circumstances.
2. Ride booking forms will be considered in the order in which they are received (including FEI).
3. When forwarded to the Secretariat the ride booking form **must** contain;
 - (a) an alternative date,
 - (b) have appropriate contact details,
 - (c) be signed by a member of the ride organising committee,
 - (d) Indicate if there are to be any horse health requirements enforced on the ride (please see rules 14.1 and 16.5 AERA rules – amendments to AERA Rulebook applicable 01/01/2018).

Incorrectly filled forms will be sent back and may hold up approval.
4. There will only be one Endurance Event scheduled for each weekend.
5. The NSW SMC will have the right to approve or refuse a ride application in the overall best interests of the NSWERA membership. Alternate dates to be advised to Ride Committee.
6. Priority in allocating dates will be given to ride organisers with an established endurance ride event to maintain that event; alternate dates will be advised by the NSWERA SMC.
7. Rides must have approval from the NSWERA SMC before the ride is advertised ANYWHERE, this includes rides being conducted to replace cancelled rides.
8. Any changes to an already approved ride, e.g. distance changes, additional rides; must have an amended ride booking form submitted to the NSWERA SMC for re-approval and cannot be advertised until reapproved.
9. The ride booking form will indicate the ride committee's request for their ride to be dual affiliated with another State.
10. The ride organiser will receive confirmation of approval, or non-approval, by the ride calendar portfolio owner in writing as soon as practicable.
11. Correspondence will be forwarded to ride committees one month prior to their ride requesting confirmation of the ride's Head Vet, Treatment Vet and Accredited Chief Steward; as well as the ride entry fees.

Logbook & Identification Procedures

A horse is a novice for a minimum of 90 days from the date on which it successfully completes its first affiliated endurance ride and may only attempt four rides during this period, ie if a horse successfully completes its first ride on 1st July, it cannot upgrade to endurance status until after 28th September and may only enter four rides during this period. There is no limit on the time it takes to reach endurance status. Your horse can be a novice for as many months (or years) as you like.

When your horse has successfully completed 240 kms of affiliated endurance (not training) rides, it can be upgraded from novice (blue log book) to endurance (yellow log book) status.

Ensure the brands are clear. If not, have the horse re-branded or microchipped (Refer to rule H5.2(a) - (b)) and H5.3).

Have a vet complete the horse identification form (written description and diagrams) and sign it. Identification and microchipping can be done at most rides, but it is advisable to check with the ride secretary beforehand.

Complete the logbook application form and attach I.D. form, novice horse logbook and the appropriate fee.

Please allow 10 working days from date of posting for return.

It is essential to retain a copy of the I.D. form and perhaps have it laminated for the future.

PLEASE NOTE An Endurance Horse Logbook will not be issued unless a signed Veterinary Identification Form **is** enclosed with the application. The I.D. in the novice log book is NOT acceptable.
